### **Health Minister Has** Good News on Iran's **Coronavirus Vaccine**

TEHRAN - The Iranian minister of health said he has good news about a homegrown vaccine for the coronavirus disease, adding that Iran is catching up with advanced countries in vaccine production. In an address to a meeting at the Ministry of Health and

Medical Education on Tuesday, Saeed Namaki said he has good news about the coronavirus vaccine being made in Iran. "We don't want to make delusional comments and don't want to say that the vaccine would be available to

the public until autumn," the health minister said. "Today, we can only say that we are not lagging behind many in the world who claim to have produced the vaccine," Namaki added.

Describing the production of the vaccine as a result of teamwork, the health minister said Iranian experts should exchange their findings so that Iran would be among the first countries with tangible progress in making COVID-19 vaccine. Meanwhile he noted that without the exchange of international information, the world could not defeat COVID-19, stating that to fight this virus national contribution is required. See Page 7

### Iran Experiences New One-Day Record For COVID-19 Fatalities

TEHRAN - Iran has registered its highest COVID-19 death toll for a single day, with 235 new fatalities confirmed over the past 24 hours, a record-high since the beginning of the outbreak in the Islamic Republic.

The Health Ministry spokeswoman says the new fatalities increase the overall death toll to 16,147.

In her press briefing on Tuesday, Sima-Sadat Lari also confirmed 2,667 new cases of COVID-19 infection, increasing the total number of infections to 296,273.

According to the spokeswoman, 257,019 patients have so far recovered from COVID-19 or been discharged from the hospital, while 3,902 are still in critical conditions of the disease. She said so far 2,380,122 COVID-19 tests have been taken across the country.

Lari added that Tehran, Ilam, Ardabil, Isfahan, East Azarbaijan, Alborz, Golestan, Kerman, North Khorasan, Semnan, Hormozgan, Lorestan, Mazandaran, Fars, and Khorasan Razavi are considered as "red zones".

# **IRGC Shows Muscles by Holding Massive Drills Off Hormuz Strait**

TEHRAN - Iran's Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC) is conducting large-scale aerial and naval drills off the strategic Strait of Hormuz and in the Persian Gulf, with the country's first domestic multi-purpose satellite

According to the IRGC's Sepah News, the final phase of the exercises, codenamed Payambar-e A'zam (The Great Prophet) 14, kicked off on Tuesday across land, air and sea in the general area of Hormozgan Province, west of the Hormuz Strait and in the Persian Gulf.

Several units from IRGC's Navy and Aerospace Division are taking part in the maneuvers, which feature missiles, vessels, drones, and radars, and are designed to practice both offensive and defensive missions.

The IRGC forces are slated to conduct missile, drone and mine-planting operations against mock enemy targets during the drills. They are also scheduled to practice tactics to cut off the connection lines of enemy vessels. Meanwhile, combat helicopters will target enemy positions with coast-to-sea missiles.

Brigadier General Abbas Nilforoushan, the maneuvers' spokesman, said during the exercises, "the interception of ballistic and cruise missiles has been drilled, while surprising weapons and hardware — including long-range ballistic missiles capable of striking intruding vessels floating at a distance — are being used."

For the first time, the drills are being monitored by Iran's Nour-1 (Light-1) Satellite, which was put into orbit on April 22. Nour-1 is the country's first multi-purpose satellite with application in the defense industry, among other areas. The launch operation was carried out by the IRGC's Aerospace Division, which said the country's aerospace program was expected to gather pace following the launch.

Meanwhile Commander of the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) Major General Hossein Salami said the force improves its weaponry considering the strengths and weaknesses of the enemies.

He made the remarks on the sidelines of an IRGC military exercise, titled as the Great Prophet-14 military drill, in Strait of Hormuz.

'Our policies for safeguarding the interests of the Iranian nation is defensive meaning that we will not attack any country," he said noting that however, the forces are offensive in their operations and tactics.

"Our defense doctrine relies on the manufacturing indigenous equipment. In each military exercise, the quality of the equipment is upgraded and the new equipment is tested and used in the real battlefield," he said. The IRGC commander noted that the drill has been started to ensure the body's capability in protecting the

benefits of the Iranian nation. He added that the enemies' naval flotilla will be invaded if they pose a threat against Iran.

As reported, 'surprising weapons' such long-range ballistic missiles have been launched during the named military drill in the south of Iran, which is jointly being carried out by IRGC Navy and Aerospace.

The military exercise is based upon plans for fighting hybrid warfare and network-oriented combats proportional to the IRGC's offense doctrine.

IRGC Navy's missile, vessel, and drones units and IRGC Aerospace's missile, drone, were radar units conducted operations.

Waging attacks against virtual enemy using missiles, ships, and drones, laying defensive mines, cutting the communication between virtual enemy's ships, launching rockets from helicopters, and launching coast-to-sea missiles were among agenda of this stage of the drill.

### Petrochemical Industries Playing Key Role in Non-Oil Exports

TEHRAN (MNA)- President Hassan Rouhani said that petrochemical and steel industries are playing a key role in the field of production and non-oil export in the country.

Producers and activists of petrochemical and steel industries at the forefront of the country's important economic and export front. Petrochemical and steel sectors have passed crude sales.

Speaking on Monday evening in a meeting with producers and activists of the country's petrochemical and steel industries, Rouhani emphasized that self-reliance on valuable products of the petrochemical and steel sectors is an important achievement for the country, and said, "we have invested \$14 billion for the advancement the second step of development in the petrochemical sector."

Appreciating the efforts of all activists in the two sectors of steel and petrochemicals, Rouhani said that these two sectors have returned their currency on time, and if the government is proud to stand against US sanctions and foreign pressure, this resistance is in the shadow of help and efforts of all producers, investors and entrepreneurs, especially in the steel and petrochemical chains, who have been made it possible.

Last Sunday and almost 10 days ago, Syria held the parliamentary election and Syrian people with their buoyant turnout in the election voted for their favorite candidates to form the parliament.

The U.S. Department of State on July 20 in a statement took its stand against the election in Syria and expressed its dissatisfaction. Spokesman to the U.S. Department of State Morgan Ortagus in the statement said, "Syrian government is seeking to present this election as another success." This statement does not recognize the Syrian election as a voting and claims the election was Bashar Assad's choice and predetermined. The spokesman by accusing the election says, "Syria has seen no free and fair elections since Assad's Ba'ath party came to power, and this year was no exception." She also referred to the UN Security Council Resolution 2254 which assigns Syria to hold the election under the supervision of the United Nations and with presence of its pro-West spies.

But reacting to the U.S. stand on Syrian election, the Islamic Republic of Iran termed the election a positive step on course to strengthening stability in Syria. Spokesman of Iran Foreign Ministry Seyed Abbas Mousavi in his statement expressed Iran's satisfaction on the successful parliamentarian election in Syria and said," Syria's election was held in a situation in which the Syrian nation are facing conflicts and destructions by terrorist groups and the illegal presence of foreign occupying forces, as well as the cruel [US] sanctions on the country." He add, "So the Islamic Republic of Iran hopes the successful parliamentary elections will be a positive step on the path of reaching peace, stability and development in Syria in line with the efforts to alleviate the challenges of the country's people.'

In a related development, Syrian President in meeting with his former rival in presidential election Hassan al-Nouri said that successful holding of the election and massive turnout of the people in the poll stations showed the power and capability of the Syrian people and showed that people are committed to their free decisions. Regarding this democratic act in Syria, the Syrian President emphasized that this successes has been achieved while Syria is in a tough and exceptional condition and some of foreign countries are trying to dictate their own wills on Syrian people. Meanwhile Al-Nouri, for his part, said that the previous elections were held fair and clear and it was an important step on course to strengthening the democracy and the current election was the first, like the ones in the past decades, where candidates from all political parties run for the seats in the parliament. ### China's Iran Crude **Imports at Zero in June**

BEIJING (Dispatches) - China's crude imports from Saudi Arabia held at an all-time high in June, while deliveries from Iran fell to zero for the first time on record, detailed figures from the general customs administration (GAC) show.

Saudi imports were 2.16mn b/d last month, unchanged from May and up by 14.9pc from a year earlier. Riyadh remained China's biggest supplier with a 16.7pc share of total imports in June, followed by Russia with 15pc.

Pipeline and cargo deliveries from Russia increased steadily to 1.94mn b/d in June, up by 6.6pc from 1.82mn b/d in May. Crude imports from Brazil hit a record 1.21mn b/d last month, up by 120pc from May and almost double year-earlier levels. This made Brazil the fourth largest crude supplier to China in June. The previous record high in Brazilian shipments was 1.04mn b/d in February 2019.

Brazilian loadings to China eased in June amid congestion at Chinese ports and other logistical constraints, suggesting arrivals may fall back from last month's high. But China increased its share of Brazil's total exports to 88pc in June, driven by demand from independent refineries in Shandong for the country's light sweet crude. Imports from Iraq fell back to 1.46mn b/d in June after surging to 1.64mn b/d in May, but were still the second highest on record. Crude imports from Angola hit 1.08mn b/d in June, an increase of 57pc from May.

The GAC data showed no crude imports from Iran in June for the first time in at least eight years. China took 60,000 b/d of Iranian crude in May. June imports from Venezuela stayed at zero for a ninth straight month amid U.S. sanctions.

# **UK Embassy Resumes Issuing Visa for Iranians**

TEHRAN (IRNA) - The UK Embassy in Tehran said early on Tuesday that it has resumed issuing visa for Iranians after 10 years shutdown of visa office.

The UK embassy announced in its official Twitter account that it has reopened a center in Tehran on Monday where Iranian citizens can apply for British visa.

British ambassador in Tehran Rob Macaire had said in the official Instagram page of the embassy a week ago that the aimed to reopen the center.

# Two Swedish Nationals Arrested

TEHRAN - Judiciary spokesman says two Swedish nationals have been apprehended in Iran on drug smuggling charges.

"News that two Swedish citizens have been arrested for smuggling narcotics is confirmed," Gholam-Hossein Esmaeili said in a press conference on Tuesday.

He said a drug haul was seized from them when they were arrested.

"They are still under arrest."

"These individuals receive consular services and also enjoy the privileges that other

prisoners have," the spokesman said.
"We are waiting for the court to hold a session and issue a verdict," he added.

He also slammed the "inhumane" U.S. harassment of a Beirut-bound Mahan Air flight over Syrian airspace, calling on the Foreign Ministry to follow up on the "vicious" move through legal and diplomatic channels.

"The illegal and inhumane act of aggression committed by American fighter jets against the Mahan Air passenger plane was yet another manifestation of the American terrorists' bestial nature," Judiciary spokesman Esmaeili said.

On Thursday, two U.S. F-15 warplanes conducted a dangerous maneuvering close to Mahan Air's Flight 1152 that had taken off from Tehran and was heading to Beirut. The incident took place over Syria's al-Tanf region, where the U.S. maintains an illegal military presence.

Esmaeili denounced the incident as a clear violation of aviation rules and a breach of human rights, saying it has caused physical and mental harm to the passengers and flight crew.

He also emphasized that the Islamic Republic was in contact with Syria and Lebanon regarding the case.

## Lifting Sanctions, Not a Precondition for Negotiations, But a Reality

TEHRAN (IP) - President Hassan Rouhani stated that lifting of US illegal sanctions against Iran is not a precondition for negotiations, but a reality.

Referring to the American economic terrorism against the Iranian people in the context of the outbreak of Coronavirus, the Iranian president said, "The lifting of illegal sanctions is not a precondition for negotiations, but a reality."

He said that the enemies thought that Tehran would be forced to contact them after the sanctions and the economic war against the Iranian nation.

"During more than two years that have passed since the most severe economic sanctions were imposed against Iran, they themselves have repeatedly called for negotiations," added Rouhani.

Rouhani described the doubling of production of petrochemical and steel products in the last seven years as the result of valuable action and the great art of Iranian producers, specialists, experts and workers, and He stated: "This increase in production has created a great change in the steel and petrochemical industries of the country."

### Countries Urged Not to Be Deceived by U.S. Over Arms Embargo

TEHRAN (IFP) - A senior Iranian official has urged other countries not to be deceived by the U.S., which is trying to have the UN's arms embargo on Iran extended.

Deputy Foreign Minister for Legal and International Affairs Mohsen Baharvand made the comment as US Special Representative for Iran Brian Hook travelled to the region in recent days in line with Washington's efforts to extend the arms embargo on the Islamic Republic. Hook is to visit several European countries as well to pursue this objective.

"Our message to countries in the region and across world is that they should not be deceived by the U.S.," said the top Iranian diplomat

He said the White House has launched propaganda

campaigns to make others change their minds about the issue. "The Americans know well that Iran is a logical player and has never been, and will never be a threat to the regional countries," he said.

He noted the U.S. seeks to scuttle the Iran nuclear deal known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) and stir up fresh chaos in the region.

"The outcome of this illogical behavior of the U.S. is that all countries in the region and beyond will lose," he added

Iran has, on numerous occasions, condemned Washington's efforts to coerce the UN into extending an arms embargo on the Islamic Republic which expires in October, 2020.

## Tehran, Baghdad Emphasize Cooperation in Maintaining Common Interests

TEHRAN (MNA) – Islamic Republic of Iran and Iraq stressed the need to continue cooperation in line with preserving common interests between the two country.

Iraqi National Security Adviser Qasim Al-Araji in his meeting with Iranian Ambassador to Iraq Iraj Masjedi in Baghdad on Mon. stressed the need to continue cooperation between Iran and Iraq in line with rendering services to the common interests of the two countries.

The office of Iraq National Security Adviser in a statement announced, "at the beginning of the meeting, al-Araji thanked Iranian envoy for congratulating him on his appointment as Iraqi National Security Adviser, and then the two sides discussed about the issues of mutual concerns between the two countries."

According to this statement, the two sides explored avenues for continuation of cooperation and coordination in line with rendering services to the common interests of these two neighboring countries.

Interior Minister Qasim al-Araji, Iraqi Minister of Interior in former Iraqi Prime Minister Haidar al-Abadi administration and one of the commanders of Badr Organization took over the post of Iraqi National Security Adviser from Falih Al-Fayyadh, who is also the head of Hashd al-Sha'abi Organization, on July 14.

### Int'I Community and U.S. Illegitimate Demands

TEHRAN (IP) - The U.S. efforts to limit Iran's defense power; creating challenges for Iran's ties in international level and the U.S. insistence on extending arms embargo on Iran are along with the U.S. efforts to prove its superiority in the UNSC's decision-making which constitute the ridiculing principles governing the international relations.

Foreign Ministry Spokesman Abbas Mousavi said in response to the U.S. efforts to exert pressure on other countries for extending Iran's arms embargo: "The international community does not give in to the bullying and illegitimate demands of the United States, and Washington just pursues a futile try". By the virtue of the UNSC resolution No.2231, the embargo on arms sales to Iran will be lifted on October 18, 2020.

Exiting JCPOA on May 8, 2018, the US President Donald Trump reinstated the nuclear sanctions against Iran for two times, and through threatening and enticing other countries and economic enterprises, it prevented the implementation of JCPOA by other partners of the international agreement. Doing so, the U.S. government, on the one hand, seeks to turn JCPOA into a non-binding treaty for the other parties remaining in the agreement, and on the other hand, exploit it as a success in its failed foreign policy; during the coming U.S. presidential elections.

Salavati added that Iran is among the countries which have a reference in migrations' data with both local and international sources.



## **Expanding Transit Infrastructure to Increase Deterrence Power**

TEHRAN - First Vice President Eshaq Jahangiri said the development of domestic transit infrastructure to connect the country to international corridors will increase Iran's deterrence power.

Making the remarks in a meeting to investigate the strategic necessity of developing rail connections and roads of Iran with neighboring countries, he noted that the administration will not let the enemies to weaken Iran's strategic location and remove the country from the axis of international transit corridors.

The VP called for the foreign ministry to have the development of the transit position of the country via active diplomacy policy as its top agenda.

Considering its geographical location, Iran can play a significant role in the transit of goods in the region and benefit a lot from its status in this due.

To benefit from its location for transit, the country has many plans underway and on the agenda to boost its transit capacity.

Jahangiri stressed, "Our strategic vision in the trade and transportation sector should be the development of domestic transit infrastructures to connect to the north-south and east-west international transport corridors so that Iran's ill-wishers cannot weaken our country's transit position and remove Iran from the axis of international transit."

Jahangiri also highlighted that in addition to long-term planning and strategies, short-term measures should be taken to strengthen Iran's transit position, adding,



"Some projects such as accelerating the operation of the Khaf-Herat railway and Basra-Shalamcheh and Kermanshah-Islamabad routes should be on the agenda in particular, and the Planning and Budget Organization should change the issue of transit into one of the main axes of the Seventh Development Plan, while the development plan of Iran's transit position should become a national and lasting document which must be enforced for all governments."

Emphasizing that one of the most important priorities this year is the development of non-oil exports, the First Vice President called on all relevant executive bodies to cooperate and coordinate with the Ministry of Industry, Mines, and Trade to achieve this year's target which is non-oil exports.

Some of these plans include developing Iran's largest container port, Shahid Rajaee Port in the southern province of Hormozgan, and also Chabahar Port in the southeast of the country. connecting the ports to the railway network, development of transit via railway, and also some customs measures such as improving transit procedures in the customs offices.

In the meeting, the Iranian official said that good ground has been prepared for doing technological activities, and hoped that researchers and inventors would make efforts to launch studies to adopt action plan for resolution of problems.

He put forward a proposal for convening the third Iran-Austria working group for science and research cooperation via video conference to follow up implementation of joint projects.

Since its outbreak in December 2019 worldwide, the coronavirus pandemic has created obstacles to holding nany world events, meetings and conventions. The deadly virus has killed over 656,000 up to now.

Fight against the deadly virus needs the nations' vigilance and international cooperation, Salar-Amoli noted.

For his part, the minister plenipotentiary talked of activities of Austrian cultural forum (ÖKF) in Tehran which takes various measures to further cultural exchange between Austrian and Iranian scholars and artists.

Rieger expressed hope that Austrian and Iranian universities would establish academic relations and continue international activities through electronic research as the coronavirus pandemic has created problems for many common international activities.

### Tehran Has Good Reserve of **Essential Commodities**

TEHRAN (IP) - The Deputy Governor-General for Economic Affairs stated that according to reports, Tehran Province has a good condition in terms of the reserve of essential commodities.

Referring to the actions of the Market Regulation Work-group of Tehran Province in controlling the prices of essential commodities, Heshmatollah Asgari said that "Good measures have been taken in monitoring and prevention of hoarding of goods, which is effective in controlling prices.'

Saadat said that talks with Turkey are underway to ask them to increase working hours of their border checkpoints in order to accelerate the arrival of trucks into Turkey.





### **Bolsonaro Removes** Mask in Public



# **Two Baghdad Protesters Dead After Clashes With Police**



BAGHDAD (AFP) - Two demonstrators died in Baghdad early Monday after being shot in confrontations with security forces, the first victims of protest-related violence under a new Iraqi premier who had promised a dialogue with activists. The deaths threaten to reignite an unprecedented movement slamming government graft and incompetence, which erupted across Baghdad and the country's south in October but had waned in recent months.

On Sunday, demonstrators staged angry rallies in the capital and several southern cities, where temperatures topping 50 degrees Celsius (122 Fahrenheit) have swelled demand for air-conditioning, overwhelming dilapidated power grids. In Baghdad, dozens gathered at the protest hub of Tahrir Square, clashing with police and other security forces stationed there.

"Two protesters died this morning. One was shot with a tear gas canister in the head, and another in the neck," a medical source told AFP on Monday.

Their bodies were carried through Tahrir on Monday morning by fellow activists, before being driven to the holy city of Najaf to be buried.

An AFP correspondent saw the burnt remains of tent structures in the square on Monday morning. The two victims are the first since Prime Minister Mustafa al-Kadhemi, who had promised a dialogue with protesters, took office in May.

In a statement overnight, his office acknowledged "unfortunate events" in protest squares, but insisted security forces had been instructed not to use violence unless absolutely necessary.


It said the government would carry out an investigation into Sunday's events to hold those responsible to account. But online, activists were already comparing Kadhemi to his predecessor Adel Abdel Mahdi, who stepped down last year following months of protest-related violence.

Around 550 people were killed in that wave of rallies and another 30,000 wounded, many of them by militarygrade tear gas canisters that can pierce human skulls if fired directly rather than lobbed in an arc to disperse crowds.

There was virtually no accountability for those deaths under Abdel Mahdi; Kadhemi had pledged to publish a list of all the victims, carry out investigations and listen to protester demands.

But activists on Monday appeared to see little difference between the two, sharing a doctored image of Abdel Mahdi's handover to Kadhemi that depicted the outgoing premier pushing a collection of tear gas canisters and a rifle toward his successor.

They called for more rallies on Monday night, sending out invitations to gather over Whatsapp and Facebook. The United Nations said it "deplored" the violence. "Iraqis are in a difficult place facing many challenges. Their right to peaceful protest must be protected unconditionally," the UN's office in Iraq (UNAMI) said.

### North Korea's Leader Says **Nuclear Deterrent Crucial**

SEOUL (Dispatches) - North Korean leader Kim Jong Un said that Pyongyang's nuclear weapons guarantee its safety, state media reported Tuesday, signaling once again that it will not give up its arsenal.

Kim was addressing a conference of veterans on the 67th anniversary of the 1953 armistice that ended Korean War hostilities, the official Korean Central News Agency said.

Up to three million Koreans died in the three-year conflict, in which the armistice has never been replaced with a peace treaty, leaving North and South technically still at war.

"Thanks to our reliable and effective selfdefensive nuclear deterrent, there will no longer be such word as war on this land," Kim was quoted as saying by the KCNA.

"Our national security and future will be firmly guaranteed forever," he added.

Pyongyang insists that it needs its nuclear arsenal to deter against a possible US invasion.

It has spent decades developing it and is internationally isolated as a result, subject to multiple United Nations Security Council sanctions over its banned weapons programmes.

Inter-Korean relations have been in deep freeze for months, following the collapse of a summit in Hanoi between Kim and U.S. President Donald Trump last year.

That nuclear negotiation foundered on what the North would be willing to give up in exchange for a loosening of sanctions.

Kim declared in December an end to moratoriums on nuclear and ballistic missile tests, and Pyongyang has repeatedly said it has no intention to continue talks unless Washington drops what it describes as "hostile" policies towards the North.



## Turkish, Russian **Presidents Discuss** Regional Issues

ANKARA (Dispatches) - The Turkish and Russian presidents on Monday spoke over the phone and discussed a variety

of issues, including bilateral relations and developments in the region,

according to the Turkish Communications Directorate. The directorate said Recep Tayyip Erdogan and Vladimir Putin discussed bilateral ties, recent escalation between Azerbaijan and Armenia, and latest

developments in Libya and Syria. Both leaders agreed to maintain cooperation and dialogue regarding bilateral relations and regional issues.

Since April 2019, warlord Khalifa Haftar's illegitimate forces have launched attacks on the Libyan capital of Tripoli and other parts of northwestern Libya, resulting in more than 1,000 deaths, including civilian women and children.

However, the Libyan government has recently achieved significant victories, pushing Haftar's forces out of Tripoli and the strategic city of Tarhuna.

The country's government was founded in 2015 under a UN-led agreement, but efforts for a long-term political settlement failed due to a military offensive by Haftar, who has been backed by France, Russia,

The UN recognizes the Libyan government headed by Fayez al-Sarraj as the country's legitimate authority.

# Google to Keep Employees Home Until Summer 2021

NEW YORK (Reuters) - Alphabet Inc's Google will keep its employees home until at least next July, the Wall Street Journal reported on Monday, citing people familiar with the matter. Chief Executive Officer Sundar Pichai made the decision himself last week after debate among an internal group of top executives that he chairs, according to the report.

Google did not immediately respond to a Reuters request for comment.

Google had earlier said it would begin reopening more offices globally as early as June this year, but most Google employees would likely work from home until the end of this year.





# **Shipments Accelerate in June**

WASHINGTON (Reuters) - New orders for key U.S.-made capital goods increased more than expected in June and shipments accelerated, but the gains were likely insufficient to avert the deepest plunge in business investment and economic activity since the Great Depression in the second quarter because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Orders for non-defense capital goods excluding aircraft, a closely watched proxy for business spending plans, jumped 3.3% last month,

the Commerce Department said on Monday. These so-called core capital goods orders rose 1.6% in May and remained below their pre-pandemic level. Orders last month were boosted by strong demand for machinery, fabricated metals, primary metals and electrical equipment, appliances, and components.

Economists polled by Reuters had forecast core capital goods orders advancing 2.3% in June. Core capital goods orders fell 2.3% on a year-on-year basis in June.

Shipments of core capital goods surged 3.4% last month. Core capital goods shipments are used to calculate equipment spending in the government's gross domestic product measurement. Core capital goods shipments rose 1.6% in May.

Stocks on Wall Street opened slightly higher amid hopes of more stimulus to revive the economy. The dollar fell against a basket of currencies. U.S. Treasury prices rose.

Economists expect business spending contracted at its sharpest pace on record in the second quarter, which would mark the fifth straight quarterly decline.

According to a Reuters survey of economists, GDP collapsed at a 34.1% annualized rate last quarter, which would be the sharpest contraction in output since the government started keeping records in 1947. The economy contracted at a 5.0% rate in the January-March quarter, the deepest since the 2007-09 recession.

The government will publish its snapshot of second-quarter GDP on Thursday. The closure of nonessential businesses in mid-March to slow the spread of the coronavirus almost ground the economy to a halt, with most of the effects felt in April.

Activity has rebounded as businesses reopened, but the nascent recovery is being threatened by a resurgence in cases of the respiratory illness across the country. Some authorities in the hard-hit South and West regions have either shut down businesses again or paused reopenings.

Orders for durable goods, items ranging from toasters to aircraft that are meant to last three years or more, increased 7.3% in June after rebounding 15.1% in May. Durable goods orders were driven by strong demand for motor vehicles, which led to a 20% rise in orders for transportation equipment after a 78.9% surge in May.

Orders for motor vehicles accelerated 85.7%. That followed a 28.8% increase in May. Orders for civilian aircraft tanked 462.3%. Boeing (BA.N) reported only one aircraft order last month after receiving nine in May, according to information posted on its website.

The planemaker reported this month that customers canceled orders for 355 of its 737 MAX jets in the first half of 2020, as the damage done by the jet's grounding and the coronavirus crisis to the airline industry mounted. Boeing has been hurt by the fallout from two crashes in Indonesia and Ethiopia, which led to the grounding of its best-selling plane since March 2019.

### German Business Morale Brightens

BERLIN (Reuters) - German business morale continued to recover in July from its biggest decline in decades, with companies expecting Europe's largest economy to rebound from the coronavirus shock - as long as a second wave of infections is avoided.

The Ifo institute said on Monday its business climate index rose to 90.5 in July from an upwardly revised 86.3 in June. It was the third increase in a row and a higher reading than expected.

"The German economy is recovering step by tep," Ifo President Clemens Fuest said, adding that companies were notably more satisfied with their current business situation.

The government hopes its stimulus package — more than 130 billion euro (118 billion pounds), including a temporary VAT cut to boost domestic demand — will help the economy return to a growth path.

The survey showed that consumers were starting to open their wallets while industrial activity was picking p slowly, Ifo economist Klaus Wohlrabe said.

The surprisingly strong Ifo figures suggested that the economy got off to a good start at the beginning of the third quarter. Wohlrabe confirmed a growth forecast of 6.9%.

Still, the economy is expected to plunge by double digits in the three months from April to June, when public life and economic activity came to a near halt because of the pandemic.

The Statistics Office will release preliminary gross domestic product growth data for the second quarter on Thursday. KfW chief economist Fritzi Koehler-Geib warned it was too early to give the all-clear, despite the ncouraging Ifo reading and the trend among other sentiment indicators.

"The pre-crisis level will remain a long way off for the foreseeable future, and the continuing fierce rage of the pandemic in large parts of the world is an enormous risk for Germany as an export nation," she said. Commerzbank economist Marco Wagner pointed to higher corporate debt, which was curtailing investment, and a tense job market, which was curbing private consumption. "In addition, a second wave of infection seems to be looming in Europe," Wagner warned.

Health Minister Jens Spahn said on Saturday that the government may introduce compulsory coronavirus testing for holidaymakers returning from high-risk destinations after the number of new infections in Germany hit a two-month high.

### **India Bans 47 More Chinese Mobile Apps**

NEW DELHI (AFP) - India has banned 47 more Chinese apps just weeks after blocking the highly popular video-sharing platform TikTok and 58 others over national security and privacy concerns, an information ministry official and media reports said Monday.

Tensions between the world's two most-populous nations soared last month after a Himalayan border clash that left 20 Indian troops dead and an unknown number of Chinese casualties.

"We have banned 47 mobile apps from China in this ongoing exercise which highlights the government's seriousness about data privacy and security," the official, who asked to remain anonymous, told AFP.

"The order was issued on Friday. Most of these 47 apps are banned for the same reasons as the earlier 59, and many were lite versions or variants of the earlier banned applications."

There has been no official statement or order released by the government about the ban but it has been widely reported across major Indian media.

Anti-China sentiment has soared since the deadly fight in mid-June, which sparked street protests and calls for Chinese products to be banned in the nation of 1.3 billion people.

Local media on Monday said 275 other Chinese apps could also be on the chopping block over similar concerns, including the hugely popular "PUBG Mobile" game owned by tech giant Tencent.

From toys, cosmetics and handbags to home appliances, pharma, auto components, and steel, China exports more than 3,000 products to India.

Nonetheless, rivals hope to benefit from the concerns.

"The political upheaval in Hong Kong has created an opportunity for Australia and Sydney to become a stronger regional financial centre," Senator Andrew Bragg wrote to Australia's Treasurer this month, proposing policy changes. Japan included attracting "excellent human resources" to form a global financial centre in an economic policy roadmap earlier this month, following official remarks they could win business from Hong Kong.

Ruling party draft proposals include visa support and streamlining approvals for investment

management licenses. Smaller financial centers are also trying their luck.

Busan in South Korea is offering tax breaks and rent free offices to financial firms, while Taiwan's top regulator told Reuters he hoped the island's rule of law and democratic values would attract business.

However, the mooted reforms do not move the dial enough, say some sector professionals.

"Tokyo will, frankly, struggle to steal significant market share from, let alone replace, Hong Kong," said Steven Tran, a partner at law firm Mayer Brown in Hong Kong, who was previously based in Tokyo for four years.

Tran said Japanese taxes, together with a perceived greater level of bureaucracy, higher labor costs and less English language fluency, would make it harder for financial institutions to operate regional hubs from Tokyo.

Hong Kong's corporate tax rate of 16.5% is a little over half that of Japan's and Australia's, and among the lowest in the region. Convincing senior staff to give up an international lifestyle in Hong Kong is another challenge.

"Typically, when expatriates move to Japan they need much more hand-holding than when moving to Hong Kong," said Jeremy Laughlin, a Tokyo-based business development manager at Santa Fe Relocation.

Language and cultural difficulties as well as the absence of adequate financial infrastructure could scupper South Korea and Taiwan's efforts too.

## Huawei Cuts India Revenue Target by up to 50%



BEIJING (Reuters) - Chinese telecom company Huawei Technologies Co has cut its India revenue target for 2020 by up to 50% and is laying off more than half of its staff in the country, the Economic Times reported on Monday, amid calls to boycott Chinese goods.

Huawei's India unit said the report suggesting layoffs of more than half of Huawei staff in the country was untrue, but did not elaborate.

The newspaper said the company was targeting \$350-500 million (272-389 million pounds) in revenue for 2020, compared with roughly \$700-800 million it was aiming for earlier in Asia's thirdlargest economy.

The Economic Times said the company was cutting 60-70% of its Indian staff, excluding those in research and development and the global service centre.

Huawei's India unit said it continues "to work closely" with all customers in the country.

"Our India operations and resources, backed by robust local talent are designed to meet any customer requirements."

The Economic Times report comes amid a rise in anti-China sentiment in India following the killing of 20 Indian soldiers by Chinese forces in a Himalayan border dispute last month.

India has also told two state-run telecoms firms to use locally-made rather than Chinese telecom equipment to upgrade their mobile networks to 4G.

PARIS (Reuters) - France saw its biggest ever monthly drop in the jobless total last month as some jobseekers found part-time work, data from the Labour Ministry showed on Monday.

French Jobless Total Drops in June

The number of people registered at government employment agencies as out of work fell by 204,700 in June - the

biggest monthly drop on record - to 4,220,900, the ministry said. France's jobless total had surged to a record 4,575,500 in April as new hiring ground to a halt

during the coronavirus lockdown that the government put in place in mid-March. Most restrictions remained in place until May 11.

The ministry said the improvement in June was due mainly to some jobseekers being reclassified as partly active in the labour market because they had found less than full-time work.

Using the broader definition, the number of people seeking work continued to rise in June to a record 6,156,900 even though hiring returned to pre-crisis levels, the data showed.

# Young Leaders Tapped to Invigorate UN's Climate Action Plans

TEHRAN (UNIC) - The United Nations Secretary-General António Guterres announced the names of seven young climate leaders - between the ages of 18 and 28 years old – who will advise him regularly on accelerating global action and ambition to tackle the worsening climate crisis.

The announcement marks a new effort by the United Nations to bring more young leaders into decision-making and planning processes, as the UN works to mobilize climate action as part of the COVID-19 recovery efforts.

"We are in a climate emergency. We do not have the luxury of time," the Secretary-General said in a video announcing the establishment of the Youth Advisory Group on Climate Change. "We need urgent action now -- to recover better from COVID-19, to confront injustice and inequality and address climate disruption."

"We have seen young people on the front lines of climate action, showing us what bold leadership looks like," he added. "That is why I am launching my Youth Advisory Group on climate change today -- to provide perspectives, ideas and solutions that will help us scale up climate action.'

The members of the Secretary-General's Youth Advisory Group on Climate Change represent the diverse voices of young people from all regions as well as small island states. They will offer perspectives and solutions on climate change, from science to community mobilization, from entrepreneurship to politics, and from industry to conservation.

The newly selected members of the Group, ranging from 18-28 years old, are: Nisreen Elsaim (Sudan) is a climate activist and junior negotiator at intergovernmental climate change platforms with experience across a range of environmental topics, and she was part of the social movement that brought about

democratic change in Sudan. Ernest Gibson (Fiji) is the co-coordinator for 350 Fiji, a regional youth-led climate change network, driven by young climate leaders.

Vladislav Kaim, (Moldova) is a young economist committed to ensuring green and decent jobs for youth, and he brings deep expertise in international trade and migration. Sophia Kianni (United States) has helped organize nationwide strikes and has built a network of non-profits as part of the Zero Hour National Partnerships Team.

Nathan Metenier (France) is the political director at the 'Jeunes Ambassadeurs pour le Climat', where he helped develop the French youth climate coalition. Paloma Costa Oliveira (Brazil) is a lawyer and human rights defender who has

coordinated the youth delegations to several climate conferences. Archana Soreng (India) is experienced in advocacy and research, and she is

working to document, preserve, and promote traditional knowledge and cultural practices of indigenous communities.

The initial seven members of the Group have been chosen to give frank and fearless advice to the Secretary-General, at a time of growing urgency to hold government and corporate leaders to account on climate action.

"Our ancestors have been protecting the forest and nature over the ages through



their traditional knowledge and practices. Now it is on us to be the front runners in combating the climate crisis," Ms Soreng said.

"The climate emergency is a threat to life, and taking climate action is the only way to free our future," Ms Oliveira said. "Climate action is not just about reducing greenhouse gas emissions, it is also about:

creating green jobs in a post-COVID world, preserving our health and biodiversity and protecting the poorest and most marginalised communities," Mr Metenier said

"As an Iranian-American, I have witnessed firsthand the devastating effect climate change is having on the Middle East. It is crucial for world leaders to stand as a united front as we work to combat the climate crisis and racial injustice," Ms Kianni said.

"Taking climate action means contributing in the most direct way possible to the great reset of global economic order, an order in which nature will reconquer its rightful place as the main safe tangible asset that will never become stranded," Mr Kaim said

"Climate action matters because the story I want to tell my children is of how we took on the biggest challenge the world has ever seen and we won! We won for them," Mr Gibson said. "Taking the right action is the greatest motivation. Keeping up our work is the only solution, and doesn't need a second thought. With every challenge there are many opportunities, but we must do it together," Ms Elsaim said.

The establishment of the Group builds on last year's successful Youth Climate Summit - the first time a Secretary-General has convened a summit for young people entirely devoted to climate action. The Summit brought over 1,000 young climate champions together from more than 140 countries to share their solutions on the global stage and deliver a clear message to world leaders: we must act now to confront the climate crisis. The initiative is also aligned with the Secretary-General's vision for the UN Youth Strategy, launched in September 2018.

## U.S. Course at Record Low, Trump Sinks on Virus

WASHINGTON (AP) — With the November election 100 days away, more Americans say the country is heading in the wrong direction than at any previous point in Donald Trump's presidency, putting the incumbent in a perilous position as his reelection bid against Democrat Joe Biden enters a pivotal stretch.

A new poll from The Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs Research also finds Trump's approval for his handling of the COVID-19 pandemic falling to a new low, with just 32% of Americans supportive of his approach. Even Trump's standing on the economy, long the high water mark for the president, has fallen over the past few months after seeming ascendant earlier this year.

Those political headwinds have sparked a sudden summer shift in the White House and the Trump campaign. After spending months playing down the pandemic and largely ignoring the virus' resurgence in several states, Trump warned this past week that the situation is likely to get worse before it gets better. After repeatedly minimizing the importance of wearing masks to limit the spread of the virus, Trump urged Americans to do exactly that. And after insisting he would press forward with a large campaign convention in August, the president announced that he was scrapping those plans.

Trump's abrupt about-face underscores the reality of the situation he faces just over three months from Election Day. Even as he tries to refocus his contest with Biden on divisive cultural issues and an ominous "law and order" message, Trump's reelection prospects are likely to be inextricably linked to his handling of the pandemic and whether voters believe the country will head back in the right

direction under his leadership.

The AP-NORC poll makes clear the challenge ahead for Trump on that front: 8 in 10 Americans say the country is heading in the wrong direction. That's more than at any point since Trump took office. The poll also finds just 38% of Americans say the national economy is good, down from 67% in January, before the pandemic upended most aspects of everyday life.

Biden's campaign is eager to keep the final months of the campaign



that the former vice president can emerge victorious if the contest is a referendum on whether the current commander in chief has succeeded during his four years in office.

"People are sick and tired of a government that is divided and broken and unable to get things done," said Kate Bedingfield, Biden's deputy campaign manager. "What people feel like they're getting from Trump right now is a hodgepodge mess of self-interested political talk.'

The past few months have proved to be beneficial for Biden's campaign. He managed to swiftly consolidate the Democratic Party in ways Hillary Clinton, the party's 2016 nominee, struggled to do. Biden's fundraising, a weakness for him in the primary, has surged, allowing his campaign

to build out infrastructure and start ad spending in both traditional battleground states and more aspirational targets, including Texas and Georgia.

Biden has also benefited from Trump landing on the wrong side of the public in his initial reactions to the pandemic. For example, 3 in 4 Americans back requiring people to wear masks in public, which Trump initially dismissed.

Another pandemic test for the president lies ahead in August and September, as Trump and his administration aggressively try to sell a skeptical public on reopening schools. The poll finds that about third of Americans are opposed entirely to the idea, while close to half say major adjustments to instruction will be required.

The limitations the pandemic placed on the candidates' ability to travel and hold large rallies have also played more to Biden's strengths. While Trump relishes headlining rallies at packed arenas, Biden is less adept in those settings. He's instead spent the past several months delivering speeches to small groups of invited guests and journalists within driving distance of his home in Delaware, and holding virtual events with supporters and donors.

Trump argues that shows Biden doesn't have the

stamina for a full-blown campaign; Biden's advisers say voters want to see their leaders abide by the same public health guidelines they're urging others to follow.

Democrats have been buoyed by public polls finding Biden ahead of Trump both nationally and in some battleground states by a comfortable margin. However, Biden advisers caution that they expect the race to tighten in the final stretch before Election Day as more Republicans who may be dissatisfied with Trump's job performance gravitate back to their party's leader.

Overall, 38% of Americans approve of the president's job performance well within the narrow range that Trump's approval ratings have stayed throughout this presidency, but down slightly from earlier this year before the pandemic. Most Republicans -81% — approve of Trump's job performance, but just 68% of Republicans support his handling of

Fortunately, our products are competitive in terms of quality in the global market, and if the quality of the product is not high, we cannot compete in the market," he said.

He emphasized the importance of completeness of the production chain and said, "In the production process until the final consumption, the production chain must be complete and fortunately today, we are self-sufficient in most of the petrochemical and steel products in the country and we stand on our own two feet. Self-reliance and self-sufficiency have been important achievements of these valuable products in the country."

Referring to the need to prevent the sale of raw materials in the country's production sector, the President said, "Today in petrochemicals and steel, we have parted from the sale of raw materials and have reached added value, which can boost employment and develop downstream industries".

### India's Reliance Overtakes Exxon as Second Most Valuable Energy Firm

LONDON (Dispatches) - India's oil-to-telecoms conglomerate Reliance Industries surpassed on Friday Exxon as the world's second most valuable firm doing business in energy after Saudi Arabia's oil giant Aramco.

Reliance Industries is the most valuable company in India and has diversified operations, including oil refining. Its market capitalization hit US\$189 billion (14.1 trillion Indian rupees) on Friday, overtaking Exxon's market capitalization, Indian media report.

Early on Friday, Exxon's market capitalization was US\$185.58 billion. Reliance Industries became the first Indian company to hit a market capitalization of more than 14 trillion Indian rupees, equal to US\$187 billion. Its shares have been rising in recent weeks after tech giants

such as Google invested in Reliance's Jio Platforms, while Amazon is reportedly considering buying a stake of 9.9 percent in Reliance Retail. Over the past five weeks, Reliance Industries has added US\$39 billion to its market value, according to The Economic Times. In the past 14 trading sessions alone, Reliance Industries' shares surged so much that they added US\$29 billion to the company's market cap. The Indian conglomerate, however, is not an energy firm per se, and most of the market rally in

recent weeks was thanks to its digital and retail operations, not the oil industry.Regardless, Reliance Industries became the second most valuable company involved in the energy business in the world. Saudi Aramco of Saudi Arabia, which has been trading on the Saudi Stock Exchange, Tadawul, since December 2019, has a market capitalization of more than US\$1.7 trillion and is not only the most valuable energy company in the world but also the most valuable company in any sector Saudi Aramco is more valuable than the likes of Apple, Amazon, Microsoft, or Alphabet.

Earlier this month, Apple was close to overtaking Aramco when its market cap jumped to just over US\$1.7 trillion, compared to Aramco's US\$1.78 trillion based on current exchange rates focused squarely on Trump, confident | Early on Friday, Apple's market cap was US\$1.58 trillion.



"Everything is pointing in the direction that it is going to go ahead," the world number 14 said. "They have been quite vocal that they are pushing forwards. Just basing my opinion on all the information that is there, I think it probably will.

"As far as I understand, as professional athletes I think we can come back without quarantining as of now. But I don't know if that has changed in the last 12 hours." Meanwhile Serena Williams says she has asked tournaments to give other women players her spotlight as she admits the battle for equality in tennis isn't make as much progress as she'd like.

Williams has long been the biggest draw in women's tennis, and that has not changed despite her recent struggles to add to her already-incredible 23 Grand Slam titles.

However, speaking at the launch of Angel FC, a new women's soccer team in the US, Serena Williams said it's time for tennis' new wave of women stars to get the opportunity to grab the attention. "That's [gender equality] something we have to fight for still in tennis," Williams said.

"I'll look at the schedule and there's four men's matches and then two women's matches and then I feel bad, because I'm always one of those women.

"I literally have said just put me on the second court, so we can have other players have an opportunity on centre court.

"Obviously that doesn't go well in the timings, and they're like, 'No, no, no. You need be on centre court,' and I'm like, 'These other women need a chance and they deserve it, they've been working literally their whole lives to have this opportunity."

Williams is currently one Grand Slam title short of equalling the all-time record, and has lost her last four major finals.

Completes

Ldefender Dejan Lovren has completed a move to Russian side Zenit St Petersburg for a reported £10.9 million (\$14 million) after slipping down the pecking order at Anfield.

The 31-year-old, who joined the newly crowned Premier League champions from Southampton in 2014, made just 15 appearances this season, falling to fourth-choice centre-back behind Virgil van Dijk, Joe Gomez and Joel Matip.

The Croatian has been troubled with niggling injuries over the past two years.

"Another Liverpool legend who leaves the club, because he was absolutely a very, very important part of this team from the first day since I was in," manager Jurgen Klopp told liverpoolfc.com.

"When he was fit, he was very, very, very often in the team. A great player and a great person," Klopp added.

"Really good, in the air a machine, and I really liked working together with him. It will be interesting to follow Zenit St Petersburg now. I wish him the best of luck.'

### Malaysia to Host Asian **Champions League Matches in East Asia**

KUALA LUMPUR (Reuters) - Malaysia has been named the Asian Champions League's centralized hub in East Asia with matches in the region due to restart in October, the continent's soccer governing body said on Monday. Asia's elite club competition was

suspended in early March because of the COVID-19 pandemic and will resume in West Asia hub Qatar on Sept. 14.

Malaysia will host Group G and Group H matches from October 17-November 1 and a semi-final on November 28. It will also host last-16 games from the two groups on November 4 and two quarter-finals on November 25.

Teams from China, Australia, South Korea, Japan and Malaysia will play in the East Asia regional hub, while teams from Qatar, the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Iran and Uzbekistan will play in the West Asia hub.

The centralized venue for Groups E and F and the remaining knockout stage matches have not yet been confirmed.

The AFC said this month that group games would be played in full in a round-robin format while knockouts rounds would be reduced to single games from the usual two-legged tie format. The final pitting the best teams from each region will be held on Dec. 5 in the Western hub.

### **Thompson Wins 3M** Open to Claim Second **PGA Tour Victory**

NEW YORK (Reuters) - American Michael Thompson won the 3M Open in Blaine, Minnesota on Sunday by two strokes to claim his second career PGA Tour victory and his first in seven years.

The 35-year-old was solid throughout the tournament and didn't buckle under pressure, sinking a 12-foot putt on the par-five 18th to seal the win under sunny skies at TPC Twin Cities.

"It has been a long time," an emotional Thompson said after his round of four-under 67. "I'm really sad my wife and kids aren't here to celebrate this with me. I can't wait to see them. Babe, I love you," he said.

It's not like I'm saying it must go ahead. So long as it's safe for the players then we need to try to get back to competing when it's safe to do so." Meanwhile, Britain's leading women's player, Johanna Konta, believes the U.S. Open will take place.

# De Bruyne **Wants Champions** League Win

ONDON (Dispatches) - Kevin De Bruyne Lis hoping to crown David Silva's glorious 10 years at Manchester City by completing the Spaniard's set of medals with a Champions League win next month.

Silva has won four Premier League titles among 11 major trophies since joining City in 2010, as well as the World Cup and two European Championships at international level with Spain.

The 34-year-old midfielder has never tasted Champions League glory but he has one last chance with Pep Guardiola's men, with his contract ending at the end of the season.

City resume their Champions League campaign at home to Real Madrid on August 7, holding a 2-1 lead from the first leg of their last-16 tie, with the winners progressing to the quarter-finals, which will be held on a neutral site in Lisbon.

De Bruyne scored twice in Silva's final Premier League game as City thrashed Norwich 5-0 on Sunday and labelled his midfield partner one of the best players to ever grace the English game.

"For me he is one of the best players who has ever played in the Premier League," said the Belgian midfielder.

"You can always debate who is (number) one but when you play with him you can appreciate what he does day-in, day-out. I have played with him for five years -- a long time. "We have won a lot together, we play well together. We complement each other really

well in different ways. "And he's such a nice guy as well. He is going to be a big miss. It would be great if we could win the Champions League so it could end well for him."

between South and North Korea are also being touted for the 2032 summer games.

Under changes put forward in 2014, interested countries submit a request to join the non-committal "continuous dialogue", which Qatar confirmed to AFP it had done via a letter to the International Olympic Committee in Lausanne.

"Today's announcement marks the beginning of a meaningful dialogue with the IOC's Future Host Commission to explore our interest further and identify how the Olympic Games can support Qatar's long-term development goals," Qatar Olympic Committee president Sheikh Joaan bin Hamad bin Khalifa Al-Thani told AFP in a statement.

Qatar unsuccessfully bid to host the 2016 and 2020 games, having proposed to host the former in October without first clearing it with the IOC.

It won a waiver to propose hosting the 2020 games, a joint bid with Baku, Azerbaijan, between September 20 and October 20, but failed to make the shortlist.

The 2020 games, postponed to 2021 because of the coronavirus pandemic, were awarded to Japan, which also experiences searing summer temperatures, leading officials to schedule events early in the morning when conditions are coolest.

"Qatar has earned the reputation of a world-class destination for major sporting events," added Sheikh Joaan, brother of Qatar's ruler Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al-Thani.
