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### Iran Strategic Weapons Thwart Plot to Disintegrate Region

TEHRAN (PressTV) - The Iranian defense minister says the strategic weapons produced by the Islamic Republic and used by resistance forces have prevented a hegemonic plot to disintegrate the region.

"The hegemonic system used all its scientific, financial, and arms capabilities to support terrorists and cause the region to lose its integrity and ensure the Zionist regime's security," Brigadier General Amir Hatami said.

"However, despite all these efforts, Iran's strategic weapons used by resistance forces prevented the realization of their objectives," he added.

"Ultra-regional powers want the Islamic Iran to remain weak and dependent, but we have not only maintained our independence throughout all these years, but have boosted our power as well," he said. The defense minister praised the "unmatched and unique" position of the country, and said the enemy's plot to create a

### FM Not to Rest Until Martyr Soleimani Assassins Brought to Justice

TEHRAN (PressTV) - Foreign Ministry Spokesman Saeed Khatibzadeh says Iran's diplomatic apparatus will not rest until those responsible for the assassination of Lieutenant General Qassem Soleimani are brought to justice.

The official made the remarks to Lebanon's al-Ahed news website on Sunday that marked the first martyrdom anniversary of the senior Iranian anti-terror commander, who was assassinated by the United States early last year.

"Following up the issue of General Soleimani's assassination is among the Foreign Ministry's priorities. The diplomatic apparatus will keep up its efforts until it hands over those -- who ordered, plotted, and perpetrated this atrocity -- to justice," he noted.

The Americans "committed a great act of folly" by resorting to the assassination, and they are "the main losers," Khatibzadeh said.

The official noted that the trend of US expulsion from the region has expedited since the assassination and Washington's dream of disintegrating the regional resistance front has failed to materialize. See Page 7

TEHRAN - Some \$ 1.447 billion of foreign investment was approved in Iran from the beginning of Iranian year by December 20, 2020 in the industrial, mine and business sectors compared with last year.

According to Iranian Ministry of Industry, Mine and Trade during the first nine months of the current Iranian year (March 20-December 20), some 129 foreign investments at a value of \$ 4.384 billion were approved in Iran. The Industry, mining and trade sector with an investment of 1.477 billion, are on top rank in foreign investment. The Approved foreign investments concerned Germany, China, Turkey and the United Kingdom, respectively in terms of amount of investment.

Meanwhile over 17.46 million tons of basic commodities worth \$8.763 billion have been imported to the country during the first nine months of the current Iranian calendar year (March 20-December 20, 2020), the spokesman of the Islamic Republic of Iran Customs Administration (IRICA) said.

Imports of basic goods in the mentioned period decreased by two percent in terms of weight compared to the same time span in the previous year, according to Rouhollah Latifi.

As reported by the IRICA, more than 2,136,175 tons of basic goods were cleared from the country's customs during the Ninth Iranian calendar months of Azar (November 21- December 20, 2020), about 450,000 tons more than the previous month.

Meanwhile, a total of 25 million tons of commodities were imported into the country during the mentioned nine months, of which 70 percent were basic goods.

Corn, barley, oilseeds, crude and liquid edible oil, and soybean meal were the top five items imported in the mentioned period, with over 12.296 million tons of the mentioned products worth over \$4.145 being shipped into the country.

The said products accounted for 49 percent of the country's total imports as well as 70.5 percent of the imports of basic goods in the mentioned period, according to Latifi.

Iran imported 25 million tons of basic goods during the previous Iranian calendar year, based on the data released by the IRICA.

According to the IRICA Head Mehdi Mirashrafi, 35 million tons of commodities were imported into the country in the mentioned year, of which 25 million tons were basic goods.

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## India Has No Immediate Plans to Resume Oil Purchases From Iran

NEW DELHI (Dispatches) - India has "no immediate plans" to resume oil purchases from Iran as American sanctions remain in place, and it will take time for the incoming Joe Biden administration to return to the Iran nuclear deal, known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA), ThePrint has learnt.

Sources said India believes the Biden administration will not have an easy time resuming talks with Iran under the JCPOA, or bringing Tehran back in line with the terms of the agreement.

The sources said the sanctions imposed by the outgoing Donald Trump administration will thus remain in place for some time, and so, India is taking a "cautious approach". The expectation is that with the U.S. returning to the JCPOA, a lot of "tough negotiations will take place" before other countries are able to do business with Iran. As soon as the U.S. begins discussing the JCPOA, Iran's first demand will be to lift the sanctions. "Only after all this is done will other avenues open up and world businesses will start engaging with Iran again," said a source who refused to be identified. Iran was among the top three countries from where India used to import oil. From the Iranian perspective, India was its second biggest oil customer after China. However, under pressure from the U.S., India brought its oil purchase from Iran down to zero in May 2019. Last month, Oil Minister Dharmendra Pradhan had stated that India hopes to resume crude oil imports from Iran after Biden takes charge as US President on 20 January.

The Trump administration had walked out of the JCPOA in May 2018, three years after it was signed by the Barack Obama administration alongside the UK, France, China, Russia and Germany. Iran said last year that it would stop abiding by the deal, which seeks to restrict the country's nuclear activities.

Due to the economic sanctions imposed by the U.S., India has also not been able to continue with its plans for the expansion of the Chabahar Port project, which entailed building of a rail and road network.

Last year, in September, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar had made separate trips to Iran, at a time when Beijing and Tehran were preparing to sign a whopping \$400 billion economic and strategic deal. In December, India, Iran and Uzbekistan held a trilateral working group meeting on the joint use of Chabahar Port as a transit port. "Besides Uzbekistan, other Central Asian countries have also shown interest in using the port. India seeks to cooperate closely with regional countries on this issue," the Ministry of External Affairs had said in a statement. Another fallout of India not resuming crude oil purchases from Iran has been that it is rapidly losing its share in the west Asian country's basmati rice market, which is being taken over by Pakistan.

### Tehran, Islamabad To Discuss Anti-Narcotics Cooperation

TEHRAN (MNA) – Iranian and Pakistani anti-narcotics police chiefs will discuss ways of boosting cooperation in a bid to counter the traffic of illegal drugs.

Head of Iran's Anti-Narcotics Police Second Brigadier General Majid Karimi arrived in Islamabad on Sunday morning at the invitation of his Pakistani counterpart to strengthen bilateral cooperation in the fight against narcotics.

He has welcomed by a group of officials of the Pakistan Anti-Narcotics Force (ANF)at Islamabad International Airport.

Karimi is scheduled to meet and hold talks with some Pakistani officials, including Minister of Interior Sheikh Rasheed Ahmad, Commander of Pakistan Anti-Narcotics Force Major-General Arif Malik, and Federal Minister for Narcotics Control Ijaz Ahmed Shah. See Page 7

# Vaccinating Priority Groups Against COVID-19 To Start in Weeks

TEHRAN - President Hassan Rouhani has unveiled plans for a mass rollout of an inoculation program across the country within the next few weeks, saying the administration has identified the key groups that should be offered COVID-19 vaccination first.

In an address to a Sunday session of the Administration's Economic Coordination Headquarters, President Rouhani highlighted the government's serious efforts to develop a homegrown vaccine for the coronavirus and purchase it from various foreign companies.

He expressed hope that the delivery of coronavirus vaccine to Iran in the coming weeks would allow the start of a nationwide vaccination program.

The president said the inoculation scheme will begin according to a list of priorities in the target groups, noting that the medical staff and the elderly will be the first to get the vaccine.

After hearing a report from the Health Ministry and the Central Bank of Iran about the plans to finance the purchase of coronavirus vaccine from the foreign producers, President Rouhani called on the Central Bank, the Foreign Ministry, and the Plan and Budget Organization to work with the Health Ministry for detailed plans to expedite the purchase and import of the vaccine.

The president further pointed to his administration's experience of fighting a tough



economic war for three years, saying the cabinet has devised the next year's national budget with reliance on the experience of dealing with a full-flown war and neutralizing the inhumane sanctions and with the purpose of economic development and improving the livelihood of people.

He also dismissed any decision that may mount pressures on people and the country's economy, calling for efforts to create a promising prospect for economic development.

The president finally underscored that the next year's budget has been devised on the basis of a realistic view of the tax incomes and the oil revenues with a sensible prediction of economic progress.

In late December 2020, the president said his administration has devised a realistic, detailed and targeted budget for the next Iranian year with the purpose of nullifying the sanctions.

The budget bill is based on an in-depth analysis of needs of people and is cohesive, targeted, realistic and accurate, he explained.

### General Soleimani Autobiography Debuts With Leader's Autograph



TEHRAN (PressTV) – Supreme Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyed Ali Khamenei has signed an autobiography written by Iran's martyred senior anti-terror commander, Lieutenant General Qassem Soleimani.

Last week, Ayatollah Khamenei lent the autograph to the book, whose title translates as "I was Not Afraid of Anything." The autobiography was unveiled at a ceremony in Tehran on Sunday.

The Leader's note reads, "Anything that brings the memory of our dear martyr to the fore appeals to the eye and the heart."

"Even though, God has brought his memory to the height of prominence and, in this manner, rewarded the purity of his good deeds, each and every one of us also has a duty," Ayatollah Khamenei wrote, underlining the need for the Iranian nation to commemorate General Soleimani.

## Biden Should Return to JCPOA Not Only in Word, But in Deed

TEHRAN (IFP) - Foreign ministry spokesman says U.S. President-elect Joe Biden should show in practice that he would like to re-enter the 2015 Iran nuclear deal, officially known as the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA).

Saeed Khatibzadeh noted that the next U.S. administration should walk the walk, and not just talk the talk. "What we are constantly hearing today is that they (Biden and his camp) keep saying that they will unconditionally return to the JCPOA. We believe the United States should fully live up to its commitments under [UN Security Council] Resolution 2231," he said in an interview with Fars News Agency.

"We have also announced that if the other party (the US) effectively, and I repeat, 'effectively,' which means just signing a piece of paper won't do. If they return to the JCPOA effectively, we will reverse all the measures we have adopted to scale down our obligations under the JCPOA," he added.

"But this will happen the day when the United States effectively implements the JCPOA, i.e., the U.S. fulfills its commitments under Resolution 2231," the spokesman said.

"All of the United States' commitments are clear and written down," he added.

Khatibzadeh noted that the nuclear deal was drawn up based on complete mistrust in the Americans.

"The reason why the JCPOA contains so many pages and provisions is that there was no trust between us. ... When two people do not trust each other, they write down all possible scenarios. The JCPOA was drawn up based on absolute distrust," said Khatibzadeh.

"It is pretty obvious that we do not trust the United States at all. And in recent days, months and years, our mistrust has grown and the wall of distrust has become higher," he explained.

"The United States should win our trust, not on paper, but in practice.

"The next few weeks are those vital weeks when the other side will either begin to make good on its commitments or lose the chance of [using] diplomacy, which was once created with the conclusion of the JCPOA," he said.

# Zarif Says Any Fireworks Will Backfire Badly

TEHRAN (PressTV) - Iran has warned that Israeli agent provocateurs are planning to provoke a war through attacks on American forces in Iraq, advising outgoing US President Donald Trump to avoid falling in such a "trap."

Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif issued the warning in a post on his official Twitter account on Saturday on the first anniversary of the assassination of Iran's legendary anti-terror commander Lieutenant "Any fireworks will backfire badly, particularly against your same BFFs", (an initialism for best friends forever). His tweet came after two nuclear-capable American B-52 bombers flew over the Persian Gulf on Wednesday after nonstop flights to the region from their US-based hangars. It was the third time in six weeks that American bombers were conducting long-range flights off the Iranian coast.

## Gen. Soleimani Manifestation of Iranian Commanders' Valor

TEHRAN (IRNA) - Vice-president and Head of Foundation of Martyrs and War Veterans' Affairs Saeed Ohadi on Saturday said that Iran's anti-terror commander Lieutenant General Qassem Soleimani was the clear manifestation of all commanders' valor in the war against the enemies of Islam. General Soleimani stood up to the ISIS terrorist group heading to Baghdad and helped the Al-Hashd al-Shaabi (Popular Mobilization Forces) to be organized, Ohadi noted.

What is significant is that he should be emulated as a school of thought not just as an ordinary individual, he underscored. Iran's anti-terror commander Lieutenant General Qasem Soleimani and the acting commander of the Iraqi Popular Mobilization Units (PMU) - known as the Hashd al-Shaabi - Abu Mahdi Al-Mohandis, separately leaving Baghdad airport in two cars were targeted and assassinated on the 3rd of January this year on the instruction of U.S. President Donald Trump.

### Gov't Pushing for Development of Knowledge-Based Companies

TEHRAN (IFP) - Vice-President for Science and Technology Sorena Sattari has highlighted his organization's strategy to support the domestic knowledge-based and innovative companies.

In a meeting with the lawmakers representing Tehran in the Iranian Parliament, held on Sunday, Vice-President Sattari stressed the need to settle the country's problems with scientific methods and considering the domestic ecosystem.

The Vice Presidency for Science and Technology is currently pursuing two major strategies simultaneously, namely the development of knowledge-based and innovative companies and the promotion of soft technologies, he added.

Sattari noted that enhancement of soft and innovative technologies in Iran would create employment, promote innovation, and generate wealth for the country, citing new soft technologies in various sectors such as the motion pictures industry, publishing, video game industry, education, cultural heritage, fashion and clothing industry, and handicrafts sector.

The vice-president also criticized the educational system for its failure to train entrepreneurs, saying the Parliament's support for the Vice Presidency for Science and Technology would accelerate the achievement of development goals on the basis of science and knowledge.

In the meeting, the vice-president and the lawmakers agreed on the formation of a "joint task force on science and technology".

The MPs also expressed their support for the vice presidency and its scientific programs.

### Martyr Soleimani Thwarted U.S. Plot

KERMAN (IRNA) - Iran's Islamic Revolution Guard Corps (IRGC) spokesman Brigadier General Ramezan Sharif said the U.S. seeks to plunder nations in the region and disintegrating Islamic states, adding that Martyr Lieutenant General Qasem Soleimani thwarted the U.S. plot to disintegrate states in the region. Speaking in a meeting to commemorate anniversary of General Soleimani's martyrdom, Shrif said that formation of a powerful Islamic force for the first time in 200 years helped Muslims fight united against a common enemy.

The latest deployments came after the US Navy announced the arrival of a nuclear-powered submarine in the Persian Gulf last week. The USS Georgia passed the Strait of Hormuz accompanied by two American warships, making it the first missile-loaded submarine of its kind to enter the Persian Gulf in eight years.

The region has witnessed escalating tensions since outgoing US President Trump accused Iran of playing a role in attacks on the American embassy in Iraq late last month, which Tehran has dismissed as false flag operations.

The U.S. officials did not expect General Soleimani to become a national hero and tried for 10 years to tarnish his image.

### Range Limit to 2,000km for Iranian Missiles Not Everlasting

TEHRAN (MNA) – Stating that Iran's missile capability is non-negotiable, the Commander of IRGC Aerospace Force said that the range limit to 2,000 kilometers for Iranian missiles is not everlasting.

"According to the sublime instruction of the Leader of the Islamic Revolution, the Islamic Republic of Iran will support anyone and/or any country that confronts the Zionist regime," said Brigadier General Amir Ali Hajizadeh.

"What you see in missile power existing in Palestine's Gaza and Lebanon is supported by the Islamic Republic of Iran," he added. He noted that Iran has given military knowledge and technology to countries of the Resistant Front, adding, "Today, Palestine has been equipped with sophisticated missiles and this issue has caused fear in the Zionist regime and high power and strength of Axis of Resistance cannot be compared with 10 years ago."

In general, Palestine, Lebanon, Syria and other Islamic countries enjoy pinpointing missiles to confront the Zionist regime, Hajizadeh said. Pointing to Iran's missile attack on US Ain al-Asad Airbase in Iraq's Al-Anbar Governorate after the assassination of Martyr Gen. Soleimani, he said, "In fact, Iran undermined prestige and grandeur of the U.S. in international arenas."

"We were ready for the Americans' response, and if they responded, we would hit all their bases from Jordan to Iraq and the Persian Gulf and all their ships, even in the Indian Ocean," Hajizadeh added. Regarding Iran's missile power and some efforts to limit it, he highlighted, "Iran's missile capability is non-negotiable and nobody allowed to negotiate on this issue and that is the red line." Ithough the government is constantly chanting the slogan of improving the living conditions and welfare of the people, a look at the budget of 1400 shows that if this budget is realized, the living problems of the people will increase. This sentence is said by Dr. Mohammad Reza Kamali, an expert and veteran economic activist of the country. He believes that if the government does not think about amending next year's budget bill, it will surely face a significant deficit with its dream figures. He is a member of the Iran-Belarus Friendship Association. He emphasizes that in the current situation. due to the spread of the Corona virus as well as the intensification of international sanctions, the sale of Iranian oil and the country's foreign trade in general is in trouble. Therefore, the government must adopt policies that will save the Iranian economy from the current situation. However, next year's budget has been formulated in such a way that it is not only a cure for economic challenges, stagflation and corporate business problems, but also more politically closed. It can even further weaken the private sector in the country. This will put Iran's state economy in a more critical position. It will also increase the living problems of the people, especially the poor, such as farmers. In addition to working in the economic field, Dr. Kamali also owns the largest date palm grove in Iran. "Agriculture is not profitable in Iran at all," he said. This is a very thought-provoking topic. Governments are expected to consider arranging for agriculture to grow and develop as a valuable area for the country's economy. Following the conversation with Dr. Mohammad Reza Kamali, an analysis of the situation of the country's foreign trade, the recent decision of the Central Bank on trade, the supply of dates on the stock exchange, the shortcomings of the 1400 budget bill, etc. are presented.

#### What is your opinion about the general budget bill of 1400?

According to some analysts, if next year's budget is not amended, we will Aface a fivefold deficit compared to this year. The government is obliged to submit the annual budget bill of the whole country to the parliament by December 6th of each year. December 4, this year, the budget for the year 1400 was presented to the parliament by the government. From the beginning, the 1400 budget seemed to be more political than economic. However, if the rising rate of inflation continues, the country's economy will be severely affected in the coming months. It is noteworthy that estimates show that the amount of investment in the country from 2012 to 2019 at a fixed price has fallen by 43%. Meanwhile, due to the consequences of the outbreak of coronavirus in Iran and the world, as well as the intensification of sanctions, which has caused the price of oil exports to fall sharply and oil exports become a difficult thing, the country's economic situation, especially in the field of livelihood is very interesting. No, so it can be said that if next year's budget is not amended, we will definitely face a budget deficit, which will add many problems to the current challenges of the country. In this regard, the livelihood of the people will surely be more vulnerable than any other area and will face problems. Therefore, it can be said with certainty that if the budget is not reformed, it will increase the people's livelihood problems. Another point is that the general budget for next year is adjusted in such a way that it leads us in a direction where the private sector is further weakened.

#### As you know, the prices of basic commodities are rising day by day. For example, due to the problems in the livestock input market, we even saw at some point that the price of each kilo of chicken reached 40,000 tomans. What do you think is the reason for the constant increase in the price of basic goods and what should be done to solve this problem?

ismanagement and problems in the economic management structure in Mismanagement and problems in the coortering include to an increase in the price of basic goods. Meanwhile, exchange rate fluctuations and economic instability are one of the main factors in increasing production costs and ultimately the high cost of all kinds of goods in the country, which has made it difficult to meet the living needs of the people. The current market trend is that when a commodity becomes more expensive, the price of the other commodity is also affected. For example, some say how onions relate to the dollar while these issues are interrelated. Agriculture will inevitably face rising production costs and rising exchange rates and other energy factors. While it can not be expected to keep the price of the final commodity constant despite rising production costs. In fact, property, gasoline, currency, etc. cannot be expensive, but agricultural or manufacturing goods cannot be expensive in other areas. For example, at one point we saw that some experts were reluctant to accept the negative effects of rising gasoline prices on the commodity market, while it was clear that rising gasoline prices would lead to higher prices for goods and services. Energy plays an irreplaceable role in the production of a product or commodity, and its price change affects the cost price (producer price index). Unless the subsidy to the producer or the supply of energy at a subsidized price to the supply chain and production of goods, its incremental effect is reduced. However, in many cases we saw a significant increase in the price of goods and services. In this way, the increase in the price of other indicators will affect the price of goods and will definitely and naturally increase their price.With regard to protein products such as chicken, which you mentioned, the producers say that supplying raw materials such as animal feed such as corn and soybeans is not an easy task and has faced rising prices, which have been strongly affected by exchange rate fluctuations. Another issue is the general increase in prices that has arisen in the country with rising prices and has even increased the supply of labor and services. Accordingly, in recent months, for example, we have seen an increase in the total cost of poultry farms, ranches, and so on. Another important point is the US sanctions against Iran, which have caused problems for the Iranian economy in various dimensions. However, we will see some destructive economic phenomena until the sanctions are lifted and the flow of foreign currency into the country is normalized. In this regard, there is no denying the direct and indirect effects of sanctions on macroeconomic indicators. Unbridled inflation, the spread of absolute poverty, and others are other consequences of this restriction. In the meantime, of course, psychological issues in the face of economic turmoil are thought-provoking, which at times led to the warehousing and depot of some goods by brokers and provided the ground for further increases in the price of basic goods. But mainly



it can be said that the rise in the price of the dollar, which is the basis of all export and import activities, has created the ground for the high price of goods.

### How do you assess the current state of exports and foreign trade in general?

here are two very important issues with the current trade; First, the corona, which is a global problem and has posed many challenges for countries like Iran in the red. The second issue is the escalation of sanctions, which has severely affected economic actors in the field of trade and banking. Another important point is that in such a situation where there is a need for empathy and coordination, we see the performance of the islands of different government agencies in various fields, which has caused exports and imports to be as they should be and may not be in good condition. We now see that the directives of each part of the government are contradictory. In this regard, we can refer to the recent decision of the Central Bank, which closes the way for exports and trade, while we do not know on what basis these decisions are made. The next point is why the Supreme Export Council does not take action in this regard and does not give a special order in a situation where the recent directive issued by the Central Bank has closed the hands of many exporters. The cabinet and the chamber are at odds, and there is no way out of coordination between government agencies in consultation with the private sector. This makes foreign trade difficult and ultimately hurts the people. However, with the coordination of the Ministry of SAMT and the Chamber of Commerce to adopt policies and communicate approvals, at least many economic problems can be prevented.In terms of foreign trade, we also face political factions that ultimately trouble the economy. For example, the issue of the FATF and sanctions is an issue that needs to be examined and decided from a professional perspective. As you ask any economist or expert about the FATF today, they will tell you that although the consequences of the FATF are economic and livelihood, the decision-making process is political. In fact, the internal resistance to its acceptance has a political aspect. In the current situation, given that the government's revenues have fallen sharply due to declining oil sales, it is necessary to focus more on exports in order to have more currency for the country through non-oil sectors.

#### How do you see the import situation in the current situation?

n the current situation, many factories are facing problems in the field of raw material supply, to the point that in some cases we even see that production units are operating at the lowest capacity or have stopped their production line. The fact is that there is currently no acceptable coordination between decision-making bodies and those involved in the economy, and this has led to imports not being in a good position. While solving such problems requires strong

detriment of farmers and consumers, and intermediaries who buy agricultural products will benefit in any case. For example, this year, intermediaries bought dates from a farm for six thousand tomans per kilogram and offered them to retailers for about 40,000 tomans. Of course, part of this number is related to packaging, which is not more than 10%, and the rest goes to brokers and intermediaries and does not allow profit to reach the farmer.

### As the owner of the largest date farm in the country, have you achieved acceptable profitability in production and export this year or not?

he largest date farm in the country in the tropics, as well as farms producing rosemary, potatoes, wheat, barley, chickpeas, etc. in the cold regions belong to me. I can boldly say that none of these agricultural lands in the tropical and cold regions are very profitable, because the general policy of the government on this sector is very weak. In this way, the crop stays on the ground for one year and the crop becomes rare the next year. But despite the government's inappropriate policies in this area, farmers have to pay for planting, holding and harvesting costs for their crops, which would be unprofitable if production was not profitable. Meanwhile, high-interest bank loans do not help farmers at all. All these cases have ultimately made agriculture unprofitable in the current situation in Iran and farmers are not in a good financial position. While such a problem is painful and makes farmers inevitably look for other ways to earn a living. In terms of exports, not much has been done due to the corona and the discussion of sanctions. For example, in the past, food and products such as citrus fruits and pomegranates were easily exported to countries such as the UAE, but now this is not possible and exports are difficult. The same is true for dates, and a country like Russia does not buy this product from Iran due to safety and health issues related to the corona. Previously, Iranian dates were exported to three very important countries, including the UAE, India and the United Kingdom, but in the current situation, such a possibility is not available.

Explain the situation of the date market and the pricing discussion of this product. Dates have different prices in different countries, but in our country there is no reference for pricing dates, and the price of dates is determined by the agreement of brokers, which is very low compared to market prices. Also, many farmers are forced to pre-sell their produce at a much lower price than the cash selling price due to the need for liquidity. With these interpretations, providing the supply of dates in the commodity exchange and creating a price reference and the possibility of future transactions of dates will be a big step in order to support farmers. However, the areas that produce dates are considered deprived areas, and such decisions can have a significant impact on the living conditions of the people of these provinces. Therefore, the government should think about helping these areas.

#### What happened to the supply of dates in the commodity exchange?

have been emphasizing that dates have been listed on the stock exchange for two years, but unfortunately, for various reasons, such as the differences between administrative systems, this has not happened yet. However, if this product enters the commodity exchange, its first advantage is related to the standardization of products to participate in global markets. In fact, with the entry of dates into the commodity exchange, many brokerages disappear and it is a very positive move. Accordingly, I had previously announced that I strongly agree with the supply of dates in the commodity exchange, and if it is possible to supply dates in the ring, I will definitely offer my product in this market, but unfortunately this action has not been done yet.

Farmers in Iran do not make much profit from the sale of any product they produce, and most of the profits from agricultural products go to brokers. Dates are also among the products that there is a multiplier distance between the selling price of dates to the final consumer and the purchase price of farmers. Meanwhile, the commodity exchange is a good market for the direct supply of dates and will push traders to the margins of the market. On the other hand, the possibility of selling agricultural products at a more realistic price will definitely be an incentive for farmers and the development of the agricultural sector in the country.

What is your opinion about the policies of the new Minister Samt? Why do we face the sudden changes of some managers every day, such as the CEO of the Export Guarantee Fund of Iran? Wouldn't such measures hurt exports?

There is not much time left until the end of the twelfth government, and usually any changes made to the directors of the various departments by the ministers end to the detriment of all the people. In other words, it takes six months for the new manager to adjust to the new situation, while we no longer have time for that. Therefore, my suggestion is that the ministers of the twelfth government, instead of making changes in the last days of the government, give the necessary instructions to make the necessary reforms. Given the government's current short time, the changes will not be very beneficial and will exacerbate problems in various areas, including exports.

### As an expert in agriculture, how do you see government policies in this area?

The government's policy in the field of agriculture is not evaluated as positive at all, because we face a shortage of some crops due to the officials' inattention to issues such as the one-year cultivation pattern. Next year, so much is produced from one product that all products must be discarded. In fact, in this regard, the government has not implemented a proper policy, so that in different cases and in relation to the production of each agricultural product, we have clearly seen the existence of problems in recent years. However, mismanagement in this sector will ultimately be to the

# **Tehran, Seoul Begin Talks on Bartering Frozen Assets With Vaccine**

**TEHRAN - Head of Iran-South Korea Chamber of Commerce** says Iran and South Korea have begun talks on bartering \$8.5 blocked Iranian assets in South Korea with COVID-19 vaccines and other commodities.

Speaking to ILNA, Hossein Tanhaee pointed to some details of the meeting of the members of the chamber with First Vice-President Eshaq Jahangiri on the fate of Iran's blocked assets in South Korea and said, in the meeting with Mr Jahangiri, the chamber presented its suggestions for bartering goods with South Korea.

He admitted that South Koreans have not yet begun any practical action for barter or release of Iran's frozen assets and during the meeting with the First Vice President, some solutions for this woe were presented by the chamber.

Tanhaee noted that in the meeting, the barter of some kinds of goods which can be bartered and their tariffs were determined and now all should wait and see the result of next meeting with South Koreans and how much they would cooperate with Iran over the suggested list of goods for barter.

On the proposed goods for barter in exchange with Iran's frozen money, he said the



list has been prepared based on the priorities of the country and it includes raw materials, medicines, petrochemicals, auto and home appliances parts.

He emphasized that the most important issue in bartering Iran's frozen money is the purchase of COVID-19 vaccines, adding that necessary coordinations are underway by the health ministry. Tanhaee added that the amount of Iran's frozen assets in South Korea is between 8 to 8.5 billion dollars, adding that for imports of each items of goods for bartering, a certain amount of blocked money has been earmarked but it depends on South Korean how much they would cooperate.

On the cost of holding the frozen money in South Korean banks, he said in most countries, banks charge some fee for the public deposits and its amount is insignificant and it is in the framework of banking system of countries.

# ESCO Experts Able to Build, Launch Blast Furnace

TEHRAN – The ceremony for launching the hot air blowing process into the blast furnace No. 1 of Esfahan Steel Company (ESCO)



was held in the presence of deputy head of the company on exploitation Mr. Mehrdad Tavalaian, head of purchase department Mohammad Jafar Salehi, director of blast furnace unit Mr. Kazem Tadayon and some of senior officials of the company.

Addressing the ceremony, Mr. Tavalaian hailed the endeavors of staff of the company in reconstruction and renovation of the blast furnace No.1 and said that the furnace after 5 years of hiatus will be re-launched and it will be the first blast furnace of ESCO with the capacity of 1,000 cubic meters and with nominal capacity of 800,000 tons per year which can boost the productivity of the company.

He noted that the predicted plan for the furnace No.1 for 2021 is annual production of 600,000 tons of cast iron and this amount will be added to the capacity of the furnaces number 2 and 3. Tavalaian added that in case the raw material for this furnace is provided, it will continue its function with its nominal capacity. He said that with changes in the process of renovation and reconstruction in the furnace, the quality of production will increase. He also reiterated that experts of ESCO are able to construct and launch the blast furnace in accordance to the state-of-at knowledge. He said in this project, new equipment has been used for design and automation.

## **Cooperatives Capacity** To Be Used in Distribution of **Basic Goods**

TEHRAN - In the meeting of Minister of Industry, Mine and Trade Alireza Razm Hosseini and Chairman of Iran's Chamber of Cooperatives (ICC) Bahman Abdollahi it was decided the cooperatives to play more active role in distribution of basic goods and joining of ICC to the market regulation headquarters with having voting right.

In the meeting, Mr. Abdollahi pointed to the capacity of the cooperatives sector, and added that cooperatives sectors has major share of national economy and it has active presence in all fields like industry, agriculture, services, health, education and transportation.

He underscored that cooperatives sector is not merely limited to consumption and housing, adding that over 14.5 million people are members of the cooperatives in the country and some 40 million people of the total population of the country enjoy cooperatives' services. He also pointed to the membership of ICC in all supreme and specialized councils in the country, adding that cooperatives have considerable capacities and capabilities which have been less noticed. Abdollahi then pointed to the final cost of products in creating sustainable jobs and said the final cost in other sectors is a considerable figure but in the cooperatives sector with the least final cost, sustainable jobs can be created. He stipulated that if the government and especially the ministry of industry, mine and trade employs all capacities of the cooperatives sector, then some economic problems of the country can be resolved. He also announced readiness to help the government in some foreign countries as its commercial attaches. Then he highlighted some tasks and performance of the cooperatives and the ministry. Minister of Industry, Mine and Trade Razm Hosseini, for his part, said that due to the vast network of distributing goods in the cooperatives sector, this sector can be employed for organizing the favorable distribution of the basic goods, noting that it can be a big help to the ministry for transparent and targeted distribution of the basic goods. Later the Secretary of ICC Mr. Azimi pointed to the range of relation between the cooperatives sector with the industry ministry. He then proposed one of the deputies of the ministry to be appointed as the guy responsible in coordination between the ICC and ministry which was welcomed and approved.

# **Power Consumption Hits Record High**

TEHRAN (PressTV) - Energy Ministry has issued a warning about increased use of electricity in the country as demand in the manufacturing sector surges to record levels.

- A spokesman of Iran's national electricity company said that power usage across the country had increased by 17.5 percent year on year on January 2, saying consumption had exceeded the alert threshold.
- Mostafa Rajabi would not elaborate on detailed usage figures. However, a report earlier this week suggested that Iran's total consumption of electricity was reaching nearly 40 gigawatt hours (GWh) in peak hour times.
- Rajabi said that growing demand in the manufacturing sector was responsible for a bulk of increased electricity consumption in the country, adding that large manufacturers had consumed 15 percent more electricity year on year January 2. Rising power use have also put Iranian fuel supplies under strain as power plants across the country have been

forced to change fuel supplies from natural gas to mazut and other liquid fuels.

Rajabi said power plants had decreased their natural gas consumption to 183 million cubic meters (mcm) per day from highs of nearly 200 mcm per day seen last month.

That has come to help the Oil Ministry to maintain a stable flow of natural gas to the households during the current cold spell in the country, he said.

The official said electricity generation by the Iranian hydroelectric power plants had increased significantly to compensate for lower output in gas-fired plants, adding that hydroelectric plants were using 74 percent more water to be able to supply enough power to the national electricity grid.

A report by the official IRNA news agency on December 28 showed that Iran's total electricity usage had reached 39.940 GWh in peak hours, a surge of 6.77 percent year on year. The report said that off-peak consumption on the same day had also risen by 13.28 percent to 38.316 GWh.

# Tehran, Moscow Preparing Meeting on Coronavirus Vaccines

TEHRAN - Iran and Russia are preparing a personal meeting on cooperation in producing the vaccine against the novel coronavirus, Iranian Ambassador to Russia Kazem Jalali said in an interview with Izvestia newspaper published on Sunday.

"The phone conversations in April-October 2020 between the presidents of Iran and Russia underlined Iran's interest in cooperation with

Russia in the field of producing the coronavirus vaccine and exchanging the experience. Currently, Russian documents on the vaccines are being studied. It has been decided that soon a personal meeting will take place," the envoy said.

The ambassador also noted that although Tehran had declared the launch of the first phase of testing the first Iranian vaccine on humans, the republic was still considering all vaccines being produced, including the Russian.

## **Iran Spent \$15.5m on Masks Imports**

TEHRAN (PressTV) - Iran spent \$15.5 million on imports of various types of face masks to control the spread of the coronavirus in the 8 months to late November before becoming a net exporter of the protective item in later months of 2020, shows a report.

A study published by Tehran's Chamber of Commerce (TCCIM) on Saturday said that Iran had imported 132 metric tons of face masks from four countries between March 20 and November 20.

China had accounted for 98 percent of face masks shipments to Iran, said the report.

However, it said Iranian government gradually lowered imports and began marketing home-made face masks in other countries as it scaled up domestic manufacturing of medical equipment to respond to a growing demand. The TCCIM study said that Iranian-made masks had been shipped to nine countries over the eight-month period. It said, however, that declining prices of masks in the international markets caused earnings to fall to only \$206,000 for nearly

9.2 tons of face masks exported over the period On average, Iran had spent \$126 for each kilogram of masks imported into the country while the average price for exports was significantly lower, around \$22 per kilogram, said the report.

A bulk of Iranian-made face masks had been sent to Oman and Afghanistan as the two countries took delivery of 62 percent of all shipments

Iran has tapped its home-grown capacities to respond to one of the harshest outbreaks of the coronavirus in the Middle East region.

That has offset the negative impacts of the American sanctions on the government's ability to buy drugs and medical equipment from abroad.

## Gas Storage Capacity to Reach 6.5bcm by March 2023

TEHRAN (MNA) - The managing director of Iranian Gas Engineering and Development Company has announced that the country's gas storage capacity will reach 6.5 billion cubic meters (bmc) by the Iranian calendar year 1402 (starts in March 2023). Bahram Salavati put the country's current gas storage capacity at 3.25 bcm, and expressed hope that through implementation of different projects the figure will reach 6.5 bcm by the calendar year 1402.

Iran has two major natural gas storage facilities in Sarajeh and Shourijeh, in which every year the National Iranian Gas Company (NIGC) stores the gas received from gas refineries all over the country to be used in the colder months of the year.

Following the development of the South Pars gas field and the increase in the country's gas production capacity, construction and development of the country's natural gas storage facilities has become a top priority.

Reproduction from Sarajeh and Shourijeh storages increased by 33 percent in the past Iranian calendar year (ended on March 19, 2020) compared to the preceding year, according to Ahmad Rajabi, director of technical affairs at the National Iranian South Oil Company (NISOC).

The mentioned storages supply gas to six northern and northeastern provinces that are far from the southern gas-rich regions, eliminating the need for importing gas from Turkmenistan.

# **Pakistan Arrests Alleged Militant Group Leader**

LAHORE (Reuters) - Pakistan on Saturday arrested a man accused of being a leader of an Islamist militant group blamed by the United States and India for the 2008 Mumbai attacks, a counter-terrorism official said. The arrest is in relation to terrorism financing, the official said, and not a specific militant attack.

"Proscribed organisation LeT (Lashkar-e-Taiba) leader Zaki ur Rehman Lakhvi (has been) arrested on charges of terrorism financing," a spokesman for the Counter Terrorism Department (CTD) of the Pakistani province of Punjab said.

# A Dozen U.S. Senators Mount Drive **To Oppose Biden Certification**



WASHINGTON (Dispatches) - A group of Republican senators led by veteran lawmaker Ted Cruz said Saturday they would not vote next week to certify Joe Biden's election win -- the latest last-ditch move to support Donald Trump's efforts to undermine the vote.

The initiative, which appears certain to fail, flies in the face of rulings in dozens of courts, and the findings by officials in several key states, that there were no widespread voting problems.

The Republicans' statement, signed by Cruz and six other current senators along with four senators-elect, asserts that "allegations of fraud and irregularities in the 2020 election exceed any in our lifetimes."

The group said that when Congress convenes in a joint session on Wednesday -- for what normally would be a pro-forma certification of Biden's victory -- they will demand the creation of a special commission to conduct "an emergency 10-day audit" of the election results.

The statement says individual states could then convene special legislative sessions and potentially revise their vote totals.

ROME (Reuters) - Italy reported 364 coronavirus-related deaths on Saturday against 462 the day before, the health ministry said, while the daily tally of new infections plunged to 11,831 from 22,211, with far less testing than normal carried out on New Year's day.

Just 67,174 swab tests were carried out in the past day, the ministry said, down from a previous 157,524. Italy has registered 74.985 COVID-19 deaths since its outbreak came to light on Feb. 21, the highest toll in Europe and the fifth highest in the world. The country has also reported 2.141 million cases to date, the health ministry said.

Bomb Kills Two French Soldiers in Mali PARIS (Dispatches) - Two French soldiers were killed

when their vehicle hit an improvised explosive device in northeastern Mali on Saturday, just days after three others died in similar fashion.

Their deaths brought to 50 the number of French soldiers killed in the West African nation since France first intervened in 2013 to help drive back jihadist forces, according to army staff.

President Emmanuel Macron "learnt with great sadness" of the deaths of Sergeant Yvonne Huynh and Brigadier Loic Risser in the Menaka region, his office said in a statement.

Huynh, aged 33 and mother of a young child, was the first female soldier killed in the Sahel region since the French operation began.

Risser was 24. Both were members of a regiment specialising in intelligence work.

# Kazakhstan Scraps Death Penalty

NUR SULTAN (Dispatches) - Kazakhstan has abolished the death penalty, making permanent a nearly 20-year freeze on capital punishment in the Central Asian country, according to a notice on the presidential website.

The notice published on Saturday said President Kassym-Jomart Tokayev had signed off on parliamentary ratification of the Second Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights – a document that commits signatories to the abolition of capital punishment.

Executions were paused in Kazakhstan from 2003 but courts continued to sentence convicts to death in exceptional circumstances, including for crimes deemed "acts of terror".

Ruslan Kulekbayev, a lone gunman who killed eight policemen and two civilians during a rampage in Kazakhstan's largest city Almaty in 2016, was among the convicts set to be executed if the moratorium were lifted. Kulekbayev will serve a life sentence in jail instead.

Life imprisonment was introduced in Kazakhstan in 2004 as an lternative punishment.

The International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights was adopted in 1966, entered into force in 1976, and 173 states acceded to it.

The Second Optional Protocol to it, aimed at the abolition of the death benalty, was adopted on December 15, 1989, and came into force in 1991. Kazakhstan's parliament ratified the protocol on December 29. Apart from

Kazakhstan, 88 other nations are members of the agreement. "The signatory countries take the following obligations: first, not to apply the death penalty, second, to take all necessary measures to abolish the death

penalty within their jurisdiction. The only exception is the death penalty is allowed in case of wartime," Kazakhstan's Foreign Minister Mukhtar Tleuberdi said at the time.

This is the first detailed survey of the public's perception of Johnson's handling of the recently concluded Brexit talks and the COVID-19 pandemic after he reversed plans to allow families to meet up at Christmas in parts of southern England to combat the spread of the virus.

More than 22,000 people were surveyed in a closely watched poll constituency-by-constituency poll over a four-week period in December, which was conducted by the research data company Focaldata and published by the Sunday Times.

The so-called multilevel regression and post-stratification (MRP) poll found the ruling Conservatives would lose 81 seats, wiping out the 80-seat majority. This would leave the Conservatives with 284 seats, while the opposition Labour Party would win 282 seats, the poll showed.

The Scottish National Party, which wants to break away from the rest of the United Kingdom, is predicted to win 57 of the 59 seats in Scotland, meaning the party could potentially play a kingmaker role in forming the next government.

The prime minister is at risk to lose his own seat of Uxbridge, west of London, the poll found.

Johnson won a resounding election victory last year that allowed him to take Britain out of the European Union's orbit on New Year's Eve after almost half a century of close ties.

But Johnson's premiership may increasingly be defined by the government's response to the coronavirus pandemic, which has already killed more than 74,000 people and crushed the economy.

Lifting Sanctions Sole Way for U.S. to Rectify Trump Policies

TEHRAN (Tasnim) – Secretary of Iran's Supreme National Security Council Ali Shamkhani reminded the White House that removal of the sanctions against Iran would be the only option to correct the outgoing US administration's wrong strategies.

"America's perceptual war to magnify a trivial

issue such as its return to JCPOA will not be successful," Shamkhani said in a post on his Twitter account on Sunday.

"The complete and definitive lifting of all sanctions is Washington's sole option to correct Trump's failed strategy of maximum pressure," he underlined.



# **Russian Annual Oil Output Falls for First Time Since 2008**

MOSCOW (Reuters) - Oil production in Russia declined last year for the first time since 2008 and reached its lowest level since 2011 following a global deal to cut output and sluggish demand caused by the coronavirus, statistics showed on Saturday.

Russian oil and gas condensate output declined to 10.27 million barrels per day (bpd) last year, according to energy ministry data cited by the Interfax news agency. In tons, oil and gas condensate output dropped to 512.68 million in 2020 from a post-Soviet record-high of 560.2 million, or 11.25 million bpd, in 2019.

The sharp decline was almost in line with expectations.

The 512.68 million tons reading for 2020 was the lowest since 511.43 million tons in 2011, and the first annualized decline since 2008 amid the global financial crisis and falling oil prices.

Russia agreed to reduce its oil production in April last year by more than 2 million barrels per day, an unprecedented voluntary cut, along with other leading oil producers and the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC).

The move was designed to bolster the oil market beset by the fallout from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since the April agreement, a record for global supply reductions, the group known as OPEC+ has progressively reduced the cuts and is expected to release an extra 500,000 bpd into the market in January.

OPEC+ is due to hold its next summit on Monday, Jan. 4. Russia has been expected to increase its oil output by 125,000 bpd from the New Year.

Russian Deputy Prime Minister Alexander Novak, in charge of Moscow's ties with OPEC+, has said Russia would support a gradual increase of the group's output by another 500,000 bpd starting in February.

Darya Kozlova, an analyst at VYGON Consulting, a Moscow think tank that advises the government, said the market is in better shape now than it was in



March or April, when oil demand declined sharply at the height of the first wave of the pandemic.

"There is a deficit of around 3 million barrels per day on the market because of the actions by OPEC+," she said.

"Vaccination (against COVID-19) has started in many countries. So we will probably see a tactical increase by another 500,000 bpd (agreed) in January. Further actions will depend on the market situation."

### 2021 to Be Year of Recovery, Reforms for Turkey



ANKARA (dispatches) - Turkey is aiming to make 2021 a year of recovery and reforms in various domains, President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan said.

Addressing the inauguration ceremony of a bridge in the country's east, Erdoğan said the ruling AKP had identified various areas where reforms were needed. "At a time when the global political and economic order has been shaken to its roots, we should work harder to take our country to the point where it

harder to take our country to the point where it deserves to be," the president asserted. "We want to make 2021 a year when we leap

forward. That is what we are now preparing for." He underlined the success of Turkey's response to the coronavirus pandemic and its efforts to mitigate the economic effects of the global crisis.

"We mobilized all of state resources to protect the nation's health as well as our citizens' jobs and future," said Erdoğan.

Speaking about the COVID-19 vaccination efforts, he said Turkey's locally produced vaccines will be ready for rollout by April.

"I believe the start of the vaccination drive will mark an important step forward in our struggle against the coronavirus [pandemic]," he added.

# Malaysia, Singapore Terminate High-Speed Rail Link Agreement

SINGAPORE (Reuters) -Singapore and Malaysia said on Friday a long-delayed project to build a high-speed rail (HSR) link between the two neighbors will be terminated, with Kuala Lumpur to pay compensation for costs incurred.

First announced in 2013, the 350-km (217-mile) project linking Kuala Lumpur to Singapore has

been estimated by analysts to cost around \$17 billion. It was suspended in 2018 shortly after former Malaysian Prime Minister Mahathir Mohamad came to power with a pledge to tighten finances and review major deals made by his predecessor Najib Razak.

In May, the suspension was extended another six months to allow discussion of changes to the project.

Malaysia had proposed several changes but was unable to reach an agreement with Singapore on them before the suspension period lapsed on Dec. 31, Malaysian Prime Minister Muhyiddin Yassin and Singapore Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong said in a joint statement.

"Both countries will abide by their respective obligations, and will now proceed with the necessary actions, resulting from this termination of the HSR



agreement," said the statement, released by Muhyiddin's office.

Malaysia's economy minister Mustapa Mohamed said the original terms signed in 2016 were no longer viable, given the country's economic and fiscal position which had been severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. It had proposed changes

to the project structure and station design, Mustapa said in a statement.

The changes would have provided Malaysia with more flexible financing options and brought forward the construction phase by two years to help boost the country's post-pandemic recovery, he said.

Malaysia and Singapore would work together to determine the amount of compensation owed, he added. In 2018, Singapore said it would seek to recover over S\$250 million (\$189.14 million) should Malaysia cancel the project.

The rail link's operations had been set to begin in January 2031. Companies from China, Japan, South Korea and Europe had expressed interest in winning contracts to build, operate and finance the trains and rail assets, people close to the bidding process previously told Reuters.

# Green Energy Sparks Lowest Electricity Prices in Spain for 17 Years

MADRID (Dispatches) - The cost of electricity in Spain has fallen to its lowest level in 17 years due to a boost in renewable energy production.

Just in 2020, the price dropped by 28.8%, with wind-generated power preventing a rise in household bills due to escalating gas rates, according to a report by energy consultants Grupo ASE.

Analysts reveal that the cost of electricity production in Spain is among the lowest in the European Union thanks to the key role played by renewable sources. Spanish electricity is currently one of the most competitively priced in Europe, as prices have increased in the UK, France, Germany and Italy.

This tendency is expected to continue over the coming years, in keeping with an agreement between the Spanish government and the EU for 74% of the country's electricity to generate from clean energy by the year 2030.

According to Grupo ASE, wind power accounted for 32.6% of electricity generation in Spain in December, followed by nuclear (23.3%), hydraulic (14%), gas (11.5%), solar (3.1%) and others.

In addition, and as with everything last year, the coronavirus has also played a vital role in the downwards trend of electricity prices, with a drop in demand of over 5% due to the lockdown and the ensuing economic crisis.

Experts suggest that Spanish society is also increasingly energy-efficient, as part of a general consciousness regarding the environment that has also led to an increase in recycling and a reduction in reliance on single-use plastics.

December has reportedly been a very volatile month for energy prices, as a series of events have altered the markets including Brexit and a nuclear power plant strike in France, plus the commitment reached by the EU to cut CO2 emissions by 55% before 2030.

# **Uruguayan Academics Slam FA Over Cavani Ban**

On Thursday the FA said the comment was "improper and brought the game into disrepute", fined Cavani 100,000 pounds and ordered him to complete "face-to-face education" as part of his punishment.

The academy, an association dedicated to protecting and promoting the Spanish language used in Uruguay, said it "energetically rejected the sanction."

"The English Football Association has committed a serious injustice with the Uruguayan sportsman ... and has shown its ignorance and error in ruling on the use of language, and in particular Spanish, without noting all its complexities and contexts," the academy said in a statement.

"In the context that it was written, the only value that can be given to negrito - and particularly because of the diminutive use - is affectionately.'

Words referring to skin colour, weight and other physical characteristics are often used among friends and relations in Latin America, especially in the diminutive, the academy said.

In that context they are expressions of tenderness and are often used independently of the subject's appearance.

United said Cavani chose not to contest the charge out of respect for the FA and the "fight against racism in football".

"My heart is at peace because I know that I always expressed myself with affection according to my culture and way of life," he wrote on Instagram.

### Real Madrid Beat **Celta to Take Liga Top Spot**

MADRID (Dispatches) - Real Madrid jumped to the top of La Liga on Saturday with a 2-0 home victory over in-form Celta Vigo.

Lucas Vazquez headed in a cross from Marco Asensio at the far post in the sixth minute, barely a minute after Real centre back Nacho had cleared a shot by Celta striker Iago Aspas off the line.

He returned the favor in the 53rd minute, laying a diagonal ball into the path of Asensio with the visiting defence in disarray. Asensio drove his shot into the roof of the net.

"We said before the game that if we counter-attacked we could do damage and that's how it turned out," said Asensio.

Real rebounded from a draw with promoted Elche on Wednesday to move one point clear at the top of the table, but second-place Atletico Madrid have played three fewer games and can regain the lead when they face Alaves.

"After the draw in Elche we wanted to show aggression," said Vazquez.

With Real Madrid in control, coach Zinedine Zidane took off Asensio, Luka Modric, Dani Carvajal, Toni Kroos and, right at the end, captain Karim Benzema and brought on Eden Hazard and Fede Valverde, who are returning from injuries, and youngsters Martin Odegaard and Vinicius Junior.

"Today we played well from the first minute until the end," said Zidane. "There is a lot of the season left and we have to keep going."

"We are extremely disappointed and strongly condemn this image showing some of our players with family and friends together at Christmas, particularly as we know the sacrifices everybody around the country made to stay safe over the festive period," the Tottenham statement said.

"The rules are clear, there are no exceptions, and we regularly remind all our players and staff about the latest protocols and their responsibilities to adhere and set an example.

"The matter will be dealt with internally."

This is not the first time Tottenham players have broken lockdown rules as there were several incidents during the first lockdown in the spring.
