# Majlis Rejects Gov't's New Draft Budget

### IRAN NEWS ECONOMIC DESK

TEHRAN - Majlis rejected President Hassan Rouhani's draft state budget of about \$33.7 billion for the Persian year of 1400 which begins on March 21.

Members of parliament dismissed the general outlines of the budget bill by 148 votes to 99 on Tuesday during a stormy session. Twelve lawmakers abstained.

President Rouhani did not attend the parliament's reading of the draft budget, sending his deputy in charge of economic planning Mohammad Baqer Nobakht instead.

Nobakht had his microphone unceremoniously muted during his defense of the bill, with Parliament speaker Mohammad Bager Qalibaf explaining that his 20-minute time was up.

The government presented the draft budget to parliament early last year, promising less reliance on oil revenues and higher growth, but it took not long before critics described it as too generous on government spending and short on development. See Page 7

# **Borrell Can End Iran-U.S. Dispute Over JCPOA Return**

TEHRAN - Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif says EU Foreign Policy Chief Josep Borrell can resolve the "Mexican standoff" between Iran and the US over the two sides' return to compliance with the 2015 nuclear deal in his capacity as the JCPOA coordinator. Zarif made the remarks in an exclusive interview with CNN's Christiane Amanpour on Monday evening.

"Clearly there can be a mechanism to basically either synchronize [Iran and US moves] or coordinate what can be done. The JCPOA has a built-in mechanism, which is the joint commission. The joint commission has a coordinator ... who can sort of choreograph the actions needed to be taken by Iran and the U.S.," Zarif said.

He said Iran's moves have always been monitored and verified by the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), and Iran has shown that is fulfils its promises.

"The side that has not been able to show that it fulfils its promises has been the United States. So the U.S. needs to prove its bona fide. Iran has already proven its bona fide," he added. See Page 7

# Iran Launches Zoljanah **Satellite Launch Vehicle**

TEHRAN - Iran's Defense Ministry has unveiled a new domestically-designed and manufactured satellite launch vehicle capable of putting satellites into an orbit of 500km above the ground.

Ahmad Hosseini, a spokesman for the Iranian Defense Ministry's Space Department, said on Monday that the new satellite launch vehicle is based on the most powerful solid fuel engine technology attained by the country's specialists for the first time.

"For the first time in the field of space science, the first test launch of Zuljanah satellite launch vehicle has been carried out after achieving the most powerful solid fuel engine technology with the goal of conducting suborbital test," he added.

The three-phase satellite launch vehicle, which is comparable with the most state-of-the-art ones in the world in technical aspects, enjoys two solid thrust phases and one liquid thrust phase, he added.

The official noted that the launch carrier is capable of carrying a satellite weighing 220kg to an orbit of 500km above the ground.

Hosseini said one of the most important achievements of this test is making operational the country's most powerful solid fuel engine enjoying a 750-tonne thrust.

The spokesman said Iran has now three operational satellite carriers, namely Zoljenah, Sarir, and Soroush. Sarir is capable of carrying a payload of one ton into a height of 1,000 km and is going to replace Simorgh, he added. The satellite launch vehicle will be ready to put operational satellites into orbit after the completion of research tests, he noted, adding that reducing costs and increasing the speed of achieving objectives are among its main features. Iran has used various fluid-fuel satellite launch vehicles to put satellites into orbit.

The elite force fired the satellite — dubbed Nour (Light)-1 — aboard Qased (Carrier) satellite launch vehicle during an operation that was staged in Dasht-e Kavir, Iran's sprawling central desert.

The satellite was placed into the orbit 425 kilometers above Earth's surface.

It came after Defense Minister Brigadier General Amir Hatami said in February last year that Iran's satellite launch vehicles have nothing to do with its military activities and lie completely outside the country's defensive practices.

"The satellite launch vehicles have nothing to do with the subject of missiles, and constitute a completely non-defensive and non-military issue," Hatami said.

# Mexw Point We Should **Make Helicopter**

Today having helicopter, whose name has been changed into a Persian name, means possibility for rapid transportation in the short distances. Khajehfard by pointing to the history of PANHA Company (acronym of Iran Helicopter Support and Renewal Company) in the country says, "The background and history of PANHA dates back to 50 years ago and ever since the company has done great and important valuable services in different fields. Iran is the biggest fleet in the region and ranks third in the world after the U.S. and Russia in terms of its military helicopter fleet and PANHA despite all restrictions and sanctions has been able to support and supply equipment and renew this broad and diverse fleet.

Speaking in a meeting on the synergy for adopting important decisions for entering the mass production of Saba choppers he explained, "Today we have gathered here to organize utilization of an indigenous chopper in different organization which has passed successfully different stages of tests in order to meet the needs of the country in the helicopter field. All of us are fully aware that we have roles in forming the future of production, development and using a domestic production; all of us talk about production but if we have no production in any industry, we cannot attain development and sustainable progress. # **EU Seeking Ways for U.S. Return to JCPOA**

BRUSSELS (Dispatches) - The spokesman for the High Representative for Security and Foreign Policy in the European Union said that the EU is working on returning the United States to the JCPOA.

Speaking in a press conference on Monday, Peter Stano stated that EU High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy Josep Borrell's talks with US Secretary of State Antony Blinken was the first practical step in maintaining the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) and efforts in this regard are underway.

He referred to Borrell and Blinken's telephone conversation, stressing that the issue would be pursued at a relevant level. The European Union weighs up the U.S. and Iran's return to the nuclear agreement signed in 2015 requires Brussels to make major diplomatic efforts.

The spokesman for the High Representative for Security and Foreign Policy in the European Union said that the Union has always wanted to work with the United States on the Iranian nuclear case, indicating the need to find a way for Washington to return to the agreement and push Tehran to respect its commitments, and this will require persistent diplomatic efforts. Earlier, the spokesman had said that Josep Borrell would continue to make all possible efforts to ensure that Washington returns to the agreement and urge Tehran to respect its obligations within the nuclear agreement. Stano's stated the issue in response to statements by the new US Secretary of State Anthony Blinken.

He stipulated that Iran should respect its obligations before talking about the possibility of lifting sanctions. Last week Stano had also underscored that maintaining the JCPOA required maximum diplomacy

"The European Union is ready to work with the United States on the Iran issue. In particular, with the change of the U.S. government, it is essential that we find a way for the United States to return to the JCPOA because the agreement is a key element for the world," he told reporters on Thursday.

He also said that we must find a way for Iran to return to the full implementation of its obligations in the ICPOA. The European official noted that resolving the issue was "not an easy task," adding that all 27 EU member states issued a statement last month "expressing their support for intensive diplomacy to facilitate the return of the United States to the JCPOA and for Iran to fulfill its commitments under the nuclear deal."

# Zarif's Trips to Islamabad **Proof of Amicable Ties**

ISLAMABAD (PressTV) - Pakistan's foreign minister says his Iranian counterpart has made four trips to Islamabad in less than three years, and that proves Iran and Pakistan have maintained great relations.

Shah Mahmood Oureshi made the remarks in a Monday address to his country's Parliament, where he elaborated on the level of Pakistan's relations with its neighbors, including Iran.

"Pakistan enjoys very good relations with all its neighbors, especially the Islamic Republic of Iran," Oureshi said.

"Mohammad Javad Zarif, the foreign minister of the Islamic Republic of Iran, paid four official visits to Islamabad [since less than three years ago when the new Pakistani government took office]," the Pakistani top diplomat said.

"That indicates our good ties with this neighboring country," he added

## **President Hopes COVID-19 Vaccination** Will Begin by Yearend

TEHRAN (PressTV) - President Hassan Rouhani has expressed hope that vaccinations against the COVID-19 disease will kick off in the coming weeks, before the end of the current Persian calendar year in March.

"As soon as vaccinations start in Iran, we will definitely have better conditions. I hope we can start before the end of the 1399 [Persian calendar] year and even by the month of Bahman," which ends on February 18, Rouhani said on Tuesday.

"After medical staff and high-risk people are vaccinated, the situation changes completely, and later, the rest of the public will use it," he added. "Millions of doses of foreign vaccines will be imported and then from the summer, we hope domestic vaccines will enter the market and people can use it.'

Iran has purchased 16.8 million doses of COVID-19 vaccines from COVAX, a multi-agency group dedicated to assuring fair access to vaccines for low- and middle-income countries.

President also stated that a total of more than 2,200 tourism projects have been inaugurated in the Twelfth Government, stating: 22,000 billion tomans of projects have been inaugurated in this government. Today we also saw that 135 projects were inaugurated.

Rouhani added: "Currently, 670 hotels are under construction, some of which will be completed in this government, and the number of projects will increase tremendously.' Iran's president added: "My prediction is that in the coming months there will be better conditions for our educational space as well as for tourism spaces.'

He referred to the reports presented at the meeting regarding the changes made in the government budget bill in the Integration Commission of the Parliament and the negative impacts of these changes on the country's economy, noted: "The government has repeatedly stressed the need to maintain the main pillars of the budget bill, and



issues such as fighting special privileges, reducing inflation, strengthening the national currency and supporting people's livelihood and providing basic goods have been the government's main focus.

The President said that the next Iranian year budget bill has been prepared to manage the country's economy in the conditions of economic war and to manage the development path, adding: "According to the government, changes in the structure and main points of the next year's budget bill can seriously damage people's livelihoods and development path."

Following the meeting, the Central Bank's report on the foreign exchange and commodity markets was presented and the necessary decisions were taken to strengthen the movement towards reducing inflation expectations.

The President said: "The process of providing foreign exchange for basic goods and medicine by the government continues continuously and this process is being followed seriously so that people do not have to worry about the supply of medicine and basic goods. From now on, the necessary planning must be done for the last days of the year and New Year's holidays so that people can be sure of the supply of basic goods during these days."

TEHRAN - Director-General of the Asia-Pacific Office at Iran's Trade Promotion Organization (TPO) Seyed Reza Seyed Aghazadeh believes the capacity for trade between Iran and Pakistan is high and in case the required infrastructures are paved, their bilateral trade can enhance to \$14b.

Seyed Aghazadeh said the first online trade meeting of Iranian and Pakistani knowledge-based companies was held and said that estimates show that in case infrastructures are prepared, Iran and Pakistan can enhance their trade volume to \$14b.

He went on to say that Pakistan as a friendly neighboring country has huge capacity for increasing its trade with Iran in terms of quantity and quality that one of the grounds for cooperation is reinforcing joint cooperation due to Iran's energy sources and production.

Seyed Aghazadeh added that Pakistan is the fourth export destination for Iran's



products among the neighboring countries and their bilateral trade has stood at \$840m in the first 9 months of the current year.

He added that Iran's exports to Pakistan in 9 months are valued at \$71m and in return its imports have been around \$131m.

He went on to say that both countries can focus on barter trade and finding practical mechanism for it.

Meanwhile Pakistan Ambassador to Tehran Rahim Hayat Qureshi addressing the webinar expressed his country's interest, specially Pakistan Prime Minister's, for expanding trade and economy with Iran by using the border trade capacity and implementing existing agreements like preferential trade agreements.

He went on to say that due to restrictions because of the coronavirus pandemic, using virtual space capacity for holding such webinars is valuable opportunity and called for more support from the companies active in the field of knowledge-based and technical services.

TEHRAN - The CEO of Isfahan Province Water and Wastewater Company says for the first time in Isfahan Province, pipe-laying of the concrete-made 1,600-milimeter diameter wastewater with the length of 424 meters is being carried out in Shahin Shahr by the knowledge-based companies with using new method of theindigenized TBM. Mr. Hashem Amini explained different dimensions of implementing the project of drilling and laying the pipe of the main collector of Shahin Shahr wastewater with new method, and said that the main collector of the Shahin Shahr wastewater to the treatment plant is in length of 6 kilometers with diameters between 1200 to 1600 millimeter, and 424 meter of the project is under reconstruction with new method. # Zuma Not to Appear Before S. Africa's Anti-Graft Panel

JOHANNESBURG (AFP) - South Africa's beleaguered ex-president Jacob Zuma vowed Monday to not appear before a judicial panel probing corruption during his nine-year tenure, defying a court order compelling him to testify.

Zuma, 78, has played cat-and-mouse with the commission since it was set up in 2018 to investigate looting of state coffers during his rule.

He accuses the commission of bias and has demanded that its chair, deputy Chief Justice Raymond Zondo, recuse himself from the anti-graft inquiry.

# Myanmar Generals Tighten Grip on Power



WASHINGTON (Reuters) - The United States threatened to reimpose sanctions on Myanmar's generals after they seized power in a coup and detained elected leader Aung San Suu Kyi, whose whereabouts remained unknown on Tuesday more than 24 hours after her arrest.

The U.N. Security Council was due to meet later on Tuesday, diplomats said, amid calls for a strong global response to the military's arrest of the Noble Peace laureate and dozens of her political allies on dawn raids on Monday.

The coup followed a landslide win for Suu Kyi's National League for Democracy (NLD) party in November elections, a result the military has refused to accept citing allegations of fraud.

The army handed power to General Min Aung Hlaing and imposed a state of emergency for a year, crushing hopes the poverty-stricken country also known as Burma was on the path to stable democracy after decades of military meddling in politics.

U.S. President Joe Biden said the coup was a direct assault on Myanmar's transition to democracy and the rule of law, and said his administration

would be watching how other countries responded.

"The United States removed sanctions on Burma over the past decade based on progress toward democracy. The reversal of that progress will necessitate an immediate review of our sanction laws and authorities, followed by appropriate action," Biden said in a statement.

"We will work with our partners throughout the region and the world to support the restoration of democracy and the rule of law, as well as to hold accountable those responsible for overturning Burma's democratic transition "he said

democratic transition," he said.



# Uganda's Opposition Leader Files Election Challenge in Court

MAGERE (Dispatches) - Lawyers for Ugandan opposition leader Bobi Wine filed a challenge in the Supreme Court on Monday against President Yoweri Museveni's victory in last month's election, claiming the poll was rigged.

"We want nullification of the election. We do not want (Museveni) participating in any future election," said Medard Sseggona, one of Wine's lawyers, at the Kampala courthouse where he filed the petition for the runner-up in the January 14 presidential election. Museveni, a 76-year-old former rebel leader who has ruled since 1986, won a sixth term in office with 58.6 percent of the vote. Wine, a 38-year-old singer-turned-MP, came a distant second with 34.8 percent and slammed the vote as a sham.

# Erdogan Hits Out at "LGBT Youth" as Police Break Up Fresh Protest



ISTANBUL (Dispatches) - President Recep Tayyip Erdogan on Monday lashed out at Turkey's LGBT movement, accusing it of "vandalism" following an outbreak of student protests.

Four people were arrested over the weekend for depicting Islam's holiest site with pictures of the LGBT rainbow flag during a rally at Istanbul's Bogazici University.

And shortly after Erdogan's televised speech on Monday, another rally erupted at the same school with dozens of people detained and social media footage showing police dragging away students who had been protesting peacefully. "We will carry our young people to the future, not as the LGBT youth, but as the youth that existed in our nation's

glorious past," Erdogan said during a video linkup with members of his ruling AK Party. "You are not the LGBT youth, not the youth who commit acts of vandalism. On the contrary, you are the ones

who repair broken hearts."

# Russian Prosecutors Back Effort to Put Navalny in Jail

MOSCOW (Dispatches) - Russian prosecutors on Monday backed a request to imprison opposition leader Alexei Navalny for several years on old charges, after police detained a record number of anti-Kremlin protesters across the country.

On Sunday, demonstrators defied government warnings and rallied across the country -- including in Moscow and Saint Petersburg where authorities enforced unprecedented lockdowns of the city centre -- in a second weekend of mass protests over the arrest of President Vladimir Putin's most prominent opponent. The protests -- stretching from the Pacific port of Vladivostok to the northwestern city of Pskov -- came ahead of a high-profile court hearing that could see Navalny imprisoned for several years.

Navalny's detention and the crackdown on protesters has sparked an outcry in the West.

EU foreign policy chief Josep Borrell is expected to press the Kremlin to free Navalny when he heads to Moscow on Thursday.

Navalny, 44, is facing charges of violating the terms of a 2014 suspended sentence for embezzlement and could be jailed for two-and-a-half years.

The General Prosecutor's Office said in a statement on Monday that it backed a request by the prison service to change the suspended sentence to jail time. "This motion is considered lawful and justified," the statement said.

Navalny was detained at a Moscow airport in mid-January after flying back to Russia from Germany where he was recovering from an August poisoning. He blames the attack with the Novichok nerve agent on Putin and the FSB security agency. The anti-corruption campaigner is being held in a highsecurity detention centre and faces years of jail time in several different criminal cases, despite calls from Western governments for his release.

Navalny's team has urged his sympathisers to gather in front of Moscow's Simonovsky district court on Tuesday to show support for the opposition politician.

Bolsonaro's support for Pacheco and Lira underscores his embrace of a fragmented bloc of lawmakers known more for their horse-trading prowess than ideological commitments, called the 'Centrão,' or 'Big Center.' The president ran in 2018 on a pledge to clean up the capital and end decades of pay-to-play politics that culminated in a record-breaking corruption scandal known as Car Wash. Lira faces charges of taking bribes in the Car Wash and other probes, although the cases have not advanced in the courts and some have been dismissed. His lawyers have denied any wrongdoing by their client.

Lira promised to be independent of the government and push through emergency measures to assist Brazilians hit by the coronavirus pandemic. He called for a moment of silence for the dead in his victory speech.

Bolsonaro's stronger standing in Congress should dispel for now the growing clamor for his impeachment from critics who have filed 60 requests to unseat him, mainly for his handling of the coronavirus pandemic that has killed some 224,000 Brazilians. Pacheco, of the center-right Democrats party, has vowed to seek a compromise between fiscal restraints and assistance to socially vulnerable Brazilians hurt by the pandemic.

He has also said he would not make a priority of privatizing Eletrobras, Latin America's largest utility and one of the government's biggest potential asset sales as it works to cut the fiscal deficit.

# Exxon, Chevron CEOs Discussed Merger in Early 2020

LONDON (Reuters) - The chief executives of ExxonMobil Corp and Chevron Corp held preliminary talks in early 2020 to explore combining the two largest U.S. oil producers in what would have been the biggest merger of all time, according to people familiar with the matter.

The discussions, which are no longer active, are indicative of the pressure the energy sector's most dominant companies faced as the COVID-19 pandemic took hold and crude prices plunged. The talks between Exxon Chief Executive Darren Woods and Chevron CEO Mike Wirth were serious enough for legal documents involving certain aspects of the merger discussions to be drafted, one of the sources said. The reason the talks ended could not be learned.

# **Asian Factories Have Mixed Performance As Pandemic Impact Lingers**

TOKYO (Reuters) - Manufacturing in China and Japan suffered in January amid a resurgence in coronavirus infections, while South Korea and Taiwan saw improvements, underscoring the fragile and uneven nature of the region's economic recovery. Factory activity quickened in major chip exporters South Korea and Taiwan, as they benefited from continued brisk demand for

semiconductors crucial to work-from-home IT goods. But China's manufacturing activity expanded at the slowest pace in seven months in January, weighed down by falling export orders.

Japan also saw factory activity slip back into contraction as a new state of emergency, rolled out in January, hit operating conditions, PMI data showed on Monday. "PMI readings for Asia suggest that manufacturing sectors improved further in most places. Buoyant

global demand for electronics should continue to support the sector for at least the next few months," said Alex Holmes, emerging Asia economist at Capital Economics.

Takeshi Okuwaki, an economist at Dai-ichi Life Research Institute in Tokyo, said Japanese manufacturers may slash output as the state of emergency will unavoidably hurt the economy.

"A shortage of chip supply will take time to fix, which will also weigh on Japan's automobile production," he said.

China's Caixin/Markit Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) dropped to 51.5 last month, its lowest level since June last year and easing from December's reading of 53.0.

Although it remains above the 50 mark that separates growth from contraction, the index was below a median market forecast for a reading of 52.7.

The survey broadly aligned with Beijing's official PMI on Sunday, which showed the recovery in factory activity slowing as local COVID-19 cases rose.

Japan's final au Jibun Bank PMI fell to 49.8 in January from the previous month's 50.0 reading, as fresh state of emergency measures in areas accounting for 55% of the country's population hurt employment and output.

That was in stark contrast to South Korea, where factory activity rose at its fastest pace in a decade thanks to soaring exports.

Separate data showed South Korea's exports jumped 11.4% in January from a year earlier to mark a third straight month of gains due in part to surging sales of memory chips.

South Korea experienced its third and strongest wave of infections this winter but is seeing a gradual decline in new cases.

In India, factory activity expanded at its strongest pace in three months in January, fuelled by a continued recovery in demand and output.

Manufacturing activity in Indonesia increased at a faster pace in January than in December, and such activity stopped contracting in the Philippines. But activity shrank in Malaysia and rose at a slower pace in Vietnam, the PMI data showed.

China's economy expanded at a faster-than-expected rate of 6.5% in the fourth quarter last year, as factories raced to fill overseas orders amid a surging pandemic. But recovery hopes are being dampened by a sharp increase in COVID-19 cases as authorities impose lockdown measures to curb the spread of the virus in the country's north.

# UK Had Biggest G7 COVID Economic Hit

LONDON (Reuters) - Britain suffered the sharpest economic hit from the COVID-19 pandemic among Group of Seven nations even accounting for big differences in the way government spending is measured, an analysis by the country's statisticians suggested.

Official figures have previously shown that Britain suffered the biggest drop in economic output - adjusted for inflation - in the  $\overline{G7}$  between the first and third quarters of 2020.

Last month finance minister Rishi Sunak said the way Britain measured its economic output flattered other countries and the country's performance was not the worst among its peers.

On Monday, the Office for National Statistics said some of Britain's slump could indeed be explained by the way the output of government services such as education and healthcare was measured and it was hard to make international comparisons.

"But one helpful approach is to remove volume estimates of government consumption expenditure - this shows that the UK has still experienced the largest contraction but that the relative comparison with the rest of the G7 is not as large." Britain also suffered the G7's biggest drop in household spending, the ONS said, noting that the country's lockdown restrictions have generally been tighter and were imposed for longer. The overall economic impact of lockdowns and social distancing may have been greater in Britain because ocial spending, such as eating out and holidays, is more dominant than in other countries, it said.

Britain has had one of the world's highest COVID-19 mortality rates, another factor seen as weighing on the economy. In nominal terms - unadjusted for inflation - the collapse in economic output seen in Britain was "broadly comparable" to other G7 countries, and not as bad the drop seen in Canada, Italy or Germany, the ONS said.

## Euro Zone Factory Recovery Faltered in Jan But Still Strong

LONDON (Reuters) - Euro zone manufacturing growth remained resilient at the start of the year but the pace waned from December as renewed lockdown measures across the continent, alongside supply shortages, hurt activity, a survey showed.

With coronavirus infections soaring again in Europe countries have forced vast swathes of the bloc's dominant service industry to shut their doors, leaving manufacturing to support the economy as factories have largely remained open.

IHS Markit's final Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) fell to 54.8 in January from December's 55.2, although that was a touch above the initial 54.7 "flash" estimate.

"Euro zone manufacturing output continued to expand at a solid pace at the start of 2021. though growth has weakened to the lowest since the recovery began as new lockdown measures and supply shortages pose further challenges to producers across the region," said Chris Williamson, chief business economist at IHS Markit.

An index measuring output, which feeds into a composite PMI due on Wednesday

At this stage of development, a new policy is required to retrain and continuously improve the skills of workers. To this end, a special national project is to be developed and implemented. \*Third: to continue counter cyclical macroeconomic

policies to support economic activity. As part of improving fiscal policy, it is necessary to revise the Tax Code in terms of its simplification, stimulation of business activity and competition.

\*Fourth: balanced development of the country in terms of territory and space. In addition to all this, we pay special attention to the development of the most important industries that unite all regions with a single economic space.

\*Fifth: One of the main directions of reforms in Kazakhstan is political modernization. The recent elections have had a positive impact on the strengthening of political competition.

\*Sixth: increasing the activity of civil society representatives, improving youth policy and supporting charitable activities. Now another important step will be taken to increase civic engagement;

\*and seventh: One of our main goals is the full protection of human rights. At the same time, it is important to ensure maximum freedom of choice for citizens. Therefore, ballots of all levels must contain the option "against all".



India Cuts Import Tax on Gold, Industry Expects Drop in Smuggling MUMBAI (Reuters) - India slashed import duties on gold and silver on Monday in a surprise move that industry officials say could boost retail demand and curtail smuggling in the world's second-biggest bullion consumer.

Higher demand for gold from India could support global prices, which hit a record high last year, although that could increase India's trade deficit and weigh on the ailing rupee.

India cut import duties on gold and silver to 7.5% from 12.5%, but imposed a 2.5% cess - a separate tax - on the imports, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said.

After the changes, gold imports would effectively attract 10.75% tax against 12.5% earlier, said Somasundaram PR, the managing director of the World Gold Council's (WGC) Indian operations.

"Hopefully, this is the first of a series of such cuts to make bullion an asset class that operates mainstream," said Somasundaram.

India raised import duty on gold in 2019 to 12.5%, which industry officials said boosted smuggling of bullion into the country and hit banks and bullion dealers that were paying the duty.



"Higher import duty was not only indirectly promoting illegal gold transactions but also eroding government's revenue," said Ahammed MP, Chairman, Malabar Gold & Diamonds.

Up to 120 tons of gold was smuggled into India in 2019, according to the WGC.

Gold prices have come down with the duty cut and this will boost retail demand, said Prithviraj Kothari, managing director of RiddiSiddhi Bullions.

Gold futures fell nearly 4% after the announcement to 47,200 rupees per 10 grams, the lowest in over 7-months. India also cut import duty on gold dore, or non-refined mined gold, to 6.9% from 11.85% and to 6.1% from 11% on silver dore, Sitharaman said.

Shares of jewellery makers such as Titan, P C Jeweller and Tribhovandas Bhimji Zaveri Ltd closed up as much as 8.8%.

Despite rocketing input costs factories increased their own prices at a shallower rate than in December.

Still, with hopes the vaccines being rolled out will allow some return to normality, optimism about the year ahead climbed to a three-year high.



WASHINGTON (Reuters) - U.S. manufacturing activity slowed slightly in January, while a measure of prices paid by factories for raw materials and other inputs jumped to its highest level in nearly 10 years, strengthening expectations inflation will perk up this year.

The Institute for Supply Management (ISM) said on Monday its index of national factory activity fell to a reading of 58.7 last month from 60.5 in December. A reading above 50 indicates expansion in manufacturing, which accounts for 11.9% of the U.S. economy. Economists polled by Reuters had forecast the index at 60 in January. The ISM revised data going back to 2012.

Manufacturing has been driven by strong demand for goods, like electronics and furniture as 23.7% of the labor force works from home because of the COVID-19 pandemic. But spending on long-lasting manufactured goods fell for a second straight month in December, government data showed on Friday.

## **S. Korean Ship Crew Allowed to Leave Iran**

TEHRAN (Tasnim) - Iran has granted exit visas to the crew of a South Korean vessel that was seized in the Persian Gulf in early January, the Foreign Ministry spokesperson said. In a statement on Tuesday, Saeed Khatibzadeh said the crew members of the South Korean ship have been permitted to leave Iran "in a humanitarian gesture".

He said the ship crew has obtained permits to leave Iran upon a request from the government of South Korea and cooperation from the Iranian Judiciary.

The legal procedures concerning the case of the offending ship and violation of law by its captain are still going on, the spokesman added.



# **Turkish Lira Surges Over 1.9% to August Levels**

ANKARA (Dispatches) - Turkey's lira rallied over 1.9% to its strongest since August on Monday and a risk gauge dropped to close to its lowest in a year, driven by a hawkish talk by the central bank and data pointing to a further rebound in manufacturing.

The currency has outpaced all emerging market peers except China's yuan so far this year after the Central Bank of the Republic of Turkey's (CBRT) new chief, Naci Ağbal, hiked rates to 17% from 10.25% since November and pledged to tackle double-digit inflation.

In its best day so far this year, the lira jumped to 7.1666 against the dollar by 6:30 p.m. local time. It has gained on seven of the last nine trading days.

Turkey's benchmark stock index BIST 100 was up 1.29% to close Monday at 1,492.45 points.

Five-year credit default swaps (CDS), a measure of investment risk, have fallen dramatically since Ağbal was appointed in early November to 304.5 basis points on Monday. Turkish CDS were above 500 for much of last year.

The rate hikes and the government's promise of a new more market-friendly economic era has raised expectations that Turkey will get a handle on inflation, boost its monetary credibility and rebuild FX reserves.

Some foreign investors have edged back into Turkish assets, lifting the lira from record lows touched three months ago.

The monthly Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) rose to 54.4 last month from 50.8 in December, according to the latest survey that showed jumps in Turkish output, new orders and exports.

The headline index reading showed the industry posted its most robust improvement in business conditions since July 2020.

Separate data showed retail prices in Istanbul were up more than 15% from a year ago, while wholesale prices jumped nearly 18%, suggesting tight monetary policy will be maintained well into the year.

The manufacturing data "suggests that the recent monetary tightening undertaken by the Turkish central bank has yet to bite," Bethany Beckett of Capital Economics wrote in a note.

Presenting the first inflation report of the year, Ağbal last week reaffirmed the



central bank's commitment to upholding tight monetary policy even if more 'front-loaded" steps are needed.

He also stood by a forecast that inflation would fall to 9.4% this year. The annual inflation edged higher to 14.6% in December.

Surveys projected inflation would slightly rise again last month. A Reuters poll of 14 economists on Friday predicted that the annual inflation would rise to 14.68%. A survey of 17 economists by Anadolu Agency (AA) on Friday also projected the

inflation rate to hit 14.75%

The Turkish Statistical Institute (TurkStat) is scheduled to announce January inflation data at 10 a.m. local time on Wednesday.

Ağbal said the bank would keep policy tight until inflation comes down to the 5% target, which he said would not happen until 2023.

### South Korea's PMI Hits **Decade High as Export Demand Surges**



SEOUL (Dispatches) - South Korea's factory activity rose at its fastest pace in a decade in January, a business survey showed on Monday, as soaring exports drove the recovery in the manufacturing-heavy economy.

The IHS Markit purchasing managers' index (PMI) rose to 53.2 in January from 52.9 in December, the highest reading since February 2011. The 50-mark threshold separates growth from contraction.

"South Korean manufacturers began 2021 in a similar vein to the way the previous year ended," Usamah Bhatti, economist at IHS Markit. "The latest manufacturing PMI indicated a sustained improvement in the health of the sector, with the strongest expansion in the manufacturing sector for close to a decade." Readings of output, new orders and new exports all increased in January, according to the survey. Respondents largely attributed higher foreign demand to stronger client confidence as the worst of the pandemic subsides in Asia's fourth-largest economy.

# Indonesia Eyes 6% Growth in Non-Oil and Gas Exports

JAKARTA (ANN) - The government is expecting to achieve 6.3 percent annual growth in Indonesia's non-oil and gas exports this year as trading partners have started rolling out coronavirus vaccines to re-emerge from the pandemic-induced economic downturn.

Trade Minister Muhamad Lutfi said on Friday the growth target was based on the assumption that Indonesia's economy would recover this year, in line with the forecast outlined by various international organisations.

"Of course, there will be many factors that come into play," Lutfi said in a virtual presser. "First, the success of vaccination not only in Indonesia but also in its major trading partners. Second, the long-awaited reform through the Jobs Creation Law.'

The Covid-19 pandemic has disrupted international trade and global supply chains as mobility restrictions implemented in various countries around the world hampered logistics. In addition, the slowing global economy has resulted in weakening purchasing power and cooling demand.

Indonesia's overall exports fell by 2.57 per cent year-on-year (yoy) to US\$163.3 billion last year while imports slumped by a steeper 17.35 per cent yoy to \$141.6 billion. As a result, the country booked a trade surplus of \$21.7 billion, the second-highest in history.

This year's target signaled an expectation for a rebound in non-oil and gas exports, which were down 0.58 percent to \$155 billion in 2020 from a year earlier, according to the ministry, quoting data from Statistics Indonesia (BPS).

The unusually high surplus last year was due to declining domestic demand as consumer spending and investment shrank, Lutfi said, in line with the pandemic-induced economic downturn.

"Some 70 percent or three-quarters of Indonesia's imports are raw and supporting materials. If raw and supporting materials are falling, it means industrialization in the country is also declining, perhaps because consumer spending is down," said the former Indonesian ambassador to the United States.

Indonesia's economy shrank 3.49 per cent yoy in the third quarter of 2020, marking the country's first recession in around two decades. Consumer spending contracted deeper by 4.04 per cent yoy and investment expenditure by 6.48 per cent yoy in the quarter.

The World Bank and the Asian Development Bank (ADB) have projected the country's economy to grow 4.4 per cent and 4.5 per cent, respectively, this year.

To support the export target achievement, the ministry is planning to promote exports of automotive products to new markets like China, Brazil and Myanmar, metals to Turkey, the United Arab Emirates and the Philippines, rubber to China, Australia and Vietnam and electronics to the United States, Australia and China.

Centre for Reform on Economics (CORE) Indonesia executive director Mohammad Faisal expressed optimism that imports would grow this year as Indonesia's gross domestic product (GDP) was expected to grow by at least 3 per cent. At the same time, he also expected higher exports — despite being still below 10 percent — as the country's main trading partners, such as China, recovered from the pandemic.

Zarif said the reason why Iran has moved away from its JCPOA commitments is the U.S. move to impose a full economic war against Iran.

"First of all the United States must establish its bona fide, to come back to the nuclear deal. The U.S. is not in the nuclear deal because of its own decision to withdraw without taking the routes that were available to it within the nuclear agreement," he added.

When asked about the U.S. call for inclusion of non-nuclear issues in the JCPOA, Zarif said the 2015 nuclear deal between Tehran and world powers, officially known as the JCPOA, did not include Iran's defensive capabilities because the U.S. was not prepared to stop its arms sales to the region as a precondition. "The nuclear deal was negotiated based on what we could agree and what we could not agree. This is the deal that was made," Zarif said.

"The United States has to accept that ... we decided not to agree upon certain things, not because we neglected them, but because the United States and its allies were not prepared to do what was necessary. Is the US prepared to stop selling arms to our region?" Zarif said Iran "spends a seventh of Saudi Arabia on defense, with 2.5 times its population".

# Westbrook Carries Wizard To Wild Win Over Nets enjoy nor

NEW YORK (Dispatches) - Russell Westbrook hit a go-ahead 3-pointer with 4.3 seconds remaining as the host Washington Wizards posted an unlikely 149-146 victory over the Brooklyn Nets.

Washington's only lead was briefly in the second quarter before the frenetic final seconds that saw them score eight unanswered points in the final 8.1 seconds. Bradley Beal's deep 3-pointer got the Wizards within 146-144, then Garrison Matthews intercepted a rushed inbounds pass by Joe Harris intended for Kevin Durant with 6.8 seconds left. He quickly dished to Westbrook, who sank a 3-pointer over Kyrie Irving with 4.3 seconds remaining.

Westbrook scored 15 of his season-high 41 points in the fourth quarter as Washington snapped a four-game losing streak. Beal posted 22 of his 37 points in the final stanza as Washington beat the Nets in the final seconds for the second time this season after overcoming a nine-point deficit in the final 4:54. Durant scored 37 and Harris added a career-high 30 for the Nets, who saw a four-game winning streak stopped and played without James Harden (left thigh contusion). Irving added 26 and Jeff Green contributed a season-best 23 for Brooklyn, which shot 56.8 percent and led by 18 late in the first quarter.

Nikola Jokic matched his career high of 47 points, collected 12 rebounds, and dished out five assists to lead Denver Nuggets to a 128-117 victory over visiting Utah Jazz.

Will Barton scored 18 points and Jamal Murray added 16 for the Nuggets. Denver snapped Utah's 11-game winning streak after shooting 54 percent from the field and making 18 of 28 3-pointers (64.3 percent). Bojan Bogdanovic scored 29 points to lead the Jazz. Utah had seven players score in double figures but could not keep up with the Nuggets' blazing shooting in the end.

For the first time this season, Philadelphia 76ers found a path to victory without Joel Embiid by defeating host Indiana Pacers 119-110 behind a dominant fourth quarter in Indianapolis.

## **Barcelona Presidential Rivals** Insist Messi Is Worth It

 $B_{\mathrm{candidates}\ in\ Barcelona's\ presidential}^{\mathrm{ARCELONA}\ (\mathrm{Dispatches})\ -\ \mathrm{Two\ of\ the}}$ election, Joan Laporta and Victor Font, insisted on Monday that Lionel Messi "generates more" than he earns, after his "colossal" club contract was published in a Spanish newspaper.

"Leo generates much more income than the money he costs," Joan Laporta, who is seeking to regain the presidency, told Rac1 radio.

"We have done a study and he generates a third of Barca's total income.

"It's not only the economic return," Laporta said. "But also the emotional and sporting return, and the vivid moments he gives us."

Messi is in the last year of his contract. On Sunday, under the headline "the colossal contract that ruins Barcelona", El Mundo published details of the current deal, signed in 2017. It said Messi could have earned 555 million euros (\$674 million) by the time the deal expires.

Barcelona responded by saying it was not the source of the leak and it planned to sue El Mundo. The club did not, however,

DeAndre' Bembry and Terence Davis had 12 points each, Yuta Watanabe added 11 points while Aron Baynes had eight points and a season-best 16 rebounds.

It was the third straight loss for the Magic, who have won twice in their past 13 games. Cole Anthony had 16 points and Nikola Vucevic had 15 points and 14 rebounds for the Magic. Aaron Gordon had 14 points before leaving the game with a left-ankle sprain with 1:14 to play in the third quarter and did not return.

Her 30th victory on the World Cup circuit, 16 of them having come in super-G, was the perfect warm-up ahead of the February 8-21 world ski championships in the Italian resort of Cortina d'Ampezzo.

Slovakia's Petra Vlhova was an impressive second, at 0.28sec, to consolidate her spot atop the overall World Cup standings.

Vlhova has now amassed 989 points, 42 ahead of Gut-Behrami, with another Swiss, Michelle Gisin, in third (807).

Gisin could only manage 11th in the super-G as Austrian Tamara Tippler (+0.74) rounded out the podium.

There was no Sofia Goggia at the startgate, however, the in-form Italian having suffered a season-ending knee injury after a fall on Sunday, sustained while descending the slope after the scheduled super-G race was cancelled because of fog.



ONDON (Dispatches) - World number Lthree and US Open champion Dominic Thiem admitted Monday it will be tough to match his breakthrough year in 2020, but he plans to give it his best shot.

The Austrian finally cracked the big time when he produced a historic comeback to

beat Alexander Zverev in a nervy five-setter and win at Flushing Meadow. It followed three previous defeats in finals of tennis majors, including at the Australian Open last year when he lost a gripping clash with Novak Djokovic.

Back in Melbourne for the build-up to next week's opening Grand Slam of the year, he said he was feeling ready, but cautioned that nothing was guaranteed. "Of course, I will try to repeat the success of 2020, and also 2019 (when he made the French Open final)," he said.

"There were amazing years. But there's never a guarantee for that.

- "I mean, in a Grand Slam tournament or ATP Cup, all the big tournaments, the whole draw is super strong, so never a guarantee to go deep or to win a title.
- "I'll try everything to do it. I had, again, quite a good preparation. So I'll try to have a good start at the ATP Cup, then also in the Australian Open.'

The 27-year-old is in Australia without coach Nicolas Massu, who tested positive for coronavirus before they left, with his father Wolfgang taking over the duties.

Thiem senior is also captain of the Austria ATP Cup team, where his son opens his season with a tough match against Italian world number 10 Matteo Berrettini.

"Our head-to-head is tied 2-2. Towards the end of 2019 we had three amazing matches in deep stages of big tournaments, high quality," said Thiem of Berrettini.

"Looking forward to play him again. We have a very good relationship, always fun matches against each other.

## Moutet Upsets Tiafoe, **Gasquet Crashes**

MELBOURNE (AFP) - France's Corentin Moutet burnished his credentials with a battling come-from-behind win over American Frances Tiafoe, but his veteran compatriot Richard Gasquet crashed at the first hurdle as the ATP Tour resumed Monday.



NextGen star Moutet, 21, posted a career-best result when he stormed into the final of the Qatar Open as a qualifier last year, finishing runner-up to Russian world number eight Andrey Rublev. And he started 2021 well, ousting 2019 Australian Open quarter-finalist Tiafoe 3-6, 6-4, 6-4 in the Murray River Open, one of two ATP events being run concurrently at Melbourne Park ahead of next week's Australian Open.

"It was so nice to play a match," Moutet said.

"It was a long time since I've played, especially in front of people. It wasn't an easy one, because I had to play against a tough opponent who is a great player. A tough match, but definitely a lot of pleasure."

But 14th seed Gasquet didn't fare as well, crashing to 194th ranked American Mackenzie McDonald 7-6 (7/2), 7-5. Fellow American Tommy Paul, the 15th seed, was another winner, motoring past Briton Cameron Norrie in three sets.

Top seeds Stan Wawrinka and Grigor Dimitrov had byes into the second round. Slovenian 13th seed Aljaz Bedene and big-serving South African Kevin Anderson were among the winners in the Great Ocean Road Classic.

The biggest names in the game, including Novak Djokovic and Rafael Nadal, are playing the ATP Cup teams event, which gets underway in Melbourne.

## Rio de Janeiro **Gives Up F1 Chase**

RIO DE JANEIRO (AFP) - Rio de Janeiro has given up its controversial bid to build a new Formula One race track and steal Brazil's Grand Prix race away from Sao Paulo, officials said Monday.



Rio, Brazil's second city, had hoped to leverage its beaches, nightlife and glamor to wrest the high-profile race away from the concrete jungle of Sao Paulo, the country's economic capital. But the project to build a race track in the Camboata forest -- backed by far-right President Jair Bolsonaro and ex-mayor Marcelo Crivella, his ally -- triggered an outcry over its environmental impact. New centrist Mayor Eduardo Paes, who took office on January 1, lost little time scrapping the plan, which had already run into delays after a series of negative environmental impact reports.

"We need to be talking about recovering green spaces, not destroying them," said city hall, announcing it had instructed the Rio de Janeiro state environmental institute (Ipea) to shelve the permitting process for the race track.

It highlighted that the Camboata forest, on the city's west side, is home to hundreds of species, including 14 threatened plant species.

The decision all but kills Rio's bid to regain the Brazilian F1 leg, which it last hosted in 1989. "This process was being led by city hall, and we are now formally saying we will not be

pursuing it further," a city official told AFP. Formula One officials had already signed a deal in December extending their contract with Sao Paulo's Interlagos race track until 2025.

That was taken as a win for Bolsonaro's arch-rival, Sao Paulo Governor Joao Doria, and a blow for the president, who had talked of bringing the Grand Prix back to Rio, his hometown, starting with the 2020 race -- which in the event was suspended anyway because of the coronavirus pandemic.
