Iran Non-Oil Export Hits 46% Growth

TEHRAN (MNA) – President of the Islamic Republic of Iran Customs Administration (IRICA) said that the country exported \$5.6 billion worth of non-oil goods and commodities to foreign countries from March 21 to May 15, 2021. Speaking at 23rd meeting of Representatives Board of Tehran Chamber of Commerce, Industries, Mines and Agriculture (TCCIMA) on Tue., Mehdi Mir-Ashrafi said that Islamic Republic of Iran imported 4.5 million tons of products, valued at \$5.6 billion, since the beginning of the current year (started March 21) up to May 15, showing a 28 percent hike as compared to the last year's corresponding period.

Some 15.5 million tons of non-oil goods, valued at \$5.6 billion, was exported from the country from March 21 to May 15, 2021, registering a 46 percent growth as compared to the same period of last year, Mir-Ashrafi reiterated. According to the statistics, totally 145.7 million tons of non-oil goods, valued at \$73 billion, were exported and

imported from/to the country last year (from March 21, 2020 to March 20, 2021), IRICA president added. He went on to say that 10,343,000 tons of commodities, valued at \$5.762 billion, were exchanged between Iran and its trader partner in the first Iranian month of Farvardin in the current year (from March 21 to April 20), showing a 32 and 62.5 percent hike both in terms of weight and value respectively.

Electricity Projects Worth \$80m Open in 3 Provinces

TEHRAN (MNA) - Energy Minister Reza Ardakanian inaugurated 10 electricity projects worth 3.36 trillion rials (\$80 million) in 10 provinces on Tuesday, in the seventh week of the ministry's A-B-Iran program in the current Iranian calendar year (started on March 21).

The said projects were put into operation in Fars, Kerman, and Kermanshah provinces through video conference, IRIB reported. Two solar power plants, some substations, and improvement and development of electricity network facilities were among the inaugurated projects.



Experience By: Hamid Reza Naghashian Can You Believe the U.S. Really Leaving Afghanistan?

In the news and among the reports, every day we hear that the U.S. is determined to withdraw its troops from Afghanistan and at the same time the U.S. statesmen warn against the violence and insecurity in this Asian country but can anyone believe the U.S. troops' withdrawal from Afghanistan?

Now this time President Joe Biden is pledging again that the country is set to end its longest war in history by September the 11th. He has claimed, "I'm now the fourth, United States president to preside over American troop presence in Afghanistan, two Republicans, two Democrats. I will not pass this responsibility onto a fifth. The Afghans have the right and responsibility to lead their country. And that more and endless American military force could not create or sustain a durable Afghan government."

Butthis is not the first time that Biden is making such a promise. And since former President George W. Bush launched the war, back in 2001, all American leaders have announced a soon-to-happen full withdrawal.

The Afghans, like other nations in the region, have been suffering the consequences and impact of the brutal U.S. presence for almost two decades now. Despite the Americans' claim of bringing security and peace, the Americans have not fulfilled their responsibility to Afghanistan, their responsibilities to ensure a strong government, the rule of law and democracy in Afghanistan, and ensure that people's concerns relayed from terrorism, drugs, intervention by other countries. Speaking at the event, Ardakanian said the government plans to inaugurate 290 water,

electricity, and sewage projects by the end of the current Iranian year (March 20, 2021).

"Since the beginning of the 1400 year (March 20, 2021), 35 projects worth 8000 billion Tomans have been put into operation so far, and we hope that these projects will be completed by the end of the year," he added. These projects include 4 reservoir dams, several thermal and renewable power plants, treatment plants, and water supply projects to rural areas.

He said the private sector had played an important role in investing in these projects.

Of the projects, four belong to Kerman province, three projects to Kermanshah province, and three projects to Fars province.

In Kerman province, four electricity projects worth 170 billion Tomans, and two solar power plants with an investment of 15 billion Tomans, including the 132 kV substation in Rigan County, were inaugurated.

Also, three electricity projects in Fars province with a credit of 130 billion Tomans were put into operation. Another three projects were inaugurated in Kermanshah province with a credit of 36 billion Tomans, which will add 450 MW to the country's electricity network.

The first phase of the A-B-Iran program (the acronyms A and B stand for water and electricity in Persian) was initiated in the Iranian calendar year 1398 (ended on March 20, 2020).

During the first phase, 220 major projects with a total investment of 335.6 trillion rials were put into operation across the country.

In the second phase of the program that was carried out in the previous Iranian calendar year (ended on March 20), 250 water and energy projects worth 500 trillion rials were inaugurated.

The third phase of the program was officially started in early April and like the previous phases, the Energy Ministry is planning to inaugurate numerous water and electricity projects in various provinces every week.

TEHRAN - Russian customs statistics show that the country's exports to Iran increased by 50 percent in the first quarter of this year compared to the same period last year.

Russia exported more than \$614 million to Iran in the first three months of the year. Russian imports from Iran also increased by 14 percent in the first quarter of this year compared to the same period last year, reaching \$290 million. Thus, Russia's exports to Iran have more than doubled its imports from the country.

Last year, the two countries had more than \$2.2 billion in bilateral trade, six percent more than in 2019: one-third of that was the share of Iran's exports to Russia and two-thirds of that share of Russian exports to Iran.

Despite the increase in Trade between Iran and Russia over the past two years, Iran still has a half-percent share in Russia's total foreign trade.

Russia exported \$92 billion in the first quarter of this year and imported \$62 billion. One-third of Russia's foreign trade was with the European Union, one-third with OECD countries, including China. China alone has an 18 percent share in Russia's total foreign trade.

MPs Underline Lifting Sanctions as Iran Definite Policy

Global Conscience Awakened Against Pervaded Barbarism in 21st Century

TEHRAN (IP) - Government Spokesman said that the global conscience has awakened against the pervaded barbarism in the 21st century.

Ali Rabiee, in his weekly presser on Tuesday, said that these days in Palestine, the sky is lead in the morning and orange at night, adding that the Israeli Regime, regardless of the most basic principles, treaties, and resolutions of the world, is committing its crimes against the oppressed people of Palestine in a shameful and oppressive way.

"Once again, the Palestinian issue has become a global moral dynamic," he stated. Rabiee added: "Today we see that the voice of support for justice and freedom of the Palestinian people is heard from five continents of the world. Today, as the global conscience has wakened against this pervaded barbarism in the 21st century, we continue to stand by the Palestinian people in support of this global cause and to uphold the rights of these oppressed peoples in accordance with international law and norms.'

The spokesman also called on the nations and the competent international community to unite against the shameful apartheid of the Israeli regime.

In another part of his speech, he said that the issue of purchasing the vaccine and importing it from all countries and companies is possible, and supporting domestic production of the vaccine has been discussed in the last few meetings of the government's economic headquarters in the presence of the Minister of Health.

Rabiee stated: "Fortunately, with the pursuit of all members of the government and the unremitting efforts of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, in addition to the close cooperation of the Central Bank and with the pursuit of the Ministry of Health today, we have achieved promising and reliable results.'

He said: "Today I announce that the government has transparently and fairly followed the vaccination of age groups with a specified priority and has arranged the facilities for its implementation," adding: "The government in order to implement health justice, from the very first days dealt with some abuses seriously, and today the vaccination program is being followed transparently and fairly, and this process will continue until the very end."

The government spokesman added: "Today, I am pleased to announce that with the measures that have been considered, about 15 million elderly people and people at risk will be vaccinated soon."

Rabiee said: "The collective efforts of the government have created an order that the process of import and domestic production in several centers in the coming months, will be such that all Iranians no longer have to worry about vaccination. This is the commitment of the government to the people, and certainly, the future government, taking advantage of these achievements, will continue this process with the created infrastructure.'

He underlined: "All this happened in a situation where we were facing the most severe sanctions and economic war."

The government spokesman said that the statistics of the five countries with the highest rate of vaccination in the world show that these countries are the manufacturers of vaccines, adding: "This fact shows that Iran's investment in producing vaccines domestically has been correct and strategic. With the mass production of Iranian vaccines, which will soon be included in the general vaccination program, Iran will become one of the countries in the world with the highest rate of vaccine injection."

Foreign Actors Do Not Guarantee Security, Rights of Nations

TEHRAN (IP) - Iran's Secretary of High Council for Human Rights said rental security provided by foreign actors could not guarantee the security and rights of nations.

With regards to the presence of ISIS in Iraq and Syria, he noted that the clearance of the country from ISIS terrorists was the fruit of domestic security formed based on Islamic resistance discourse.

Conditions for Presidential Candidates "Transparent"

TEHRAN (IP) - The secretary of the Guardian Council about the examination of the qualifications of the presidential candidates said that we only act according to the law, and the law determines the conditions of the presidential candidates.

"The candidate for the presidential election must be a manager, tactician, and pious," Ayatollah Ahmad Jannati, pointed out.

Emphasizing that the condition of piety is one of the main criteria in examining the qualifications of presidential candidates, the secretary of the Guardian Council said: "A person who has piety means that he fulfills all the duties and does nothing else."

In the end, Ayatollah Jannati said: "People should know that we are carrying a heavy burden. Examining a person whose eligibility is confirmed means that a person is religious and performs his religious duties and does not commit sins."

Zionist Atrocities Not To Go Unanswered



(IRNA) - Judiciary Chief TEHRAN Hojjatoleslam Ebrahim Raeisi on Monday condemned the Zionist brutalities against "the defenseless people of Gaza", saying such atrocities will not go unanswered.

"The worrying news of the plight of the Palestinian people hurts the heart of every viewer and listener," Raeisi said.

The senior official said that the killing of the women and children, as well as destroying the buildings, especially in the most populated areas, once again proved the inaction of the UN Security Council and other international organizations in the face of the Palestinian issue.

This bitter incident has disappo pinted the Palestinian people from the so-called human rights organizations more than ever, Raeisi said, adding that the U.S. and other Western countries will never take a step to restore the lost rights of the Palestinians. The Judiciary chief said that those countries that gave the occupying regime of Israel a virtual legitimacy by seeking to normalize relations with this regime, certainly are accomplices in the killing of innocent Palestinian children and women.

Iran Urges preparing Tehran-Rome Ties to Enter New Era

TEHRAN (MNA) - Iranian Foreign minister called for getting the required preparations to enter a new era in Tehran-Rome ties.

Mohammad Javad Zarif met and held talks with the President of the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Italian Senate Vito Rosario Petrocelli. The two sides met in Rome on Tue.

During the meeting, Zarif called for the removal of existing barriers and the preparation of relations for entering a new era of economic cooperation.

Referring to the 160-year-old relations between the two governments, he made a positive assessment of the areas of cooperation with Italy, especially in the economic sector and cooperation between the small and medium-sized companies of the two sides.

Elsewhere, in his remarks, Zarif pointed to the dangerous regional situation caused by the actions of the Zionist regime and condemned the hostile measures against the Palestinian people.

He also stressed the importance of political and parliamentary relations between Iran and Italy.

The Foreign Minister also explained the views of the Islamic Republic of Iran on the situation in Yemen and Afghanistan. NIOC Welcomes Foreign Investors

TEHRAN (Shana) – A senior official with the National Iranian Oil Company (NIOC) voiced the company's keenness to welcome foreign investors in Iran's oil and gas projects.

Speaking to Shana, the Deputy NIOC CEO for Development and Engineering Affairs, Reza Dehghan, said Farzad "B" Field will be developed by the Iranian company Petropars, but the National Iranian Oil Company always welcomes the presence of foreign investors along with Iranian contractors.

"The negotiations with the Indian side for the development of this field took more than a decade and Iran tapped all its available capacities to complete these negotiations, but despite long and numerous rounds of talks and showing great flexibility on the part of the National Iranian Oil Company, the negotiations did not come to fruition," he said.

He added: "Since procrastination in joint fields is not allowed, the National Iranian Oil Company decided to determine the fate of this field by handing it over to one of the Iranian exploration and production companies, and this was in line with the head of agreement (HOA) for developing the field that was signed last year with the Petropars Group."

The official further said that NIOC would welcome presence of foreign investors in its projects, "and the Indian side can act as a partner of Petropars in this project if it seeks cooperation."



On Monday, the National Iranian Oil Company (NIOC) signed a contract worth \$1.78 billion with Petropars Group for the development of Farzad B Gas Field in the Persian Gulf.

The deal was signed in a ceremony held in the presence of Iranian Minister of Petroleum Bijan Zangeneh in Tehran.

Mohammad Meshkinfam, the CEO of Pars Oil and Gas Company, on behalf of the National Iranian Oil Company, and Hamid Reza Masoudi, the CEO of Petropars Group, signed the document.

The purpose of this buyback contract is to achieve a daily production of 28 million cubic meters of sour gas over five years.

How many people have received services since the day the charity was launched?

350,000 people are currently receiving services. Many have Preceived services and some have become self-sufficient and gone. Most of them are women heads of households. Some of the men under cover are incurable. We give dowry to some grooms. But 70% of the population we cover is female-headed.

What help is given to these people?

Wherever there is a representative on our behalf, it should be Wabout every loved one who comes; Do research. That's why we have a research team. They do the research first. Then the service begins. In the case of incurable patients, we have treatment branches. For example, in Tehran, we have 20 treatment branches that treat incurable patients from different provinces and receive accommodation and medical services, medicine and treatment, surgery, transportation, and return to their hometown.About students, we pay for school and bags and shoes and accessories. We tell the benefactors to use any guild you have for service. For example, we have a philanthropist whose job is facilities and he says I have no money to pay. We say no problem, you can use your art and industry to help the needy. work. Some benefactors come with us to different provinces and attend. The main task of this committee is to hold coordination and meetings with philanthropists and charities. The principle of our work is to network the benefactors of the country.

How did you select and recruit your co-workers?

Most troops volunteer. That is, they work as a dedication to their time. Most of our troops are young. For example, in a family, an educated person, we attracted him, which is a kind of job creation. The International Cascade of Emotions Charitable Foundation is the largest social entrepreneurship. Of course, we pay for those who do not devote time. In addition, we create jobs for families and heads of households, and we have many trainings such as carpet weaving or sewing. In some provinces, they produce handicrafts and even some foodstuffs such as saffron and honey, and we buy this and put it in a support basket. This creates a cycle of product production by clients and their self-sufficiency and the return of social assistance to the target community.

What is the future plan of the Abshar-Atefeh to increase assistance to the target community?

Since 1998, the Abshar-Atefeh has become an international title. That means we can have representation in other countries. For example, we can have a representative office in Oman or Turkey. This will attract Iranian philanthropists living in other countries. The principle of our program for other countries is to be able to attract the aid of Iranians living abroad or to provide the Iranian experience to those countries. Currently, 2% of our philanthropists are abroad and we expect this number to reach 20%.



What have you done about your media activities?

All over the country, each of our agencies has a site. When you do a Google search for the Abshar-Atefeh, all the agencies are visible. We report the number of goods and aid paid on a monthly basis. We even have philanthropists who come in person and file and deposit money directly into the accounts of female-headed households or orphans or the incurably ill. Do only women work with you?

Out of 7800 staff of Abshar-Atefeh, only 50 are men and the rest are women. Most families are women heads of households, and certainly a woman can talk to a woman better, and in many cases it is easier to help. We have more than 420,000 benefactors who are regular supporters of the collection, who help from one thousand tomans to the donation of 100 refrigerators and stoves, and every month we deliver the donations of the benefactors to the covered population.

What groups of clients does your assistance focus on?

Most of the benefactors of this collection insist that something be done for young couples. We also receive services from 350,000 clients from orphan families, female-headed households, prisoner families and young couples. Every year, about 10,000 young couples benefit from dowry and other services of the collection. In three steps, we make the brides of the house of Hazrat Ghaem (AS), the birth of Hazrat Zahra (AS) and the birth of Imam Reza (AS) lucky, and Dowry is given before that. They receive 14

Do you have any plans for less prosperous provinces, such as Khuzestan or Sistan and Baluchestan?

Since the beginning of the Corona debate and the Supreme Leader's remarks on the Relief Relief Exercise, we have had 14 Relief Relief Exercises in each province. We have a license from the Ministry of Interior, and this ministry has introduced the Abshar-Atefeh as the National Committee for Social Support throughout the country. In March 1999, Khuzestan turned red several times in terms of corona and people faced living problems. All benefactors and branches of Abshar-Atefeh were mobilized and about 20,000 support packages of living basket worth 12 billion Tomans were sent to Khuzestan.

What support program is being implemented in Hormozgan?

The Abshar-Atefeh has had jihadist conferences for several years. These conferences are held 3-4 times a year in less privileged provinces. Can you get help from government agencies and go to charity?

We like synergy. We do not expect the Friday prayer leader of a city to pay, but we expect him to promote us behind the podium if he believes in the transparency and goodness of the Abshar-Atefeh. The foundation of charity is the people of the institution, and the foundation of the non-governmental organization cannot take money from the government, but if there is spiritual synergy and the executive apparatus helps, this good deed will be achieved better and we will provide more services to deprived families.

So far, we have had good synergies in radio and television, various news agencies and media. Inviting philanthropists is also in the direction of transparency when we deliver the goods to the client. In Lorestan, the Friday prayer leader and our representative went to 800 clients' houses and delivered the donated goods themselves. We have transparency in the form of tracts, banners, media news and maneuvers in the cities,

Etihad Airways Suspends Flights to Israel

ABU DHABI (Dispatches) -The UAE's national carrier Etihad Airways announced Monday it was temporarily suspending flights to Israel where the main airport near Tel Aviv has come under rocket fire from Gaza.

The United Arab Emirates normalized ties with Israel last year in a U.S.-brokered deal, making it the third Arab nation to do so after Egypt and Jordan. Bahrain, Morocco and Sudan subsequently followed suit.

"Etihad Airways has temporarily suspended passenger services to Tel Aviv in response to the ongoing conflict," the Abu Dhabi-based carrier said in a statement. "Etihad is monitoring the situation in Israel and continues to maintain close contact with authorities and security intelligence providers."

U.S. Blocks Third Draft UN Statement on Mideast Violence



NEW YORK (Dispatches) - The United States on Monday blocked -- for the third time in a week -- the adoption of a joint UN Security Council statement calling for a halt to Israeli-Palestinian violence and the protection of civilians, diplomats said.

The text drafted by China, Tunisia and Norway was submitted late Sunday for approval Monday by the Council's 15 members, as Israeli jets continued to pound the Gaza Strip and the death toll from a week of violence passed 200. The United States indicated that they "could not currently support an expression" by the Security Council, one diplomat told AFP.

The text, obtained by AFP, called for "de-escalation of the situation, cessation of violence and respect for international humanitarian law, including the protection of civilians, especially children.'

It voiced the Council's "grave concern" at the Gaza crisis and its "serious concern" regarding the possible eviction of Palestinian families from their homes in East Jerusalem, opposing "unilateral actions" likely to further escalate tensions.

The draft also welcomed international efforts to de-escalate the situation, without reference to the United States, and reiterated the Council's support for a negotiated two-state solution allowing Israelis and Palestinians to "live side by side in peace within secure and recognized borders.'

UN spokesman Stephane Dujarric underlined the importance of taking a consolidated position on the conflict.

"I would really restate the need for a very strong and unified voice from the Security Council, which we think will carry weight," he told a press conference.

The UN General Assembly will hold an in-person debate on the Israeli-Palestinian clashes at 1400 GMT on Thursday, assembly spokesman Brenden Varma said. The Security Council has held three emergency meetings on the escalating violence in the past week, the latest on Sunday, without reaching a common position -- with Israel's main ally the United States accused of obstructionism. President Joe Biden's administration has insisted that it is working behind the scenes, including through a visit to the region by an envoy, and that a UN statement could backfire, according to diplomats. At a news conference in Copenhagen on Monday, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken urged Israel and Palestinians to "protect civilians, especially children" -- and defended Washington's move to block a UN Security Council statement calling for an end to the hostilities. "We're not standing in the way of diplomacy," Blinken stressed. The U.S. refusal to endorse a joint Security Council statement has been met with disbelief by its allies.

Separatist Parties Agree on New Catalan Gov't

BARCELONA (AFP) - More than three months after regional elections, Catalonia's two main separatist parties said Monday they had reached agreement on forming a ruling coalition, heading off the looming threat of another vote.

Although the wealthy northeastern region's proindependence parties boosted their showing in the February 14 elections, the main factions were unable to agree on a government due to deep disagreements over strategy.

The pact between the leftist ERC and the hardline "Together for Catalonia" (JxC), which have ruled in a regional coalition since 2015, emerged ahead of a

May 26 deadline for appointing a new regional leader. "We have managed to avoid a repeat election that nobody wanted and to reach a good agreement on forming a strong, unified government," said ERC leader Pere Aragones, who will serve as president of the region of 7.8 million people. "We are beginning a new stage with this agreement on a pro-independence government... in which we can again move forward towards a Catalan republic," he told a news conference. This time around, the coalition will be led by ERC as it won one more seat than JxC in the election in which the separatist parties secured 52 percent of the vote, handing them 74 of the parliament's 135 seats.

Russia Partially Halts Punitive Twitter Slowdown

MOSCOW (Reuters) -Russia partially halted a punitive slowdown of Twitter on Monday after it deleted a large portion of content deemed illegal by Moscow, but warned other U.S. internet platforms to comply with local legislation or face similar penalties.

State communications watchdog Roskomnadzor has since March impeded the speed of Twitter for not removing banned content quickly enough, and threatened to block it entirely, part of a wider drive by Moscow to tighten its control over the internet. On Monday, however, the watchdog said it no longer planned to block the service and the slowdown would only remain on mobile devices.

Russia Warns West Against Arctic Encroachment Ahead of Talks

MOSCOW (AFP) - Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov on Monday warned Western countries against staking claims in the Arctic, as global warming makes the region more accessible and a site of global competition.

Lavrov's comments came ahead of a ministerial meeting of the Arctic Council that comprises Russia, the United States, Canada, Norway, Denmark, Sweden, Finland and Iceland on Wednesday and Thursday in Rejkavik. "It has been absolutely clear for everyone for a long time that this is our territory, this is our land," Lavrov said

at a press conference in Moscow.

"We are responsible for ensuring our Arctic coast is safe," he said.

As climate change makes the Arctic more accessible, global interest in the region's natural resources, its navigation routes and its strategic position has grown among members of the Arctic Council as well as China. President Vladimir Putin in recent years has made Russia's Arctic region a strategic priority and ordered investment in military

Biden Administration Approved \$735m Arms Sale to Israel

WASHINGTON (Dispatches) - President Joe Biden's administration approved the potential sale of \$735 million in precision-guided weapons to Israel, and congressional sources said on Monday that U.S. lawmakers were not expected to object to the deal despite violence between Israel and Palestinian militants.

Three congressional aides said Congress was officially notified of the intended commercial sale on May 5, as part of the regular review process before major foreign weapons sales agreements can go ahead.

The sale was first reported by the Washington Post.

Congress was informed of the planned sale in April, as part of the normal informal review process before of the formal notification on May 5. Under U.S. law, the formal notification opens up a 15-day window for Congress to object to the sale, which is not expected despite the ongoing violence. The sale of Joint Direct Attack Munitions, or JDAMs, made by Boeing Co (BA.N), was considered routine at the time, before the start last week of the fiercest hostilities in the region in years. There were no objections at the time by the Democratic and Republican leaders of the congressional foreign affairs committees that review such sales, aides said.

Asked for comment, a State Department spokesperson noted that the department is restricted under federal law and regulations from publicly commenting on or confirming details of licensing activity related to direct commercial sales like the JDAMs agreement. "We remain deeply concerned about the current violence and are working towards achieving a sustainable calm," the spokesperson said. Strong support for Israel is a core value for both Democratic and Republican members of the U.S. Congress, despite calls from a few of the most progressive Democrats to take a ougher stance against the government of Israeli President Benjamin Netanyahu.

U.S. law allows Congress to object to weapons sales, but it is unlikely to do so in this case. Because Israel is among a handful of countries whose military

Bitcoin Hits 3-Month Low

LONDON (Reuters) -Bitcoin rallied from a three-month low on Monday in a volatile session that saw investors initially selling and then buying cryptocurrencies in the wake of Tesla boss Elon Musk's tweets about the carmaker's bitcoin holdings.

In his latest tweet, Musk said "Tesla has not sold any bitcoin". That seeming clarification came after weekend tweets hinted that Tesla was considering or may have already sold some of its massive holdings.

Musk has boosted crypto markets with his enthusiasm for the asset class, but has lately roiled trade by appearing to cool on bitcoin in favour of its one-time parody, dogecoin. The gyrations are beginning to spook even steeled traders.



China's Factory Output Slows as

China's Factory Output Slows as Bottlenecks Crimp Production

BEIJING (Reuters) -China's factories slowed their output growth in April and retail sales significantly missed expectations as officials warned of new problems affecting the recovery in the world's second-largest economy.

While China's exporters are enjoying strong demand, global supply chain bottlenecks and rising raw materials costs have weighed on production, cooling the blistering economic recovery from last year's COVID-19 slump.

Factory output grew 9.8% in April from a year ago, in line with forecasts but slower than the 14.1% surge in March, National Bureau of Statistics data showed on Monday. Retail sales, meanwhile, rose 17.7%, much weaker than a forecast 24.9% uptick and the 34.2% surge in March. NBS spokesman Fu Linghui said while China's economy showed a steady improvement in April, new problems are also emerging,

notably the rise in international commodity prices.

"The foundations for the domestic economic recovery are not yet secure," Fu told a news briefing in Beijing on Monday.

"For companies as a whole, price increases are conducive to the improvement of corporate efficiency, but the pressure on downstream industries needs to be paid attention to," he added. China's factory price inflation hit its highest pace since October 2017 in April. That could rise further in the second and third quarters, according to a report from the central bank last week.

The slower growth rates in the April activity indicators were also due in part due to the fading base effects as year-on-year comparisons rolled away from very sharp declines seen when the coronavirus shut down much of the country in early 2020. In the factory sector, motor vehicle production growth fell sharply to 6.8% from 69.8%, due in part to the base effect as well

as critical shortages of semiconductors used in car systems. Growth in the production of cement slowed in April, and coal production fell on year, although aluminium and crude steel output hit record highs, helped by firm demand.

"China's economy shows signs of unbalanced recovery: strong exports and domestic investment on one hand, but weak consumption on the other," said Zhiwei Zhang, chief economist at Pinpoint Asset Management, in a note.

Sectors related to travel, leisure and entertainment are large employers and still held back by COVID-19 uncertainty, he said. Home appliances sales growth dropped particularly sharply in April from the month before, falling from 38.9% growth on year in March to 6.1%, NBS data showed.

Julian Evans-Pritchard, senior China economist at Capital Economics, in a note said month-on-month retail sales growth fell well below its pre-pandemic pace. "Looking ahead, we think the rebound in consumption should gather pace again in the coming months as the labor market continues to tighten," he said.

China's economy expanded by a record 18.3% in the first quarter and many economists expect growth will exceed 8% this year.

Exports accelerated in April, thanks to strong demand for Chinese goods amid a brisk U.S. economic recovery and stalled factory production in other countries. However, April also saw factory activity slow amid supply bottlenecks and rising costs and policymakers have acknowledged some of the recent weaknesses seen in the economic recovery. Japan Economic Forecasts Cut Sharply

TOKYO (Dispatches) - Japan's economy is set to grow much slower than previously hoped this quarter, hobbled by extended emergency measures put in place to halt a rise in coronavirus infections, a Reuters poll showed.

It is likely to expand an annualized 1.7 percent this quarter, less than half the 4.7 percent projected last month, according to the poll of 33 economists conducted May 6-13.

Nearly all of the economists polled believe the government will compile an extra budget to support the world's third-largest economy, with 60 percent expecting it to come before the end of the third quarter.

A surge in infections due in part to new variants led to the government's decision to extend a state of emergency in Tokyo and three other areas until the end of the month and to expand it to two more prefectures, hitting consumer spending and broader activity.

"The pace of recovery appears to have been sluggish since the start of the year," said Yusuke Shimoda, senior economist at the Japan Research Institute.

"But it's hard to imagine Japan's economy will fall into a deep contraction as attempts to suppress people's movements have become less effective."

The economy likely shrank around 4.5 percent on an annualized basis in the

first quarter, the poll showed. Preliminary GDP data is due on Tuesday. For the full year, expectations have been revised down to a 3.6 percent growth

from 3.9 percent, with economists also noting the slow pace of Japan's vaccination program compared to other countries. For the next fiscal year, economists expect on average 2.4 percent growth.

"The vaccine rollout is pretty awful if you look at it from a global context. It's far behind that in Europe," said Takumi Tsunoda, senior economist at Shinkin Central Bank Research Institute.

Japan has inoculated just 3 percent of its population, the lowest rate among the Group of Seven nations.

Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga has faced growing calls from lawmakers, including ruling party heavyweight Toshihiro Nikai, to increase spending to support the economy. But he has so far expressed caution due to Japan's huge public debt and as the government has already compiled three pandemic-specific packages worth a combined \$3 trillion.

Projections for the size of the economic package showed 12 economists expect it to range between 5 trillion yen to 10 trillion yen (\$45 billion – \$90 billion), 11 expect a package of 10-20 trillion yen while nine forecast 5 trillion yen or less.

To organize the society's affairs either in the low executive level or in the macro level in the sense of policy-making and planning either in the development level which are raised as the strategic policies, all should be invited to participate in all of the three processes. "Regretfully, the tragic circumstances unfolding across geographies, an uncertain travel outlook, differing speeds of vaccination rollout and the uncertainty around new variants combine to make it impossible to realize a global meeting with business, government and civil society leaders from all over the world at the scale which was planned," the organization

said in a statement. The event, which brings together politicians and business leaders from around the world, had already been rescheduled twice and had been moved to Singapore from its usual location of Davos, Switzerland. The summer event had been planned for the middle of August.

WEF said that the meeting will instead take place in the first half of 2022, with a final location and date to be determined later this year. Klaus Schwab, the founder and executive chairman of WEF called it a difficult decision.

"Ultimately the health and safety of everyone concerned is our highest priority," he said in the statement.

Covid-19 cases in Singapore have climbed in the past few days. In a preliminary update on Monday, Singapore's health ministry said it confirmed an additional 21 locally transmitted infections, 11 of which were not linked to previous cases. That takes Singapore's cumulative Covid cases to more than 61,600 and 31 deaths, data by the health ministry showed.

France to Lend Sudan \$1.5b to Pay off IMF Debt

PARIS (Dispatches) - France will lend Sudan \$1.5 billion to help the African nation pay off its massive debt to the International Monetary Fund as it emerges from decades of authoritarian rule, Finance Minister Bruno Le Maire said Monday. "President Macron will confirm later today that France will provide the \$1.5 billion bridge loan to clear Sudan's arrears to



the IMF," Le Maire said at the opening of an international conference aimed at helping Sudan in its transition to democratic government.

Sudan's Prime Minister Abdalla Hamdok is attending the Paris conference, seeking help in paying off a \$60 billion foreign debt bill and also hoping to secure investment deals.

Hamdok is pushing to rebuild and reform a crippled economy and end Sudan's international isolation under former strongman Omar Al-Bashir, whose three decades of rule were marked by economic hardship and international sanctions.

"Re-building an attractive and resilient market takes time, but today, I hope we will convince private investors that the fundamentals for business are fully there," Le Maire said.

OPEC's Oil Exports Surging By 1m Bpd In May

LONDON (Dispatches) - OPEC's oil exports have jumped by 1 million barrels per day (bpd) so far in May, while the OPEC+ group started easing the production cuts by 350,000 bpd this month, tanker tracker Petro-Logistics said on Monday.

At the ministerial meeting in early April, the OPEC+ group decided to gradually return over 1 million bpd to the market between May and July. The OPEC+ collective oil production is set to rise by 350,000 bpd in both May and June and by more than 400,000 bpd in July. Additionally, Saudi Arabia will also gradually ease its extra unilateral cut of 1 million bpd over the course of the next few months, beginning with monthly production increases of 250,000 bpd in both May and June. Overall, OPEC+ is expected to return to the market as much as 2.1 million bpd by July.

The decision from early April signaled the confidence of the leaders of the OPEC+ alliance that the market would be able to absorb that much supply as vaccination programs are accelerating and people start traveling more. OPEC+ and all analysts expect global oil demand to rebound strongly in the second half of 2021 and nearly reach pre-crisis levels by the end of the fourth quarter this year.

Goldman Sachs said at the end of April that it expects global oil demand to realize "the biggest jump in oil demand ever" the next six months. The investment bank sees oil demand jumping by 5.2 million bpd over the next six months.

Despite the recent bearish concerns surrounding India's COVID crisis, OPEC, investment banks, and the International Energy Agency (IEA) are optimistic that global oil demand is set for a strong rise this year.



The excess oil inventories of the past year have been all but depleted, the IEA said last week, noting that "The widening supply and demand gap paves the way for a further easing of OPEC+ supply cuts or even sharper stock draws.'

COVID Crisis May **Delay Oil Offloading Operations In India**



NEW DELHI (Dispatches) - The alarming situation with the spread of the coronavirus in India has started to affect operations at some of India's ports, which could lead to delays in oil offloading and discharge of vessels and disrupt other trade operations.

The Karaikal port declared force majeure between May 10 and 24, saying its operations "are being severely affected" due to the full curfew in the state of Tamil Nadu. Karaikal operations, including but not limited to unloading, loading, receipt, and dispatches, are being affected, the port operator said in a notice this week. Disruption to port operations could affect oil and

other trade if the situation persists.

The port of Visakhapatnam is also seeing the disruption of cargo operations, with a force majeure until May 19, G. Veeramohan, president of the Vizagapatam Chamber of Commerce and Industry, told Bloomberg.

Indian state-run refiner Hindustan Petroleum Corporation uses Visakhapatnam for crude oil imports. The company's import operations are not affected because it uses an offshore facility for tanker unloading, Hindustan Petroleum's chairman Mukesh Kumar Surana told Bloomberg.

India continues to fight the COVID resurgence, with the infections now spreading to rural areas. Daily new cases are now below last week's peak of over 400,000, but on Friday the country reported a third consecutive day of more than 4,000 deaths.

Due to the COVID crisis, Indian fuel demand plunged by 9.4 percent in April compared to March, according to official data cited by Press Trust of India on Wednesday.

The slump in oil demand amid local lockdowns and curfews has been a concern to the market in recent weeks. Gasoline and diesel prices in India hit record ighs this week adding another concern ahout

UK Plastics Sent for Recycling in Turkey Dumped and Burned

ANKARA (Dispatches) Turkey has become the latest destination for British plastic waste, which ends up dumped, burned or left to pollute the ocean, a Greenpeace investigation has found. More than half of the plastic

the British government says

is being recycled are sent overseas, often to countries without the necessary infrastructure to do so. The UK exported 688,000 tons of discarded plastic packaging in 2020, a daily average of 1.8m kilos. Just 486,000 tons were recycled in the UK.

China was a key destination, but since it banned the import of many types of plastic in 2017, Turkey has emerged as the main receiver of British plastic waste. UK exports to the country increased from 12,000 tons in 2016 to 209,642 tons in 2020, about 30% of the UK's plastic waste exports.

Instead of being recycled, however, Greenpeace investigators in Turkey found plastic waste from leading supermarkets dumped, burned, piled into mountains and left to spill into rivers and the sea.

Greenpeace examined 10 locations around the southern Turkish city of Adana in March and published the data on Monday in its report, Trashed. It found plastic packaging from Tesco, Asda, Co-op, Aldi, Sainsbury's, Lidl and Marks & Spencer dumped, left in bags or burned. Plastic rubbish from retailers such as B&Q, Debenhams, Poundland and Spar was also found.

Plastic bags and packaging from the supermarkets as well as Lucozade and Fanta bottles were dumped in fields, near rivers, on train tracks and by the roadside, Greenpeace investigators found. In many cases the plastic had been burned. The waste was in bags piled high on top of each other, many of which were ripped open.

Other plastic waste was spilling into waterways and floating downstream. On the Mediterranean coast, investigators found more British plastic strewn across the beach, including the wrapping from a pack of Andrex toilet paper.

The British waste had been exported recently. It included a coronavirus antigen test and a packet with a use-by date of August 2021. Greenpeace is calling on the UK government to enact the



environment bill, and use the powers within it to ban all plastic waste exports. It wants to see an immediate ban on all plastic waste exports to countries that are not members of the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, such as

Malaysia, and on mixed plastic waste to OECD countries such as Turkey.

As well as the impact of pollution, Interpol said last year that the huge increase in plastic rubbish being sent to Turkey and other countries was causing an explosion in the illegal waste trade.

Nihan Temiz Ataş, the biodiversity projects lead at Greenpeace Mediterranean, who is based in Turkey, said: "As this new evidence shows, plastic waste coming from the UK to Turkey is an environmental threat, not an economic opportunity. Uncontrolled imports of plastic waste do nothing but increase the problems that exist in Turkey's own recycling system."

Other European countries have also chosen Turkey as the main receiver of their rubbish. About 241 lorryloads of plastic waste come to Turkey every day from across Europe, 20 times more than was imported in 2016.

UK and EU rules say that plastic waste should not be exported to countries unless it is going to be recycled. Turkey's recycling rate, however, is 12%, the lowest of any OECD member.

"As far as we can see from the data and the field, we continue to be Europe's largest plastic waste dump," said Ataş.

The Turkish government has imposed a crackdown on plastic waste imports, announcing a ban on imports of many types of plastic waste from January.

UK trade data, however, suggests the move has had little impact. The country sent more plastic waste to Turkey in January 2021 than it did in the same month last year, up from 12,400 to 14,500 tons. The figure for February 2021 was 30,300 tons, more than double the amount for the same month in 2020.

UK government trade data shows that Malaysia was the second destination for British plastic waste, receiving 65,000 tons in 2020, followed by Poland, which received 38,000 tons.

Russian Businesses Start Counting Cost of EU Carbon Border Tax

MOSCOW (Dispatches) - Russian companies stand to be among the biggest losers from the EU's proposed carbon tax on imports, prompting accusations of protectionism from Moscow.

The levy, known as the carbon border adjustment mechanism (CBAM) and designed to hit countries making insufficient efforts to combat climate change, would result in huge surcharges for Russian groups seeking to access the EU market, according to analysts and officials.

Estimates of the potential costs vary from \$3bn a year, according to the Russian natural resources ministry, to a KPMG forecast of about \$60bn between 2022 and 2030.

The European Commission is due to detail its proposals in July. Negotiations with the European parliament and member states could then take months, if not years, to conclude.

The tax would initially target a limited number of imports including iron, steel, cement and fertilisers, EU officials told the Financial Times, and would be based on the equivalent carbon price paid in Europe.

Brussels has stressed the CBAM will comply with World Trade Organization rules - whereby imported goods cannot be held to higher standards than those produced domestically — and will only apply to countries that do not match the EU's internal carbon pricing systems.

But as Europe's biggest supplier of carbon-intensive goods worth nearly €10bn in 2019, Russia is expected to be hit hardest. Alongside Turkey, it is one of just two G20 countries without a domestic carbon tax and no emissions trading system.

Moscow has accused the EU of using its climate policy to recoup financial losses inflicted by the pandemic.

"It appears that some of our partners cannot resist the temptation to instrumentalise the climate agenda for the benefit of their economies," said Artyom Bulatov, deputy head of the European co-operation department at Russia's foreign ministry, at a conference last month.

"We took note of the plans to use the CBAM as an additional source of income for the EU budget ... And frankly speaking it goes fully in line with protectionism in the trade sphere.

The recrimination comes as bilateral trade between the EU and Russia has dropped since Moscow's 2014 annexation of Crimea and the sanctions imposed by Brussels. Russia, long seen as an outsider in global climate action, stepped up when it joined the Paris agreement in 2019. But while the EU and U.S. have pledged to hit net zero by 2050, Russia's commitment to reduce its carbon footprint to 70 per cent of the 1990 level by 2030 effectively allows for an increase in emissions.

Speaking at a U.S.-hosted global climate summit in April, Russia's president Vladimir Putin vowed to "significantly" reduce accumulated net emissions by 2050. But for Europe this still falls short.

"Russia is not ambitious enough," said Laurent Bardon, head of the trade and economic section at the EU delegation to Russia. "There is indeed a risk that Russia and the EU would diverge, with the risk that it would become an irritant."

Meanwhile in Europe, the carbon price under the EU emissions trading system has soared to €50 a ton, leading to business calls for an urgent imposition of the border tax. EU companies argue they risk suffering the brunt of the bloc's climate-cutting targets, while those outside the EU are spared the costs of doing business in the single market.

OS ANGELES (Dispatches) - Stephen Curry scored a game-high 46 points en route to his second NBA scoring title and Jordan Poole stalled a rally with a late 3-pointer Sunday afternoon as the Golden State Warriors held off the visiting Memphis Grizzlies in San Francisco for a 113-101 win to claim the No. 8 position in this week's play-in tournament. With Curry scoring 17 of his 46 points, the Warriors appeared to take command of the game in the third quarter, but Dillon Brooks led a Memphis comeback. Before fouling out, Brooks contributed 13 points to a 22-5 flurry that made it 91 all with 6:32 still to play.

The Grizzlies went up by two twice after that, before Poole nailed his momentum-changing 3-pointer. The loss ended Memphis' five-game winning streak and landed the Grizzlies in the No. 9 spot in the play-in, where they will host 10th-seeded San Antonio on Wednesday.

Lakers 110, Pelicans 98

LeBron James scored 25 points as Los Angeles won in New Orleans on the final day of the regular season, but was unable to avoid the play-in round.

James left the game midway through the fourth quarter, slightly favoring the injured right ankle that sidelined him 26 games down the stretch.

But the victory wasn't enough for the defending NBA champions to avoid the Western Conference play-in tournament. Portland defeated Denver to claim the sixth seed so the seventh-seeded Lakers will host eighth-seeded Golden State in a play-in game Wednesday.

Jordan Clarkson scored 33 points and made six 3-pointers and Bojan Bogdanovic added 18 points to lead Utah past Sacramento and the league's best regular-season record. Zidane was asked again about his future after Madrid's 1-0 victory away at Athletic Bilbao on Sunday, a win that keeps them two points behind leaders Atletico Madrid heading into La Liga's final weekend.

According to Onda Cero radio and Goal online earlier on Sunday, Zidane, who has a contract until 2022, informed his squad a week ago that he was going to leave after the team's final game next weekend. But Zidane said in Sunday's post-match press conference that was not the case.

"How am I going to tell my players that I am going now? It's a lie," he said.

"I focus on this season. There is a game left and we are going to give everything. I only care what happens in this finale. The rest, we will see at the end of the season."

Former Juventus coach Massimiliano Allegri, ex-Madrid striker Raul Gonzalez and Joachim Loew, who will step down as Germany coach at the end of this summer's European Championships, have all been mentioned as possible successors.

Zidane hinted on Saturday he could leave, saying he believes "there comes a time when it's the moment to change".

"I don't leave because it's easy. It's not like I turn away and don't look back," Zidane said.

ROME (Dispatches) - Novak Djokovic admitted that he's "a long shot" to win Roland Garros where he would likely have to dethrone rival and 13-time Paris champion Rafael Nadal. Djokovic may be world number one, but it's Nadal who is the undisputed king of clay in the French capital where he has lost just twice in 102 matches since 2005.

On Sunday, Djokovic again felt the full, raw power of Nadal on clay as the Spaniard clinched a 10th Italian Open title with a 7-5, 1-6, 6-3 win in the final.

In the pair's 57th meeting, the victory also took Nadal level with his Serb rival on 36 Masters 1000 titles.

"Going into Paris brings me a good sensation," insisted Djokovic despite a roller-coaster

clay court swing which yielded a round-of-16 exit in Monte Carlo and a semi-final loss on home ground in Belgrade.

Nadal, by comparison, has two titles in Rome and Barcelona but sobering quarter-final losses in Monte Carlo and Madrid.

"I actually now started to feel like I actually want to feel on clay," added Djokovic.

"So I think if I manage to play the way I played last night (against Lorenzo Sonego in a three-set semi-final) and today, I think I have a good chance to go all the way in Paris. "Of course it's a long shot."

Djokovic has 18 Grand Slam titles to his name -- two behind the record of 20 shared by Nadal and Roger Federer.

However, only one of those has been captured at Roland Garros, in 2016 when Nadal withdrew with a wrist injury after the second round.

Djokovic was swept aside by Nadal in the 2020 final.

German FA Chief Resigns Over Nazi Comment

BERLIN (Dispatches) - Departing German FA president (DFB) Fritz Keller said the association "must change" on Monday as he officially resigned over comments he made comparing his deputy to a notorious Nazi-era judge.

"I am giving up my position as president so the DFB can make a far-reaching and necessary new start," said Keller in a lengthy statement on the federation's website, after announcing his plan to step down last week.

While accepting "personal responsibility" for his controversial comments, the departing president also slammed the "desolate leadership situation" at the scandal-hit federation and called for wide-reaching reforms.

"The DFB has to change. It has to win back its credibility and trust in its integrity," he said, adding that his resignation alone would "not solve the problems inside football and the DFB". Keller sparked outrage and calls for his resignation after likening DFB vice-president Rainer Koch to Roland Freisler, the infamous head of the Nazi party's court in the 1940s, during a meeting last month. The 64-year-old later apologized to Koch, acknowledging that his words were "totally inappropriate, notably towards the victims of Nazism", and officially stepped down Monday after facing a DFB tribunal to explain his comments. The scandal also exposed what appeared to be a fierce power struggle between Keller and his deputies at a federation which has lurched from crisis to crisis in recent years.



Federer Expects Battle to Get Back to the Top

BERLIN (Dispatches) - Roger Federer said Monday he expects to return to the top tier of tennis even though the next generation of players will have gained ground during his lengthy injury lay-off.



Federer begins his comeback-proper on Swiss home soil in Geneva on Tuesday, with the 39-year-old tennis legend starting a run of tournaments including the French Open, Halle, Wimbledon and then the Tokyo Olympics.

Federer returned to the courts in March, having been out for more than a year following two knee surgeries, winning his first match in Qatar before losing his second.

Doha was his first appearance since January 2020 and an Australian Open semi-final defeat to Novak Djokovic. "I'm just concerned about where my game is at. The guys on tour are all in a good rhythm. The level that everybody is producing in great. I want to achieve that as well again," Federer told reporters.

His old rivals Djokovic and Rafael Nadal played out a two-hour 49-minute final in Rome on Sunday, with Nadal claiming a 7-5, 1-6, 6-3 victory to match the Serbian world number one's record of 36 Masters 1000 series titles.

"I'm excited about the comeback, that's what my focus needs to be on and not about trying to be at the same level as Rafa and Novak right now," Federer said.

But the 20-time Grand Slam title winner added: "I believe I will be part of the top tier." Federer said he was impressed by the level of tennis on show during his absence from the tour.
