Grossi Remarks Distorted With Political Motivation

TEHRAN (MNA) - Reacting to allegations as IAEA chief's remarks were quoted by media on discovering uranium in unannounced centers in Iran, AEOI Spokesman said that Iran believes Grossi's remarks have been distorted for political purposes.

In reaction to the allegations raised by IAEA Chief Rafael Grossi regarding the discovery of uranium in unannounced locations in Iran and non-responding of Iran in the last few months, Behrouz Kamalvandi Spokesman for the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran said, "Yes, we have heard in the media."

Considering that these statements were strange and unexpected from IAEA Chief Grossi, he said, "We started verifying these statements on Tuesday and also asked Mr. Ghaebi, Iran's Permanent Envoy in IAEA to discuss this issue with Mr. Grossi and Massimo Aparo, Deputy Director General and Head of the Department of Safeguards."

Iran believes that IAEA Chief's remarks have been distorted for political purposes, Kamalvandi reiterated.

It is very unlikely that Director-General of IAEA has raised the issue that Iran does not cooperate with the IAEA, he added.

In line with the joint statement that was recently signed between IAEA Chief Grossi and Head of AEOI Mohammad Eslami on issues related to cooperation between Iran and IAEA, "we are cooperating with each other on relevant issues and evaluation should not be submitted by IAEA in this period."

Turning to the appropriate interaction between Iran and International Atomic Energy Agency, Kamalvandi emphasized that there is practically the necessary cooperation between Iran and IAEA and naturally, announcing any assessment by the IAEA Director General on the way of implementation of the statement is very early.

The AEOI spokesman Behrouz Kamalvandi said on April 16 that the new site in Natanz is a safer place against sabotage attacks than the previous TESA Karaj site for machines to produce centrifuges parts.

Russian Envoy Believes Restoring JCPOA Still Possible

MOSCOW (Dispatches) - There is still a chance to restore the Iran nuclear deal, but Tehran will insist on keeping its red lines, Russian Ambassador to Iran Levan Dzhagaryan said during a Rossiya-24 TV broadcast.

"There is always a chance, but the Iranians insist, and quite rightly so, that their red lines be respected,"

According to the diplomat, exchanges between Washington and Tehran are continuing, mediated by Brussels.

"One of the main stumbling blocks is the issue of Iran's insistence that the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps be removed from the sanctions list. Not just the corps itself as a whole, but some of its units, so that everything is considered in a comprehensive way," he added.

"And while there are no meetings on the Vienna platform yet, the exchange of messages between Washington and Tehran continues. As we understand it, [US President Joe] Biden's administration is under a lot of pressure. Not only from Republican opponents, but more and more Democrats are starting to oppose the restoration of the JCPOA," Dzhagaryan noted.

Iran insists that the nuclear talks must lead to the removal of all American sanctions that were imposed against Tehran following Washington's unilateral withdrawal from the landmark agreement in May 2018. Tehran has also demanded credible guarantees that Washington will not abandon the deal again.

Leader Tells Qatari Emir Regional Problems Solvable Through Dialogue

TEHRAN – Supreme Leader of the Islamic Revolution Ayatollah Seyyed Ali Khamenei says dialogue among regional countries is the best solution to the existing problems in the region, warning against foreign interference. Ayatollah Khamenei made the remarks in a Thursday meeting with the visiting Emir of Qatar Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani, during which the Leader called for increased political and economic cooperation between the two countries.

During the meeting, the Leader emphasized that regional problems can be solved through dialogue among regional countries without any interference of "foreign factors."

"The issues of Yemen and Syria can be also solved through dialogue. Of course, dialogue should not be undertaken from a weak position at a time that the opposite parties, mostly the United States and others, rely on military and financial power," the Leader said.

Ayatollah Khamenei stressed that management of the region does not need any meddling by foreign parties, adding, 'Wherever Zionists go, they foment corruption and can give no power or concession to [regional] countries."

"Therefore, we, as regional countries, must boost our relations as much as we can through common thinking and cooperation," Ayatollah Khamenei said.

Confirming the Qatari Emir's remarks in which he condemned the crimes committed by the Zionist regime, the Leader described decades-long oppression of the Palestinian people by "evil Zionists" as a bitter reality and a blow to the Islamic world and the Arab world.

"In the face of these crimes, the Islamic Republic of Iran expects the Arab world to take explicit political action," Ayatollah Khamenei noted.

Referring to Israeli forces' attacks on the restive Sheikh Jarrah neighborhood of the occupied Palestinian city of al-Quds, Ayatollah Khamenei said, "The support offered by some Arab countries to Palestinian people in that case did not even match up to [the support offered by] some European [countries] and they took no [decisive] position. Even now, they are still acting like that."

"If this approach taken by Arab countries is out of fear of the Zionist regime or having hopes in it, they must know that today, the occupying regime is in conditions that nobody can have hopes in or be afraid of it," the Leader said.

The Qatari Emir, for his part, said the crimes committed by the Zionist regime in Palestine are horrible and must be confronted by all regional countries.

Expressing regret over the Israeli killing of a Palestinian journalist on Wednesday, he said, "Zionists committed this crime in cold blood."

Iran Welcomes Local, Int'l Investors to Participate in its Oil Industry

Iran Monitoring All Enemy Moves Near Maritime Borders

TEHRAN (PressTV) - The commander of the Islamic Revolution Guards Corps (IRGC)'s Navy says the Islamic Republic is fully monitoring all moves by enemies near Iran's maritime borders and does not allow them to approach the country's territorial waters.

"There is complete security on the country's maritime borders and no danger is [currently] posed to them," Rear Admiral Ali Reza Tangsiri said on Thursday.

"We proudly declare that our territorial waters are today clear of any enemy" thanks to the efforts made by the country's armed forces. "The country's enemies do not have a presence in the vicinity of the waters that are under the supervision of the Islamic Republic and their activities are monitored at every single moment."

"Whenever the enemies move toward [Iran's] sea borders and are physically present there, they will be forced to retreat through the timely action of our forces," the senior IRGC commander pointed out.

The IRGC Navy commander said in December that the elite military force's large-scale military exercise, codenamed the Great Prophet 17, sent a warning to the enemies that the country will annihilate them before they can even get close to its southern islands in the Persian Gulf.

Iraq Strikes Deal With Iran to Secure Summer Gas Imports

BAGHDAD (Dispatches) - Iraq has agreed to pay \$1.6 billion in debt to Iran by June 1 to secure a steady gas supply for power generation through the summer, its electricity minister said.

Chronic underinvestment through decades of war and sanctions has left Iraq dependent on imports from its eastern neighbor for a third of its gas needs.

But U.S. sanctions on Iranian oil and gas have complicated Iraq's payments for the imports, leaving it in heavy arrears and prompting Iran to respond by periodically switching off the taps.

The result has been extended power cuts across much of the country, particularly during the summer, when temperatures routinely reach 52 degrees Celsius (126 degrees Fahrenheit) sending demand for refrigeration and air conditioning soaring.

"We have reached agreement on supply in sufficient quantities. We have agreed on 50 million cubic metres (per day) during the four summer months," acting electricity minister Adel Karim told state television late Wednesday.

During winter, Iraq will import between 10 million and 20 million cubic metres per day of Iranian gas, he added.

India, Uzbekistan Agree To Exploit Full Potential of Chabahar Port for Trade

NEW DELHI (Dispatches) - India and Uzbekistan agreed to exploit the full potential of the Chabahar port for trade between the two countries as they held extensive talks focusing on greater bilateral economic ties.

The two sides also agreed to take steps to enhance connectivity to boost trade during the 15th round of India-Uzbekistan Foreign Office Consultations that took place in Delhi.

"During the consultations, both sides undertook a comprehensive review of the state and prospects of bilateral cooperation including political, security, trade-economic, connectivity, development partnership, humanitarian and cultural spheres," the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said.

It said the talks particularly focused on greater economic cooperation and steps to enhance connectivity between India and Uzbekistan.

"Both sides agreed to exploit the full potential of Chabahar port for trade between the two countries," it said in a statement.

TEHRAN (PressTV) - Foreign Minister Hossein Amir-Abdollahian has told Lebanon's Culture Minister Mohammad Wissam al-Mortada that the people of the region will never brook normalization of relations with Israel.


He made the remarks in Tehran as the two ministers discussed the latest developments in the region, promotion of relations among the Islamic countries and especially development of cooperation between the two countries.

Amir-Abdollahian touched on the special place of Lebanon in Iran's foreign policy and the historical antiquity of good relations between the Iranian nation and all Lebanese groups and tribes.

He called the resistance of the Lebanese people against the continuous aggression of the Zionist regime a shining example for the nations of the region.

"Therefore, the resilient people of the region will never go under the burden of normalization with the terrorist and child-killing Israeli regime," the Iranian foreign minister added

Amir-Abdollahian touched on the difficult economic situation in Lebanon amid oppressive Western sanctions on the country, reiterating Tehran's readiness to upgrade



economic cooperation with Beirut if demanded by the Lebanese government and people. Western countries, led by the United States, have targeted the Lebanese economy with draconian sanctions with the aim of pressuring the government in Beirut to ostracize Hezbollah and cut it from the country's political and military landscape.

The resistance movement is a nemesis of the West and Israel for inflicting repeated defeats on their regional schemes, especially during two recent wars which shattered Tel Aviv's myth of invincibility.

Al-Mortada, for his part, hailed Iran's special place in the West Asian region, saying Beirut is ready to expand its relations with all friendly and brotherly regional countries, especially the Islamic Republic.

He touched on problems related to the livelihood and basic needs of the Lebanese people, stressing that the Lebanese government and nation, nonetheless, will act in the national interests of their country and will never wait for outside help or solutions.

Boosting Banking Cooperation to Facilitate Iran-Qatar Trade Ties

TEHRAN (MNA) – The development of banking and trade relations between Iran and Qatar can help facilitate relations between traders and investors of the two countries, Iranian First Vice President told the Emir of Qatar in Tehran.

Tehran, Yerevan Keen to Expand Bilateral Cooperation

TEHRAN - The 17th sitting of the Joint Intergovernmental Commission of the Republic of Armenia and the Islamic Republic of Iran was held in Yerevan under the co-chairmanship of Armenian Deputy Prime Minister Mher Grigoryan and the Minister of Energy of the Islamic Republic of Iran Ali Akbar Mehrabian.

A memorandum of understanding was signed as a result of the sitting.

"Bilateral relations with friendly Iran built on mutual respect and trust are of great importance for the Republic of Armenia, as Iran is not only a neighboring country, but also an important trade partner, a reliable and trustworthy partner for us. We must make joint efforts to fully realize the great potential of the relations between the two countries. It is obvious that the expansion of bilateral cooperation will have a positive impact on the friendly peoples of Armenia and Iran," Deputy Prime Minister Mher Grigoryan said in his opening remarks.

He stressed that the governments of the two countries show the necessary political will and consistency to develop interstate relations in various spheres.

"Given Iran's interest in integration with the Eurasian Economic Union, Armenia is constantly making efforts to promote this process, as well as to become a gateway for friendly Iran to the EAEU market. We reaffirm our readiness to ensure active cooperation with Iran in this direction," the Deputy PM added.

Referring to the bilateral cooperation, he highlighted the mutual agreements in the field of energy and transport, in particular, the extension of the gas-for-electricity contract, the implementation of the North-South quadrilateral energy link and the Persian Gulf-Black Sea international transport corridor. He noted that in the context of development of regional transport communications, establishment of the railway connection of the Republic of Armenia with the Islamic Republic of Iran is among the most important issues on the agenda.

Mher Grigoryan emphasized the fact that as a result of the work of expert groups, further guidelines for cooperation between the two countries in a number of areas have been developed. He stressed the bilateral willingness to develop cooperation in the fields of trade, industry, healthcare, education, culture, tourism, agriculture and high technologies.

Iran Welcomes Efforts to Strengthen Tehran-Brussels Ties

TEHRAN (IRNA) - President Ebrahim Raisi in a telephone conversation with Belgian Prime Minister Alexander De Croo said that Iran welcomes efforts to boost Tehran-Brussels ties.

President Raisi said that the two countries have developed their diplomatic relations based on the principles of mutual respect and mutual benefit, adding that the Islamic Republic of Iran welcomes efforts to strengthen and expand ties between Tehran and Brussels".

Italian Firms Keen on Trade With Iran

TABRIZ (IRNA) - Italian companies are very interested in trading with Iran and making investment in the country, that's according to Italian ambassador to Tehran, Giuseppe Perrone.

The Italian diplomat was speaking with members and head of the chamber of

commerce department in Tabriz, the capital city of East Azarbaijan Province, northwest Iran. He said that prior to sanctions imposed on Iran, Italy

ranked the first among European trade partners of the Islamic Republic, but now trade ties between the two countries have been impacted to a great extent because of those sanctions.

"Italian companies are keen to resume and increase

trade with Iran," Perrone stressed, adding that a number of Italian banks have kept interactions with Iranian banks despite the sanctions.

The Italian diplomat said that his embassy makes efforts to facilitate relations between companies of the two countries.

Perrone also said that his country is well-experienced



in manufacturing cars and industrial machinery, adding that Tabriz can have cooperation with Italian firms in this field.

Yunes Zha'ele, head of Tabriz Chamber of Commerce Department, referred to long-running trade relations between

Italian businessmen and their counterparts in the city, and said that Iranian tradesmen, including those in Tabriz are interested in expanding cooperation with Italy.

He agreed that sanctions on Iran's banking sector are currently hindering relations between the two countries.

The Iranian official added that trade relations between the two sides should be promoted, as it benefits Italy too. He said that East Azarbaijan province can play an active role in this regard.

Zha'ele explained that the province has good capacities to export energy-consuming goods, while Italy requires equipment whose production needs energy and is not cost-effective for Europe; therefore, he said, Italy can use capacities of East Azarbaijan province in this regard.

Iran-Cuba Joint Economic Commission to Be Held in Tehran

TEHRAN (IRNA) - Mehdi Safari, an Iranian Deputy Foreign Minister on Economic Diplomacy Affairs, said that the 18th Iran-Cuba Joint Economic Commission will be held in Tehran on May 15-17, 2022.

He said that Cuban Deputy Prime Minister Ricardo Cabrisas Ruiz is to visit Tehran at the head of an economic delegation in line with efforts to enhance bilateral relations between the two countries.

B2B meetings are also scheduled to be held between the main Iranian and Cuban companies on the sidelines of the Commission, the official said.

Some 21 technical committees in different areas, such as trade, investment, transit and transportation, electricity and energy, oil and gas, customs, banking and finance, health and so on are to convene as part of the Commission in Tehran.

The two sides will also reportedly sign documents on

pharmaceuticals, agriculture, customs, food industry and vaccine production.

The commission is to be co-chaired by Iranian

minister of health and the Cuban deputy prime minister.

Iran-Romania Economic Cooperation on the Rise

QOM (IRNA) - Romanian Ambassador to Tehran, Mirla Carmen Greco said on Wednesday that economic cooperation between her country and Iran, especially in agricultural areas, has increased over last year.

Fully Iranian Made "Decanter Centrifuge" of Arvand Petrochemical Co. Unveiled in Presence of Vice President



imultaneously with the 3rd Exhibition on Supporting Domestic Production; Concentrating on Persian Gulf Petrochemical Industries Company (PGPIC) held on Kish Island Kish Island and in a ceremony attended by Dr. Mohsen Rezaei, Vice President for Economic Affairs, Dr. Ali Askari, CEO of the Persian Gulf Petrochemical Industries Group and Engineer Neshanzadeh Moghaddam, CEO of Arvand Petrochemical, the fully home-made decanter centrifuge of SPVC (suspension polyvinyl chloride (SPVC)) unit which had been for the first time designed and manufactured domestically upon the order of Arvand Petrochemical Company was unveiled. In the unveiling ceremony which was attended by the Vice President and CEO of Persian Gulf Petrochemical Industries Group, CEO of Tejarat Bank and CEOs of Shahid Tondgovian and Bandar Imam Petrochemical (BIPC) companies, the stages of localization of technical knowhow, design and manufacture of this equipment which was previously in the monopoly of three countries were presented and explained by Mr. Hassan Neshanzadeh Moghaddam, the CEO of the manufacturing company Arvand Petrochemical. This equipment, which is used by petrochemical companies producing SPVC and high density poly ethylene (HDPE), can make the country completely self-sufficient in the production of this type of strategic equipment and cut the dependence of the petrochemical industry in this sector to overseas companies. The fully Iranian made "Decanter Centrifuge" of Arvand Petrochemical Company, which is localized, designed and manufactured by Hamgam Sanaat Company of Ahvaz, is considered as a strategic equipment in the separation equipment group. By localizing and manufacturing this equipment in the country, besides preventing the outflow of currency from the country, up to 50% of costs have been saved.

Arvand Petrochemical's fully Iranian made decanter centrifuge successfully entered the production circuit

ecanter Centrifuge" of Arvand Petrochemical Company, which for the first time in the country has been completely designed and built by local experts in "Hamgam Sanaat Company of Ahvaz", has successfully entered the production circuit of this complex. According to the public relations of Arvand Petrochemical Company, the caretaker of Arvand Petrochemical Company announced this news and said: "Decanter centrifuge" is one of the rotating equipment which is used to separate multiphase mixtures in industry. He added: "Previously, 4 decanters had been installed in the PVC unit to separate PVC powder from water, which has always been known as one of the production barriers due to design problems from the beginning of the complex."

Explaining the performance of these strategic equipment, Afshin Kiani added: "These centrifuges, which are classified as strategic equipment in the group of separation equipment, are separated from the processing units of petrochemical companies producing SPVC and HDPE. It is one of the goods that technology owners refuse to offer to Iranian companies due to harsh sanctions."

Kiani stated the importance of reading the internalization of this equipment by local knowledge-based companies and said: "In

Arvand Petrochemical Company, after finding the root causes of this problem, the complex specialists redesigned 3 decanters with the cooperation of the manufacturer. The installation of a new decanter, which has been designed, built and installed for the first time in the country by local experts in the company "Hamgam Sanaat of Ahvaz", in addition to removing production barriers, has saved up to 50% of costs in leaving the country." 

Russia Vows Response as Finland Seeks NATO Membership Without Delay



HELSINKI (Dispatches) - Finland said on Thursday it would apply to join NATO "without delay", with Sweden expected to follow, as Russia's invasion of Ukraine looked set to bring about the very expansion of the Western military alliance that Vladimir Putin aimed to prevent.

The decision by the two Nordic countries to abandon the neutrality they maintained throughout the Cold War would be one of the biggest shifts in European security in decades. Finland's announcement angered the Kremlin, which called it a direct threat to Russia and threatened an unspecified response.

It came even as Russia's war in Ukraine was suffering another big setback, with Ukrainian forces driving Russian troops out of the region around the second largest city Kharkiv, the fastest Ukrainian advance since forcing Russia to withdraw from the capital and northeast more than a month ago. NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg said the Finns would be "warmly welcomed" and promised an accession process that would be "smooth and swift".

Finland and Sweden are the two biggest EU countries yet to join NATO. Finland's 1,300-km (800-mile) border will more than double the length of the frontier between the U.S.-led alliance and Russia, putting NATO guards a few hours' drive from the northern outskirts of St Petersburg.

"Finland must apply for NATO membership without delay," President Sauli Niinisto and Prime Minister Sanna Marin said in a joint statement. "We hope that the national steps still needed to make this decision will be taken rapidly within the next few days.'


Asked whether Finland's accession posed a direct threat to Russia, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov said: "Definitely. NATO expansion does not make our continent more stable and secure.

"This cannot fail to arouse our regret, and is a reason for corresponding symmetrical responses on our side,' Peskov added, without elaborating. Russian officials have spoken in the past about potential measures including stationing nuclear-armed missiles on the Baltic Sea.

Asked on Wednesday if Finland would provoke Russia by joining NATO, Niinisto said: "My response would be that you caused this. Look at the mirror." read more

Five diplomats and officials told Reuters that NATO allies expect both countries to be granted membership quickly, paving the way for an increased troop presence in the Nordic region to defend them during a one-year ratification period.

Putin, Russia's president, cited NATO's potential expansion as one of the main reasons he launched a "special military operation" in Ukraine in February. Ukraine has long sought to join NATO, although it has lately offered at peace talks to accept some form of neutral status.



TOKYO (Dispatches) - European Union leaders said that the EU wants to become a bigger actor in Asia, which they termed a "theatre of tensions", warning of an increasingly assertive China even as they called on Beijing to defend the multilateral global order.

The call came in a joint news conference in Tokyo after an EU-Japan summit featuring European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen, European Council President Charles Michel and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida. It also came a day after Beijing warned the

summit not to "speak ill" of China. The trio said they would keep up talks on ways to maximize their partnership to tackle Russia over its invasion of Ukraine, in areas such as energy as well as aid, joining in a statement to call for the immediate cessation of hostilities. But Michel and von der Leyen, in Japan for the latest in a series of annual talks, also said they were aware that

regional tensions existed in Asia as well, and that the EU wanted - and needed - to take on a bigger role.

"The Indo-Pacific is a thriving region. It is also a theatre of tensions," von der Leyen said. "Take the situation in the East and South China Sea and the constant threat of the DPRK (North Korea)."

"I also need to emphasize that the EU-Japan summit is a matter between themselves but they should not speak ill of China, let alone interfere in China's internal affairs,' Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson Zhao Lijian said on Wednesday.

Palestinian President Blames Israel For Al Jazeera Reporter's Killing

RAMALLAH (Dispatches) - Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas said on Thursday that Israeli authorities were "fully responsible" for the killing of a veteran Al Jazeera reporter during clashes in the occupied West Bank and called for an international investigation.

Shireen Abu Akleh suffered a gunshot wound to the head in Jenin on Wednesday. Al Jazeera and Qatar, where the news networkd is based, accused Israeli troops of the killing. Israel, which has voiced regret at Abu Akleh's death, said it was looking into the killing and that the fatal shot might have been fired by a Palestinian gunman. It has proposed a joint investigation with the Palestinians, asking them to provide the bullet for examination.

"We rejected the joint investigation with the Israeli occupation authorities because they committed the crime and because we don't trust them," said Abbas during an official memorial ceremony for Abu Akleh, who was Palestinian-American.

He added that the Palestinian Authority "will go immediately to the International Criminal Court in order to track down the criminals"

Abu Akleh, 51, was wearing a blue vest clearly marked "Press" while reporting in Jenin, Al Jazeera said. She was covering the latest arrest operation launched by the Israeli military amid deadly Arab attacks in Israel. Another Palestinian journalist at the scene, Ali Samoodi, was wounded.

The body of Abu Akleh was driven in a motorcade from a hospital in the Palestinian hub city of Ramallah towards Abbas's compound. Hundreds of mourners lined both sides of the road, some throwing flowers.

The death drew international and Arab condemnation, including from the White House, which demanded a "comprehenisve investigation".



Sri Lanka Nam<mark>es</mark> New PM as Unrest Simmers Over Economic Crisis COLOMBO (Dispatches) - Sri Lanka's embattled president swore in a new

prime minister Thursday to replace his brother, who was banned from leaving the country after his supporters la protest against the nation's economic crisis.

The new premier, Ranil Wickremesinghe, has already served in the office five times -- but it remains unclear if he will be able to get any legislation through parliament. The 73-year-old will be tasked with navigating Sri Lanka through the worst economic downturn in its history as an independent nation, with months of shortages and blackouts inflaming public anger.

"A cabinet is likely to be appointed tomorrow," Sudewa Hettiarachchi, a spokesman for President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, told AFP. In a televised address to the nation on Wednesday night, Rajapaksa stopped short of yielding to weeks of countrywide protests calling for him to resign. But in a bid to win over opposition lawmakers demanding he quit, Rajapaksa, 72, pledged to give up most of his executive powers and set up a new cabinet this week.

Mahinda Rajapaksa, the president's brother, resigned as prime minister on Monday after his supporters attacked anti-government demonstrators who had been protesting peacefully for weeks. This marked a turning point and unleashed several days of chaos and violence in which at least nine people were killed and over 200 injured, with dozens of Rajapaksa loyalist homes set on fire.

On Thursday, a court banned Mahinda, his politician son Namal, and more than a dozen allies from leaving the country after ordering an investigation into the violence. "Congratulations to the newly appointed Prime Minister," Mahinda tweeted from the Trincomalee naval base on the country's east coast, where he took refuge after fleeing the capital Colombo. "I wish you all the best as you navigate

Nissan Reports First Full-Year Net Profit In Three Years

TOKYO (Dispatches) - Nissan reported a positive full-year net profit for the first time in three years, citing cost-saving efforts and a stronger US market, but issued cautious forecasts.

The Japanese auto giant was on a rollercoaster even before the disruption caused by the pandemic and, more recently, the conflict in Ukraine.

It had battled slowing demand and the fallout from the arrest of its former chief Carlos Ghosn and is currently implementing a plan involving slashing models, cutting costs and restructuring operations.

It cited some of those efforts in reporting an annual net profit of ¥215.5 billion (RM7.3 billion) — its first net profit since fiscal year 2018-19 — which surpassed its forecast of ¥205 billion.

But looking ahead, it warned of a market environment "more severe than in fiscal year 2021, due to semiconductor supply shortages, higher raw material prices and logistics costs, the crisis in Ukraine as well as the impact of lockdowns on parts supplies in China."



U.S. Inflation Slowed in April But Prices for Many Goods Rising

NEW YORK (Dispatches) - U.S. inflation slowed in April, according to new data released Wednesday, but Americans are still seeing their wallets empty faster than before when they buy groceries and pay rent.

President Joe Biden has gone on the offensive, blaming the price spike on Russian leader Vladimir Putin's invasion of Ukraine, and announcing a series of steps he hopes will ease the pain.

The conflict and the sanctions imposed on Russia have driven up prices around the world for fuel, grain and fertilizer, raising costs for farmers who in turn are forced to raise prices.

Biden, whose popularity has taken a hit from the highest inflation in four decades, has labelled the recent surge "Putin's price hike."

While visiting a farm in Illinois on Wednesday, he laid out the White House strategy to help food producers, including boosting domestic fertilizer production to combat a nationwide shortage.

"My administration has been working to drive down the cost of farmers... and prices to consumers," he told reporters.

That includes a US\$500 million (RM2.1 billion) federal investment in fertilizer production and working with the G7 to increase global fertilizer supplies, as well as to "prevent export restrictions on food and agricultural inputs, and bring more global production to market, which will stabilize prices."

The latest inflation data offered some good news, as the consumer price index (CPI) slowed slightly last month, jumping 8.3 per cent compared to April 2021, after peaking in March at 8.5 per cent, according to a Labor Department report.

Biden called the slow-down "heartening" in a statement earlier Wednesday, but acknowledged inflation is still a major challenge, and said "bringing it down is my top economic priority."

The dip was helped by easing energy costs, as gasoline fell 6.1 per cent in April compared to March after an 18.3 per cent surge in the previous month.

But gasoline prices at the pump hit a new record on Tuesday, so the news from April may be of little comfort to drivers.

Biden noted during his speech that to offset this, he had signed an emergency waiver last month to allow the nationwide sale of e-15 gasoline — a blend of ethanol and gasoline — during the summer, when fuel sales tend to go up as more Americans travel

Prices continued to rise last month for a range of goods, including housing, groceries, airline fares and new vehicles, and



annual inflation remains at its highest rate since early 1982.

CPI rose just 0.3 per cent compared to March, after the 1.2 per cent surge in the prior month, but excluding volatile food and energy goods, the "core" index last month increased at double the March rate, the Labor Department report said.

A large driver was food at home, which jumped 10.8 per cent over the last 12 months — the largest annual increase since November 1980, it said.

The index for meat, poultry, fish and eggs surged 14.3 per cent in the biggest gain since May 1979.

Americans saw big increases in the month for dairy and cereal products, even as fruit and vegetable costs fell last month.

Even with the decline in gasoline, energy costs have surged 30.3 per cent over the past 12 months, with gasoline up 43.6 per cent compared to a year ago.

Economists expect inflation to continue to slow gradually, but see no sign the Federal Reserve will ease up on what it said will be rapid interest rate increases to try to tamp down the price pressures and cool demand.

The Fed last week announced its largest rate hike since 2000, and signaled similar increases were likely in the coming months.

Despite the "modest reprieve" in the data suggesting inflation peaked in March, "the renewed rise in gasoline prices towards a record US\$4.50 nationally and increase in diesel prices signals that there is still upward risk to the inflation outlook," Kathy Bostjancic of Oxford Economics said in an analysis.

"Further, the Covid-related China lockdowns and the continued Russia-Ukraine war places further stress on already strained supply chains."

Lagarde Suggests ECB Rate Hike Could Come as Soon as July

FRANKFURT (Dispatches) - European Central Bank president Christine Lagarde hinted the Frankfurt-based institution could raise its interest rates from historic lows as soon as July as inflation in the eurozone soars.

The ECB should end its stimulus bond-buying scheme "early in the third quarter", Lagarde said in a speech in Ljubljana, and could then raise interest rates 'only a few weeks" later.

The comment is the clearest sign yet from Lagarde that the ECB is ready to move on rates soon rather later, as the institution trails behind the US Federal Reserve and other major central banks that have already taken the step to combat inflation.

ECB policymakers will next meet on June 9 and July 21 to decide their course of action.

Any hike would be the ECB's first in over a decade and would lift rates from their current historically low levels.

These include a negative deposit rate which effectively charges banks to park their excess cash at the ECB overnight.

Inflation in the eurozone reached 7.5 per cent in April, an all-time high for the currency club and well above the ECB's own two-per cent target.

The surge, driven in no small part by steep increases in prices for energy due to the Russian invasion of Ukraine, has strengthened calls for the ECB to follow its peers towards interest rate hikes.

The Fed and the Bank of England among others have been raising rates in efforts to stop price rises. German central bank president Joachim Nagel said vesterday he "will advocate a first step normalising

SAN FRANCISCO (Dispatches) - Saudi Aramco dethroned Apple as the world's most valuable company as surging oil prices drove up shares and tech stocks slumped.

The Saudi Arabian national petroleum and natural gas company, billed as the largest oil producing company in the world, was valued at US\$2.42 trillion based on the price of its shares at close of market.

Apple, meanwhile, has seen its share price drop over the past month and was valued at US\$2.37 trillion when official trading ended on Wednesday.

The sinking share price came despite Apple reporting better-than-expected profits in the first three months of this year amid strong consumer demand.

But. Apple warned that the China Covid-19 lockdown and ongoing supply chain woes would dent June quarter results by US\$4 to US\$8 billion.

'Supply constraints caused by Covid-related disruptions and industry-wide silicon shortages are impacting our ability to meet customer demand for our products," Chief Financial Officer Luca Maestri said on a conference call with analysts.

The results looked good following stumbles by some Big Tech peers as growth from the stay-at-home demand amid the pandemic slows and companies confront rising operating and labor costs.

Asian Economic Powers Warn of Risks From War, Monetary **Policy Normalization** TOKYO (Dispatches) - East Asian

economic leaders warned of risks to the region's outlook and pledged to remain committed to market stability and sound fiscal policy.

Economic risks included unexpectedly early rises in interest rates "in some advanced nations", runaway inflation and supply chain disruption on top of the war in Ukraine, finance ministers and central bank governors said in a joint statement.

The statement followed annual meetings, held online, of the officials from China, Japan, South Korea and the 10 members of the Association of South East Asian Nations (ASEAN). The Japanese, Chinese and South Korean officials affirmed their commitment to supporting

financial market stability and to long-term fiscal sustainability. "We must remain on guard against heightening risks to which the regional economic recovery is being exposed ... on top of the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict and earlier-thanexpected monetary policy normalization in some advanced nations," it said.

"These factors could become downside risks to the regional economic outlook, causing volatility to financial markets and capital flows."

The officials' joint statement comes amid concerns that U.S interest rate rises and related reduction in central bank assets have driven up the dollar. This has raised the prospect of capital flight from some emerging markets and a rising burden of dollar-denominated debt in the developing world.

The officials steered clear of references to currency market moves, notably rises in the dollar and falls in the yen, or sanctions against Russia's invasion of Ukraine, which Moscow

calls a "special operation." Instead, they underscored progress in regional initiatives, including a mechanism aimed at helping


countries in times of financial distress, the Chiang Mai Initiative Multilateralisation currency swaps deal.

A deep divide has emerged within the Group of 20 (G20) major economies, which includes Western nations that have accused Moscow of war crimes in Ukraine. Other members - China, Indonesia, India and South Africa - have not joined Western-led sanctions against Russia over the conflict.

ASEAN is chaired by Cambodia this year and includes Indonesia, which currently chairs the G20. Japanese Finance Minister Shunichi Suzuki used harsher words than the joint statement in discussing the invasion of Ukraine.

"Russia's unjustifiable invasion of Ukraine has shaken the foundation of international order and is a clear violation of international law," Suzuki told reporters. "It is having a serious impact on the global economy with energy and food price rises, supply-chain disruptions, destabilisation of financial markets and increasing numbers of refugees."

IEA Sees World Weathering Lost Russian Oil Supply



LONDON (Dispatches) - The world will not be left short of oil even with lower output from sanctions-hit Russia, the International Energy Agency (IEA) said on Thursday, in a U-turn after it predicted a possible "global supply shock" in March.

The IEA, after warning on March 16 that 3 million barrels per day (bpd) could be shut in from April, lowered that figure for a second time as it noted only 1 million bpd had gone offline.

Production ramping up elsewhere and slower demand growth due to China's lockdowns will forestall a big deficit, the Paris-based IEA said.

"Over time, steadily rising volumes from Middle East OPEC+ and the U.S. along with a slowdown in demand growth is expected to fend off an acute supply deficit amid a worsening Russian supply disruption," the IEA said in its monthly oil report.

The assessment by the Paris-based agency suggests the economic impact from further sanctions on Russian energy mulled by the European Union could be limited.

"Soaring pump prices and slowing economic growth are expected to significantly curb the demand recovery through the remainder of the year and into 2023," the IEA said, adding that curbs aimed at containing COVID-19 in China were driving an extended economic slowdown there.


Reflecting slower products exports and falling domestic demand, around a million barrels per day (bpd) of Russian oil was shut in last month - about half a million bpd less than the agency forecast last month.

The IEA sees that figure rising to 1.6 million bpd in May, to 2 million in June and to nearly 3 million from July onwards if sanctions deter further buying 13:00

Cannes Marks Its 75th Year in Nostalgic Form

PARIS (Dispatches) - From Maverick to Bowie to Elvis, the Cannes Film Festival launches its 75th-anniversary edition on Tuesday with a roster full of icons from the last century.

The world's foremost film festival always tries to strike a balance between serious arthouse fare and popcorn-guzzling entertainment.

It has scored some big crowd-pleasers for its diamond jubilee, with Tom Cruise coming to the French Riviera for the European launch of "Top Gun: Maverick", the sequel to his era-defining mega-hit from 1986.

Music legends will feature prominently, with flamboyant Australian director Baz Luhrmann screening his biopic "Elvis" along with new documentaries about David Bowie ("Moonage Daydream") and rock'n'roller Jerry Lee Lewis ("Trouble in Mind" by one-half of the Coen brothers, Ethan Coen). While those are all playing outside the main competition, there are also iconic names in the race for the top prize Palme d'Or, not least Canadian horror maestro David Cronenberg.

The 79-year-old returns to his body-horror (dis)comfort zone with "Crimes of the Future", in which Kristen Stewart, Lea Seydoux and Viggo Mortensen turn gruesome surgical alterations into a sexualised performance art. Meanwhile, US filmmaker James Gray gets nostalgic for his New York adolescence in "Armageddon Time", starring Anne Hathaway and Anthony Hopkins.

And one of France's most feted directors, Claire Denis, is back with "The Stars at Noon", a thriller set in Central America featuring Robert Pattinson.



Following some last-minute additions, a total of 21 films are competing for the Palme d'Or, including several from previous winners: the Dardenne brothers from Belgium, Sweden's Ruben Ostlund, Japan's Hirokazu Kore-eda and Romania's Cristian Mungiu.

"They agreed to supply us with the gas but they had conditions. They are demanding... \$1.6 billion," Karim said, adding the payment will have to be made "by the start of June".

The figure represents Iraq's arrears for 2020, which have yet to be settled because of the arcane payment method Iraq is obliged to use to comply with an exemption from U.S. sanctions on Iran.

Iraq is not allowed to simply hand over cash to Iran. Payments must be used to fund imports of food and medicines. Karim said gas imports from Iran are currently flowing at 38 million cubic metres per day. Alternatives under consideration include a connection to the Turkish national grid to supply electricity to Iraq's second city Mosul and a link to Kuwait and Saudi Arabia to help power the south.

Karim said imports of liquefied natural gas were also expected to begin from Qatar in the "next few months" but underlined that no alternative source was likely to replace Iranian gas soon.

"In my humble opinion we will depend on Iranian gas for five or 10 years to come," he said.

Earlier in meeting with Qatari Emir, President Ebrahim Raisi said the crimes committed by Israel, including the recent killing of a Palestinian journalist, do not bring the regime security and only cause it to be loathed more by people of the region.

During the presser, Iran's chief executive touched on the killing of the Palestinian journalist by the Israeli forces while covering the latest attacks by those forces on Palestinians, expressing his condolences on her martyrdom.

"Such crimes do not bring security to the Zionist regime, but increase public hatred toward the regime," Iran's president said.

He added that his condolences over the killing of the Palestinian journalist were extended to all journalists around the globe, who convey the voice of the Palestinian people to the world.

"Such crimes [that are committed by the Zionist regime] will not continue for long," Raisi said.

In another part of his remarks, Iran's president negated all forms of foreign presence in the West Asia region, especially by Western countries.

"Such [foreign] presence does not bring security to the region, but on the contrary, undermines it," he added.

"During our talks, we discussed major regional issues, especially the issue of Yemen," Iran's president said, adding, "We emphasized that the blockade of Yemen [by the Saudi-led military coalition] must end and Yemenis must be allowed to decide the fate of their country."

Raisi added that another highlight of his talks with the Emir of Qatar was the situation of Afghanistan, noting that the country must have an inclusive government representing all groups and political factions, so that sustainable security could be established there.

The two leaders, Raisi said, also laid emphasis on the need for the liberation of the occupied al-Quds, and end to the brutal siege of Gaza, and termination of Israel's crimes against Palestinians.

Iran's president said the two sides emphasized the expansion of relations in all sectors, including politics, economy, trade, culture, tourism, and energy

Joint investment between Tehran and Doha and the implementation of mutual agreements reached during Raisi's recent visit to Qatar were other highlights of his discussions with the Emir of Qatar.

Iran's president noted that the Qatari Emir's visit will be a turning point in the two countries' relations and will play a very important role in boosting mutual cooperation at regional and international levels

The Emir of Qatar, for his part, said the two leaders discussed major bilateral issues and all-out expansion of cooperation in all fields during their discussions.

Al Thani said the two sides agreed that resolution of the current problems facing the region is only possible through dialogue and negotiations.

"The existing problems in the region must be settled through constructive dialogue," he said, adding that the two sides also discussed the ongoing situation in Palestine, Syria, Yemen and Iraq.

The Emir of Qatar also consoled with the family of the slain Palestinian journalist.

"The killers of [the Palestinian] journalist must be held accountable," the Qatari Emir said, emphasizing that no double standards must be applied in dealing with this issue. He added that the cause of Palestine is the main issue

of the region, noting that this issue must be resolved in a comprehensive manner, addressing all its aspects.

Referring to participation of 23 universities and research centers and over 100 knowledge-based companies, startups, technology parks and science and research towns in the exhibition, he said it shows the Petroleum Ministry is determined in this area, adding the motto of the year "knowledge-based production and job creation", announced by the Iranian Supreme Leader, has also increased our responsibility.

Emphasizing that our approach to a knowledge-based oil industry and focusing on the domestic production is by no means a slogan, Owji stated, Petroleum Ministry and the Vice-Presidency for Science and Technology prepared and regulated the plan for knowledge-based production and job creation in oil industry which will soon be approved by the Cabinet.

Wide-ranging measures to increase production, make a knowledge-based oil industry and create more employment opportunities are on the agenda of the Ministry of Petroleum, Owji noted.

The second step in establishing a knowledge-based oil industry and focusing on the domestic production was issuing a call for participation of knowledge-based companies in oil industry's prioritized areas, he added, over 300 companies cooperated in prioritized and job-creating areas of optimization, rehabilitation of low-efficiency wells and value chain development. We have already closed contracts with such firms and allocated facilities and support to them under the Note 18 of the Budget Law, he added.

Finalizing the oil technology ecosystem is another priority of the Ministry of Petroleum he said, adding the Ministry seeks to activate innovation centers near universities, set up knowledge-based companies and start-ups in the oil technology park and develop such parks, he said.

Owji also stressed the need to focus on the investment and development in the oil industry and said, "the manufacturing sectors, knowledge-based companies and manufacturers will not be dynamic and the business environment in the oil industry will not improve unless investment is made. Therefore, the investment is mainly aimed to activate various contractors, manufacturers and service providers." Lack of resources required to develop the oil industry in recent years has not only jeopardized the sustainability of oil and gas production but also

posed a threat to the country's energy security, he said, adding, "Accordingly, investment and providing the ground for development in oil industry is a top priority."

If investment is not made in time in the oil industry, we will undoubtedly face a deficit in the production and consumption of energy in the country, so we have developed various programs to seek investment in different sectors of this major industry.

Owji said Oil Ministry has managed to sign 50 agreements and memoranda of understanding, worth over 16.7 billion dollars, in the first nine months of the 13th government through deploying the potential of large oil and petrochemical holdings and banks, as well as negotiating with reputable international companies, he said. These projects mainly focus on the development of the joint oil and gas fields, flare gas collection, development of the refinery value chain, as well as utilizing the potential of knowledge-based companies and domestic manufacturers.

On sanctions, he said confronting sanctions and strong energy diplomacy are among the top priorities of the ministry, adding in the current circumstances, Iran's oil industry is on the economic front line and confrontation with enemies.

Noting that the exhibition is a manifestation of the capability and authority of the Islamic Republic of Iran in the current situation, he added, "Despite the sanctions, domestic capacities in all fields including equipment manufacturing, design and engineering, contracting and execution of projects are growing. Nadal, Swiatek Ease **Into Rome Last 16**

 $R^{\rm OME}$ (Dispatches) - Rafael Nadal eased into the last 16 of the Italian Open with a straightforward 6-3, 6-1 win over John Isner, while Iga Swiatek is on course for a fifth straight WTA triumph after seeing off Elena-Gabriela Ruse 6-3, 6-0.

Third seed Nadal made short work of Isner as he bids for an 11th title in Rome, the King of Clay seeing off his American opponent in one hour and 17 minutes under blazing sunshine at the Foro Italico.

A quarter-final loser to fellow countryman Carlos Alcaraz in Madrid, Nadal could profit from the in-form teenager's absence in the Italian capital to win the last big clay event before the French Open later this month.

The 35-year-old had been out for six weeks with a rib injury before returning in the Spanish capital last week but Isner put up little resistance against the 21-time Grand Slam winner.

"I need to build again the things after a tough stop and that's what I'm trying, just to stay with the right attitude and let's see if I'm able to make that happen," Nadal said courtside. The match swung in Nadal's favour in game eight, when Nadal broke veteran world number 27 Isner before serving out to take the first set.

From there Nadal cruised to victory, dropping just 14 points on his way to setting up a third-round clash with Denis Shapovalov.

"I need to play better than I did today but after a while out it's another victory and tomorrow another chance to play against one of the best players in the world," Nadal added.

Nadal later told reporters that Swiatek was doing "amazing things" and it was difficult to argue after she set up a third-round match with Victoria Azarenka after wiping the floor with Ruse.

The 20-year-old Swiatek is in red-hot form after winning her last four tournaments and will be eyeing a second title at Roland Garros after winning there as a teenager in 2020.

Ukraine Return to Action With Friendly Win Against Gladbach

KYIV (Dispatches) - Oleksandr Pikhalionok scored the winner as Ukraine beat Bundesliga side Borussia Moenchengladbach 2-1 in a friendly on Wednesday in the national team's first game since the country was invaded by Russia.

The match at Borussia-Park was attended by over 20,000 spectators, with all proceeds going towards relief efforts in Ukraine. Players from both teams held up a "Stop War" banner before kick-off.

It also doubled up as a warm-up match for Ukraine before their World Cup playoff semi-final against Scotland on June 1, with the winner set to face Wales for a place in the finals in Qatar later this year.

Mykhaylo Mudryk opened the scoring in the ninth minute but Conor Noss levelled the match five minutes later before Pikhalionok drilled home a low finish late on to seal the win for Ukraine. It was Ukraine's first match since a 2-0 victory over Bosnia and Herzegovina in November.

The visitors fielded players only from their domestic clubs after the Ukrainian Premier League season was terminated last month due to Moscow's invasion.

"The first match," said Ukraine coach Oleksandr Petrakov, "the team did not play

for six months, I did not work for six months. "I have no questions for the guys, at this stage they are good, they did well. There

are a lot of mistakes, we will correct them." Ukraine next play friendlies against Italian side Empoli and Croatian club Rijeka before taking on Scotland.

Inter Win Coppa Italia

ROME (Dispatches) - Inter Milan won the Coppa Italia after an extra-time double from Croatian forward Ivan Perisic earned his side a 4-2 victory over Juventus in Wednesday's final, ensuring Massimiliano Allegri's team will finish the season trophyless. Inter, who are still in the running to retain their Serie A title this term, started on the front foot, racing into the lead after six minutes in the Stadio Olimpico as Nicolo Barella arrowed a stunning strike into the top corner.

Third seed Aryna Sabalenka strolled nto the next round with a routine 6-2, 6-0 win over Zhang Shuai, while Coco Gauff is also in the last 16 after seeing off fellow American Madison Brengle 6-2, 6-4.

Stan Wawrinka, who won for the first time in 15 months in the first round, edged out Laslo Djere 7-6 (10/8), 3-6, 6-3 to set up a last-16 clash with world number one Novak Diokovic.

The injury-hit 37-year-old beat Djokovic in finals to win two of his three Grand Slam titles, but has lost 19 of their 25 career meetings.

Stefanos Tsitsipas was forced to work hard to beat Grigor Dimitrov 6-3, 7-5, 7-6 (7/4) in a tough match in which he had to save two match points before eventually prevailing in a third-set tie-break.

Bulgarian Dimitrov, beaten by world number five Tsitsipas in both Barcelona and Madrid in recent weeks, fought back from 5-3 down in the second set to level the match and looked to have the better of his Greek opponent in set three.

However he failed to capitalise on his match points, which both came against serve, and Tsitsipas rattled off five straight points in the tie-break to ensure victory. The 23-year-old could meet second seed Alexander Zverev in the semi-finals, as he did

in Madrid, after the German saw off Sebastian Baez 7-6 (8/6), 6-3. Italian youngster Jannik Sinner beat fellow home hope Fabio Fognini 6-2, 3-6, 6-3 and

will face Filip Krajinovic for a quarter-final place.

Tops Forbes' Highest-Paid Athletes List_

PARIS (Dispatches) - Lionel Messi was the world's highest-paid athlete over the last year, according to the annual Forbes list released that had the Paris Saint-Germain forward ahead of the NBA's LeBron James and Manchester United's Cristiano Ronaldo.

Messi earned US\$130 million (RM569.3 million), a figure which includes US\$55 million of endorsements, during the 12-month period ended May 1, 2022, to sit atop the list of the 10 highest-paid athletes a year after finishing second to Irish MMA fighter Conor McGregor.

Los Angeles Lakers forward James was next on the list after bringing home a combined US\$121 million, shattering the US\$96.5 million record for an NBA player that he set last year, while Portugal captain Ronaldo earned US\$115 million to sit third.

Brazilian soccer player Neymar (US\$95 million) and three-time NBA champion Stephen Curry (US\$92.8 million) of the Golden State Warriors rounded out the top five.

NBA player Kevin Durant (US\$92 million) was sixth while Swiss tennis great Roger Federer, who played five tournaments in 2021 before a knee operation curtailed his season, was third with total earnings of US\$90.7 million.

ROME (Dispatches) - Veteran defender Giorgio Chiellini confirmed he will leave Juventus at the end of the season.

The 37-year-old, who is third on Juventus' all-time appearances list behind Alessandro Del Piero and Gianluigi Buffon, made the announcement after his side lost 4-2 to Inter Milan in Wednesday's Coppa Italia final.

"We had these 10 magnificent years, it is up to the others to continue now," he told Sport Mediaset. "I did everything I could, I hope that I left something.

"On Monday I will say goodbye to my Juventus Stadium, then if I have still got

something in the tank might have a run-out in Florence (in Juve's final league game next weekend).

"It is my choice 100 per cent, I am happy to leave at such a high level, because for many years I have said I didn't want to finish struggling and not being able to play at my level. I gave it my all, soon I will be the biggest Juventus fan from the outside. After so many years within this club, you cannot shake it off."

Chiellini joined Juve in 2004 from Livorno, going on to win nine league titles and five Italian Cups during his time in Turin.

He announced his retirement from international football last month, but does not appear to be hanging up his boots just yet, with reports in the Italian media linking him with a move to the United States for one last hurrah.

Bucks Rally to Push Celtics to Brink in NBA Playoffs

OS ANGELES (Dispatches) - Giannis LAntetokounmpo scored 40 points and Bobby Portis came up big late as the NBA champion Milwaukee Bucks rallied for a 110-107 win in Boston to push the Celtics to the brink of playoff elimination.

Reserve forward Portis put back Antetokounmpo's missed free throw with 11.4 seconds remaining to give the Bucks a 108-107 lead. Jrue Holiday plucked an attempted shot by Marcus Smart from the air with 8.1 seconds

remaining before teammate Pat Connaughton added a pair of free throws to seal the comeback triumph for a Bucks team that trailed by 14 early in the fourth quarter.


Milwaukee took a 3-2 lead in the best-of-seven Eastern Conference series, and will have a chance to close it out when they host game six.

Two-time NBA Most Valuable Player Antetokounmpo led the way with 40 points and 11 rebounds. Jayson Tatum and Jaylen Brown combined for 60 points for the Celtics, who took control with a 28-19 second quarter that saw them take a 54-47 halftime lead. City had seen second-placed Liverpool go level on points with them after a 2-1 win at Aston Villa on Tuesday.
